



Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity was founded at Howard University in Washington, D.C., January 9, 1914, by three young African-American male students. The Founders, Honorable A. Langston Taylor, Honorable Leonard F. Morse, and Honorable Charles I. Brown, wanted to organize a Greek letter fraternity that would truly exemplify the ideals of brotherhood, scholarship, and service.

The Founders deeply wished to create an organization that viewed itself as "a part of" the general community rather than "apart from" the general community. They believed that each potential member should be judged by his own merits, rather than his family background or affluence...without regard to race, nationality, skin tone or texture of hair. They desired for their fraternity to exist as part of an even greater brotherhood which would be devoted to the "inclusive we" rather than the "exclusive we".

From its inception, the Founders also conceived Phi Beta Sigma as a mechanism to deliver services to the general community. Rather than gaining skills to be utilized exclusively for themselves and their immediate families, they held a deep conviction that they should return their newly acquired skills to the communities from which they had come. This deep conviction was mirrored in the Fraternity's motto, "Culture For Service and Service For Humanity".

Today, Phi Beta Sigma has blossomed into an international organization of leaders. No longer a single entity, members of the Fraternity have been instrumental in the establishment of the Phi Beta Sigma National Foundation, the Phi Beta Sigma Federal Credit Union and The Sigma Beta Club Foundation. Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. founded in 1920 with the assistance of Phi Beta Sigma, is the sister organization of the Fraternity.

MET TO ORGANIZE A LOCAL CHAPTER

Local Members of The Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity met Thursday evening, January 3, 1935 at the Paseo Y.M.C.A. to discuss plans for the establishment of a local chapter of the fraternity here.

At this meeting, a tentative organization was effected with the following officers: Dean J. Ernest Brown of Western Bible College (KCMO) - President. Forest Smith, Executive Secretary of the Y.M.C.A. - Secretary. Wendell Pryor, teacher at the Boys' Home - Treasurer. Raymond M. Williams - Chairman of the Investigation Committee. Dr. A. Marcelle Kennedy - Chairman of the Program Committee.

The following were additional local Sigma Men who were identified by the fraternity: Russell P. Young, Santos D. Swancy, U.lysses S. Arnold, Lloyd M.Williams, Wilburn Johnson, and Dr. Arthur C. Prewitt.

The next meeting was held at the Paseo Y.M.C.A. Tuesday, January 8 at 9:30 p.m. All Sigma Men were invited to attend.





Dean | Rev. James Ernest Brown First President

Born in Danville, KY in 1901. He was an Indianapolis resident from 1904 to 1924.

Received his college and theological degrees from Simmons College and of Central Law School in Louisville, KY. He did graduate work at Univ. of Cincinnati and Lane Theological Seminary in Cincinnati, OH.

While at Simmons College, he was initiated through the Tau Chapter of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc.

He also attended Kansas City Teachers College and the Univ. of Kansas for a time.

Before arriving in Kansas City, Rev. J. E. Brown served the Portland Baptist Church in Louisville, KY, and the Bethel Church, Anchorage, KY.

He was the Dean for several years at Western Baptist Seminary, Kansas City, MO.

Later, he was a supervisor of adult education and principal of the R. T. Coles night school at Lincoln High School (KCMO)

Charter Member Brown was the Pastor of Shiloh Baptist Church, arriving in Ft. Scott,KS, June, 1938, Serving for 5 years before being called to Pastor at Calvary Baptist Church in Topeka, KS.

Charter Member Brown was a critic for the Baptist Ministers Union of Kansas City, chairman of the religious committee of the committee of management of the Paseo YMCA, and a representative of the Urban League.

Dean Brown met his wife, Elizabeth Parker-Brown at Simmons College, who had formerly taught in the public school systems in Kentucky and North Carolina.

He passed, November 29, 1945, in Christ Hospital in Topeka, KS.

He's buried in Floral Park Cemetery in Indianapolis, IN.

He was only 44 years old.





Dr. A. Marcelle Kennedy The Chemist & Physician

Born: 1893 in Marshall, MO Passed: Thursday, October 10, 1968 in KCK. He lived in Kansas City for 30 Years.


