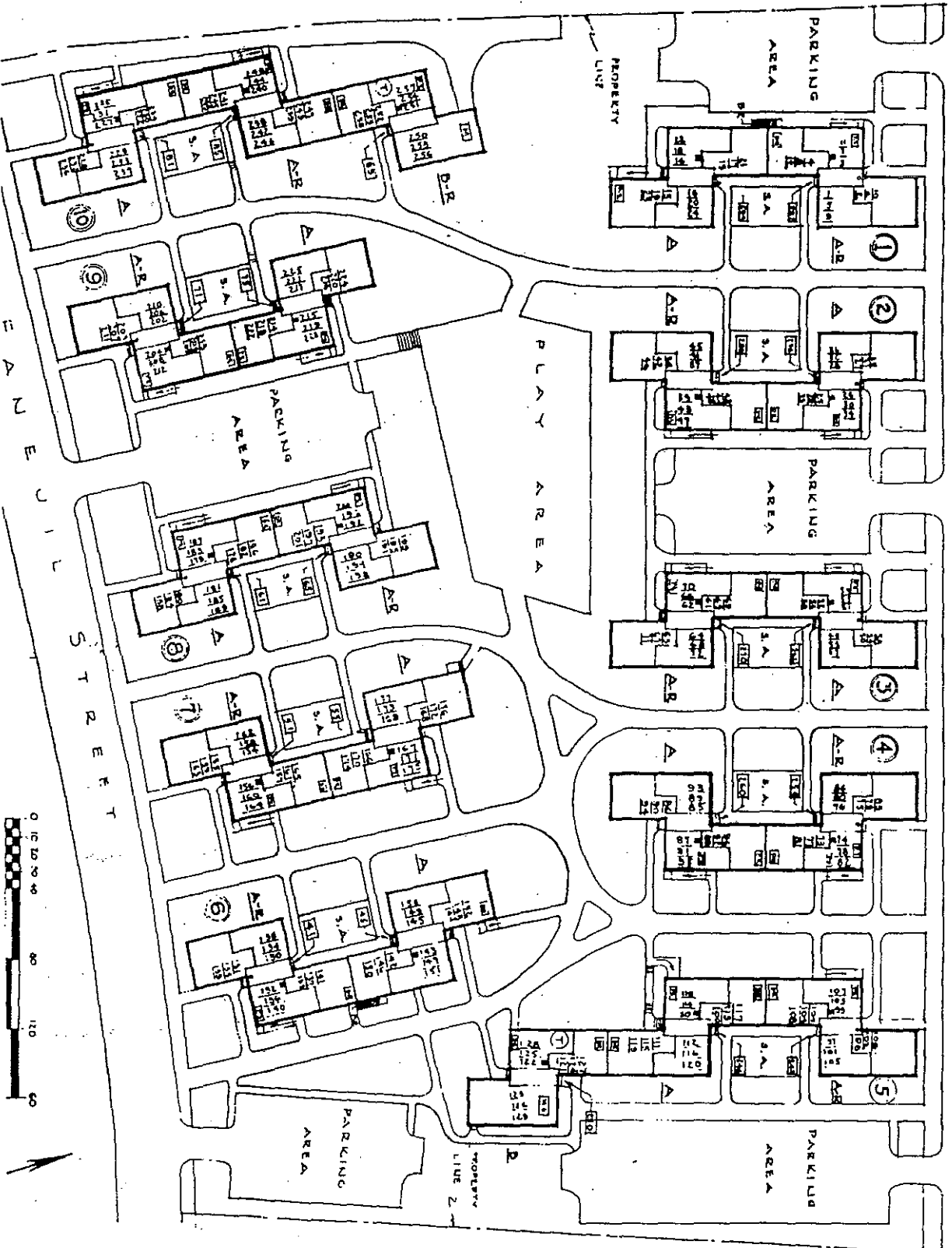

Sir:

I submit that on Tuesday 3/28/00, I was performing a last half tour of duty assigned to the K421A unit. At about 3:54 AM was dispatched to 89 Faneuil St. by the back dumpster for a man in cardiac arrest laying in a pool of blood. Upon arrival, along with A-14 EMT's Athas and Reardon, we observed a unknown white male, approx. 5'5" heavy set, wearing a red unzipped jacket, gray and blue shirt, gray pants, black hiking sneakers. The victim was laying on his back, horizontally to the rear stoop, head facing the building of 89 Faneuil St.. The victim was blue with severe facial trauma to the right side of the face and a pool of blood had gathered on the ground downhill from the victim. The EMT's declared the victim void of vital signs at 3:58 AM and placed a yellow sheet over him. The victim was not moved. K912 Sgt. Riley responded and under his direction I was assigned to secure the crime scene. Officer Sheets (K499A) was assigned to record the crime scene log. While securing the crime scene I observed MA 7225GA, 90 Buick Skylark Gray Vin # 1G4NV54U2LM050392, parked several yards away from the victim. The engine was cold and the driver's side window rolled down. Also, I observed a set of keys laying on the door stoop of 89 Faneuil St. and a Wall Street Journal dated 3/28/00 on the driveway lying in front of the vehicle. At about 4:05 AM I was approached by a man who identified himself as the caller. He was identified as [REDACTED], [REDACTED] SS# [REDACTED], [REDACTED] Tel# [REDACTED]. He stated that he discovered the victim around 3:45 AM. He further added that he was coming from work to visit his wife, to whom he is separated from and lives at [REDACTED] # [REDACTED], he stays at [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] appeared calm, but disturbed about his discovery. He was handed his license and went on his way.

At about 4:15 AM there was a flash of lightning followed by a boom of thunder. A steady down pour of rain started coming down on the crime scene. At about 5:11 AM Sgt. Det Coleman arrived and all information passed on. I inquired the license plate of the vehicle which was owned by Yazbeck, Inaam Naim 1/24/65 of 8A Hearn St. Watertown. I secured the crime scene until relieved by K903 Sgt. McDonough at about 7:50 AM.

Report Re: Interview of ██████████

On February 27, 2002 at about 3:30PM, Det. McLaughlin and Det. Devane of the Homicide Unit conducted an interview with ██████████, dob ██████████. Ms. ██████████ currently resides in ██████████ but is moving back to her mother's house in ██████████ as of March 1st. Her address will be ██████████, ██████████. The interview took place at the Bridgton (Me.) Police Station and was relative to the death of Inaam Yazbek which occurred in March of 2000.

Ms. ██████████ stated that she had been a student at ██████████ and had graduated in the Spring of 2001. She stated that while she was there she had become friends with ██████████, who was a boarding student from Boston. ██████████ stated that she was a day student at the school and primarily associated with other day students. She stated that ██████████ was at ██████████ for about 2 1/2 years before she was expelled from school. Ms. ██████████ stated that although she didn't remember exactly when ██████████ was expelled she thought that it was in her junior year (school year 1999-2000).

Ms. ██████████ went on to state that during the time that ██████████ was at ██████████ she had visitors from Boston at least 2-3 times. She stated that she recalled a black male who visited at least once. She stated that she was not sure but she thought that this male's name was either ██████████ or ██████████ and that he had visited for some type of school dance. She stated that a white male named ██████████ also visited at least once. Ms. ██████████ stated that she had a brief relationship with ██████████ and in fact visited him in Boston when she and ██████████ went to Boston on a school trip.

Ms. ██████████ stated that after ██████████ was expelled from ██████████, she (██████████) moved in with her (██████████) and her boyfriend ██████████ at their apartment in ██████████. Ms. ██████████ stated that her memory of that time period was very vague and therefore she could not tell me exactly when she

moved in or for how long she stayed. ██████ stated that at some point ██████ told ██████ that she had to move out. At that point, according to ██████ ██████ moved back to Boston to her mother's house.

Ms. ██████ stated that after ██████ left ██████ she returned on two occasions. Again, Ms. ██████ stated that her memory of that time period was not clear so she was not sure if her details of those two visits were completely accurate. She stated that on one occasion she saw ██████ in traffic at which time ██████ flagged her down. She stated that on that occasion ██████ was accompanied by a black male who was driving a newer model car. She stated it was the first time that she had ever seen the male and did not recall his name.