Dr. Kennedy attended Douglass School and Western University, Quindaro, KS. In 1915, he received his diploma from the Elizabeth King Institute of New York as a graduate face specialist. He had the distinction of being the only face specialist of color on both sides in the 2 KC's. He holds degrees from the California College of Optometry and the Oakland College of Medicine.

From 1933 - 1936, he and his 1st wife, Nadine Steppe-Kennedy, conducted a private kindergarten and daycare at their home.

He was president of the Committeeman's League (Wyandotte Co, KS), Deputy License Inspector (KCK), Refinery Chemist (Topeka), president of the Towersfor-Representative club. He was a member of the AME Church, 8th & Nebraska, KCK.

His 2nd wife, Mrs. Fannie P. Kennedy, was the granddaughter of Booker T. Washington.

He was the 4th president of Alpha Delta Sigma Chapter; conducted many of our chapter's Bigger & Better Business programs every April, starting in 1936.







Leon James Ufilliam Collison The Civic Leader

Born, February 5, 1904 in Springfield, MO and moved to KC Area 1930 (KCK)

He was initiated into Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc., Phi Chapter, at Philander Smith College, Little Rock, AR in the late 1920's. He was Student Council chairman, vice president of the College Club and a star athlete on the football and basketball teams.

Alpha Delta Sigma Chapter's 6th President.

Married to Cora Morris Ollison for 50 years (passed away in 1980)

Buried: Highland Park Cemetery (KCK)

Member of Mason Memorial United Methodist Church for 65 years

Worked for Swift Packing Co., retiring in 1968.

At the time, he was one of the first few Blacks to serve as a Federal Jurist (Topeka 1945)

Chairman - KC-NPHC; elected Northern Regional Director 1956 (National Position)

Wyandotte Election Official for over 30 years

Was the last living charter member of Alpha Delta Sigma Chapter until his passing January 17, 1995.







Dr. Arthur Carl Prewitt The Parmacist

Born Thursday, December 11, 1902, Missouri

He was a 1925 Graduate from Meharry Medical College, Nashville, TN

Initiate of Kappa Chapter of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc., while attending.

Married to Mrs. Ada Mae Brown

He was a prominent citizen, pharmacist & owner of Prewitt Drugs (Kansas City, KS)


He was a secretary of Progress Lodge No. 77

Ran for Representative of the 8th District (Did not win)

President of the KC Meharry Alumni Association; following him as alumni president was Dr. Evan A. Gilkes, Alpha Delta Sigma Chapter's 3rd president

Moved to Fayette, AL and was a member of Carbon Hill First Baptist Church.

Passed - Monday, May 26, 1986 in Fayette, AL







James Usendell Pryor The Teacher

Born: April 8, 1897; Kansas

Taught in the Kansas City school system for 36 years before retiring in 1964.

Graduate of Lincoln High School; KCMO

Graduate of Kansas State Agricultural College (Kansas State Univ.), Manhattan, with a degree in Mechanical Engineering.

Initiated in Delta Chapter of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc., while attending K-State


Was a teacher at the Boys' Home; KCMO. Taught Engineering at Prairie View College, Prairie View, TX, and Industrial Arts at Lincoln University, Jefferson City, before becoming a teacher of Industrial Arts and Mathematics at Manhattan High School and the former R. T. Coles High School.

He was a member of the Allen Chapel A. M. E. Church.

Passed: June 26, 1974 in Oakland California while visiting his daughters. Lived in KC 72 of his 77 years.

Buried in the National Cemetery, Ft. Leavenworth, KS





Forest S. Smith One of Three First Initiates - Exec. Secretary, Paseo Y

Born: February 1, 1890, Speed, MO

Lived in KC for over 48 years. He was well known in civic circles.


He began working at the Paseo Branch of the YMCA in 1915; it opened in 1914; working as a janitor and later as a busboy in the cafeteria. Soon, he became a desk clerk, and he was eventually elected as The Paseo YMCA Executive Secretary after the position was opened due to the prior's ill health. He held the position from 1926 to 1945. He retired for a short while and then re-elected for another year.

From 1946 to 1947 he served as the dormitory secretary. He was a real estate salesman for a short while before he became the business manager and treasurer of Western Baptist Seminary (KCMO), resigning there in 1957 because of ill health.

Brother Smith joined Second Baptist Church, and served as its treasurer and trustee for a number of years. He also taught a Sunday school class.

Brother Smith graduated with high honors and received a Business Degree from Western Baptist Bible College in Macon, MO around 1912 (eventually renamed Western Seminary when it moved to Kansas City, MO in 1927....not to be confused with Western University, Quindaro, KS (an HBCU here during that time). He married Addie M. Collins on January 1, 1914. Interesting to note, that his mother's name was also Addie.

Prior to the meeting to organize on Thursday, January 3, 1935, at the Paseo YMCA; when local members of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Incorporated, met to discuss the plans to establish a chapter here; Forest S. Smith, who was very prominent in civic circles in Greater Kansas City, and the Exec. Secretary at the Paseo Y where the meetings were held... that, not only did he become a pledgee, but Brother Smith was also made a Charter Member of the newly installed Alpha Delta Sigma Chapter when he, along with two others, Dr. Charles P. Washington and Dr. John R. Williams, were also initiated into the new chapter on Tuesday, October 29, 1935.





Dr. Raymond Montrose Ufilliams The Veteranian

Born in Texas, Monday, September 15, 1902

1919 Graduate of Lincoln High School; Kansas City, MO

In 1919, he entered Kansas State Agricultural College (Kansas State Univ.); Manhattan, KS

Initiated into the Delta Chapter of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc., while attending K-State

In 1924, he received his Doctorate of Veterinary Medicine from KSAC

1930 Census: Veterinarian in a packing house in Kansas City, MO

He was the President of the Beau Brummel Club in KC. The Beau Brummel Club was a historic Black Social Club that was a pillar in KC's Black Community and stepped in to help improve the social and civic lives of Black Veterans and Civilians during the time racial segregation.

Chairman of the Investigation Committee when Alpha Delta Sigma Chapter organized in 1935

Moved to Chicago, IL in 1936

USDA - Meat Inspection Division Served for 46 Years KC - Denver - St. Louis - Chicago At the time (1950's) he was the only black government veterinarian inspector in the Chicago area.

Passed in Chicago, September of 1973

JOHN THOMAS THORNTON A Brother of Many Traits:

A Sigma Man! A realtor. A building contractor. A churchman. An educator. A director of 3 financial institutions and a deep interest in the community's social agencies, serving on several boards of directors.

Bro. Thornton's advice was sought by many in real estate matters. He was an expert on buildings and on construction. His tenants looked upon him as a man of sympathy and understanding of their problems. As one tenant put it, "Mr. Thornton was the best landlord I ever had. If you were out of work or couldn't pay your rent, he would never put you out or tell you to move. He would say, "Well, just do the best you can."

He was regarded as one of the most widely known and highly respected people in Our Community.

Brother Thornton holds the distinction of being Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc., Southwestern Region's 1st Life Member (#17 overall).




Sadly, Brother Thornton was shot and killed on Sunday, Jan. 11, 1959, by a tenant while collecting rent in an apartment building he owned.

The Southwestern Region's Bigger & Better Business Annual Award is named after Brother Thornton.

BISHOP JAMES ARTHUR HAMLETT A towering giant in the religious field

Brother Hamlett was born in Henderson, TN in 1882. He was a graduate of Lane College in Jackson, TN, and attended Washburn College (now University) in Topeka, KS and the Garrett Institute in Evanston, IL.



In 1926, he received a Master of Arts Degree from Northwestern University.

He was elevated to bishopric front the position of editor of the Christian Index, national publication of the C.M.E. church, from 1914 to 1929.

He was a Bishop of the C.M.E. church for 39 years, and was the Senior Bishop in his denomination from 1954 until his retirement in 1958. He was elected a bishop in 1922. In 1948, Bishop Hamlett was a delegate to the first assembly of World Council of Churches in Amsterdam, Holland.

In 1954, Brother Bishop Hamlett and his wife, Lena Hamlett, celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary. Brother Hamlett was also the father-in-law to another chapter member, Brother Samuel Luby Payne, who was the manager of the Parkview Hotel (in the 18th & Vine Jazz District).

Brother Bishop Hamlett, passed away, Saturday, February 17, 1962. He was 79 years old.