██████ went on to state that after they met in traffic they all went to her house where ██████ picked up some belongings which she had left there. She stated that they then drove around for a couple of hours so that ██████ could stop and say good bye to some of her friends. ██████ did recall that they stopped at the ██████ dorms where ██████ talked to a few different girls. She stated that among the girls she talked to was ██████ (local) and some unknown Spanish and white girls. She stated that ██████ was not allowed on ██████ property so the girls had to come out to the car. ██████ stated that ██████ dropped her home and left to return to Boston. She stated that as far as she knew ██████ did not spend the night in or around ██████ that night.

██████ stated that on the other occasion her and her former boyfriend, ██████, visited ██████ at a hotel room at the Yankee Clipper Hotel in North Conway. She stated that her best recollection of that visit was that ██████ was possibly with two males, one being either "Mexican or Spanish" and the other being black. She stated that she had never seen or met either of them before that date. She stated that they stayed at the hotel room for a period of time and then she returned home. ██████ stated that on the following morning her and ██████ returned and had breakfast at the hotel restaurant. She stated that her memory was that when they had breakfast there was only four people, ██████, the black male, ██████, and herself.

After recounting the two visits, ██████ again stated that she was unsure of the dates of either visit or which one happened before the other. She stated that she had some recollection that one of the visits was near her birthday because she recalled ██████ bringing her a birthday present. ██████ then stated that at some point she heard that the police from Boston were at the school asking questions about ██████. She stated that there were a lot of rumors about what had happened but that she never really found out. She stated that she was sure that both of the visits described occurred before the time that the police came to visit the school. She stated since the time of the last visit she had never seen ██████ again.

██████████ stated that at some time after ██████████ was arrested she did receive a letter from ██████████ through her attorney's office. She stated that the letter addressed very vaguely the fact that Joleena had been arrested for some type of incident. She was asked if she still had the letter and she stated that she did not.

██████████ was then asked if she had ever been to Joleena's father's condominium. She stated that on one occasion while ██████████ was still living with her and ██████████, she (██████████) had had a fight with ██████████ and left the house. At that time ██████████ told her that she could stay at her father's condo. She stated that the two of them then went to the condo and entered through the front door. She stated that they remained there for a couple of hours but never spent the night. She stated that she then returned home and made up with ██████████ and remained at home. ██████████ was sure that this incident occurred before Joleena left to go back to Boston and was sure that it was only her and ██████████ that went to the condo.

██████████ stated that at some point after she had seen ██████████ for the last time, the Conway Police stopped her and asked her about the burglary of ██████████'s father's condo. She stated she believed that this occurred after ██████████ had gotten into trouble in Boston. She stated that she told them that she had no knowledge of any such incident.

Prior to the completion of the incident, ██████████ was shown a photographic array (BPD Gallery # 00-000435) consisting of nine (9) photos of black males. ██████████ was asked to view the array and inform us if she recognized any individual as being with ██████████ in either of the two described visits. ██████████ viewed the array and stated that none of the individuals "look familiar".

It was determined that the questioned signature appearing on specimen Q1 was prepared by the K1 writer, [REDACTED].

No definite determination could be made as to whether or not the K1 writer, [REDACTED], prepared the remaining questioned writing appearing on specimen Q1 due to the lack of clarity and /or the presence of characteristics in the questioned writing which could not be accounted for in the known writing.

Observations for Investigative Assistance

From the limited comparisons that could be conducted, characteristics were observed to indicate that [REDACTED] may have prepared the questioned carbon hand printing depicted in the "Name, Address, City, State, and Zip" captions on specimen Q1.




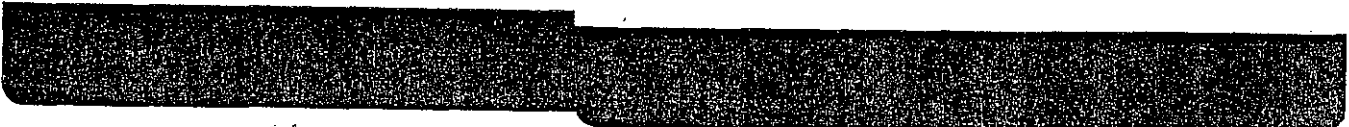

1. Statement of Facts.

On the evening of Monday, March 27, 2000, [REDACTED] asked her boyfriend, the defendant, [REDACTED] if he was interested in robbing her friend, Inaam Yazbek. [REDACTED] then asked his best friend [REDACTED] if he was interested in getting involved in the robbery. [REDACTED] replied that he was. [REDACTED] then called Yazbek, who was dining at Wadi's restaurant in Watertown, and asked him to pick her up at her house at [REDACTED] in [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] arranged with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] to bring Yazbek back to 89 Fancuil Street in Brighton, where the two men were to rob Yazbek. Yazbek picked up [REDACTED] and the two headed back to Wadi's at around 10:00 PM. Before leaving with Yazbek, she paged [REDACTED] at 11:15 PM as she was leaving the restaurant. The page was the signal to the two men that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were on their way to the prearranged address. The two men began to rob Yazbek as [REDACTED] acted as if the robbery had taken her by surprise.

left the scene of the robbery as [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] grabbed Yazbek and held him by the arms.

While walking away from the scene, [REDACTED] heard a gunshot. Yazbek had been shot in the head and was killed. According to [REDACTED], [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] both emerged from behind the building where Yazbek's body was later found. The three left the scene in [REDACTED]'s car. In the car, Anderson remarked to his fellow passengers, "I got my body for the summer." Later on during the evening of March 28, 2000, [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] proceeded to drive to an abandoned parking lot where [REDACTED] placed the gun underneath the shovel of a bulldozer. Later on that evening, [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] returned to the abandoned parking lot and retrieved the gun. The gun has never been recovered. (grand jury minutes of [REDACTED] attached)

2. The Commonwealth is under no obligation to make a preliminary showing of reasonableness in order to obtain a handwriting exemplar from the defendant.

There are several instances where the Commonwealth is entitled to compel a defendant to produce physical evidence. These circumstances can include requiring a suspect to appear in a line-up and requiring a person suspected of drunk driving to submit to a blood test. Commonwealth v. Doe, 408 Mass. 768-769; Commonwealth v. Downey, 407 Mass. 472, 475 (1990). It is also well established that a defendant may be required to submit handwriting exemplars. Commonwealth v. Bias, 428 Mass. 294, 301 (1998). The handwriting of an individual is consistently shown to the public and therefore an individual is not entitled to any expectation of privacy with regard to the physical characteristics of his handwriting. United States v. Mara, 410 U.S. 19, 21 (1973). Due to the fact that an individual is not entitled to any expectation of privacy with regard to the



physical characteristics of his handwriting, the Commonwealth is under no obligation, when asking a defendant to submit handwriting exemplars, "to make a preliminary showing of "reasonableness."” Mara, 410 U. S. at 22.

3. Compelling Anderson to Submit a Handwriting Exemplar is Necessary to the Prosecution of the Commonwealth's Case.

On April 1, 2000, ██████████, the father of ██████████ reported to the Conway Police department that his 1974 Colt Python 4 inch blue steel 357 magnum had been stolen from his condo in ██████████. The condo serves as Mr. ██████████'s second home and he has stated that he had not been to the condo the previous two weeks before his visit on April 1, 2000. (reports of Sgt. Det. Jeffery L. Dickey, Conway, N.H. Police Department attached). According to ██████████, she was involved with ██████████ in the break-in of her father's condo. Tate has stated that the break-in occurred around March 17, 2000. She had told ██████████ that her father kept firearms in this ██████████ residence. She suggested to ██████████ that the two of them should steal the gun in ██████████ and return with it to Boston to sell. ██████████ has told the Boston Police her belief that ██████████ had sold the gun in Boston. However, she has also stated her belief that the gun used in the murder of Yazbek is the same as the gun stolen ██████████. (report of Sgt. Det. Daniel J. Coleman on May 18, 2000 attached). ██████████ has told investigators that he often traveled to the Concord and Manchester areas of New Hampshire and in fact traveled to Manchester around March 17, 2000. ██████████ denies that he has ever traveled to North Conway, New Hampshire. (report of Sgt. Det. Daniel J. Coleman on July 17, 2000 and statement of ██████████ attached).

Through her attorneys, ██████████ told authorities that she and ██████████ had stayed at the Yankee Clipper Motor Lodge in North Conway, New Hampshire during their visit. A guest book has been retrieved from the Yankee Clipper Motor Lodge, located in North Conway, New Hampshire. The guest book is dated March 25, 2000 and the name ██████████ is handwritten at the top. Underneath the name

██████████ is a handwritten address, ██████████, ██████████, ██████████.

Also on this guest book is a handwritten description of an automobile. The description is that of a 626 Mazda with a license plate number of ██████████. This Dorchester address is a known address of ██████████ and he is the owner of a Mazda 626 with a license plate number of ██████████. (Registry of Motor Vehicle Title record attached). Underneath the description of the automobile there is a distinctive signature that bears a striking resemblance to ██████████'s signature on his Miranda warning form. (Miranda warning form and Yankee Clipper guest book attached).

A handwriting exemplar taken from ██████████ would be used to prove that he was the individual who signed the guest book in North Conway, New Hampshire. This evidence would corroborate other evidence indicating that ██████████ and ██████████ traveled from Boston to North Conway, New Hampshire where the two allegedly stole the firearm that was later used in the homicide of Inaam Yazbck.

MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT OF COMMONWEALTH'S MOTION  
TO COMPEL HANDWRITING EXEMPLAR

---

- I. Compelling Handwriting Exemplars Does Not Violate the Fifth or Fourth Amendment to the United States Constitution, or Article Twelve of the Massachusetts Declaration of Rights.

It is established that the privilege of an accused not to be compelled to be a witness against himself protects only against the compulsion of incrimination "communications" or "testimony" and does not bar compulsion "which makes a suspect or accused the 'source of real or physical evidence.'" Commonwealth v. Brennan, 386 Mass. 772, 776 (1986), quoting Schmerber v. California 384 U.S. 757, 764 (1966). Handwriting constitutes real or physical evidence and does not contemplate the protection that compelled communication do. Gilbert v. California, 388 U.S. 263, 255-67 (1967); Commonwealth v. Nadworny, 396 Mass. 342, 363 (1985), cert. denied sub nom., Nadworny v. Massachusetts, 477 U.S. 904 (1986). The compulsion of handwriting exemplars also does not violate the Fourth Amendment. United States v. Mara, 410 U.S. 19, 21 (1973). "Handwriting, like speech is repeatedly shown to the public, and there is no more expectation of privacy in the physical characteristics of a person's script than


there is in the tone of his voice." Nor does Article Twelve prohibit the taking of a handwriting exemplar, given the Supreme Judicial Court's current definition of the phrase to "furnish evidence." "A purely literal construction of Article 12 would forbid the compelled production of any evidence furnished by the defendant. Conceivably, this could apply to fingerprints, photographs, line-ups, blood samples, handwriting and voice exemplars, and, indeed, even the appearance of the defendant at trial for identification purposes. We doubt that the framers of our State Constitution intended Article 12 to prohibit these common methods of identification." Brennan, 386 Mass. at 780 (emphasis added).

2. The Requested Handwriting Exemplar is Necessary to the Prosecution of the Commonwealth's Case

The admissibility of handwriting evidence in a criminal case is well established. Nadworny, 396 Mass. at 362; Commonwealth v. Camelio, 1 Mass. App. Ct. 296, 298 (1973). The Commonwealth is in possession of a New Hampshire motel guest book allegedly signed by the defendant. This evidence would corroborate other evidence indicating that the defendant traveled from Boston to New Hampshire where he and another person allegedly stole the handgun which was later used in the homicide of Inaam Yazbek.





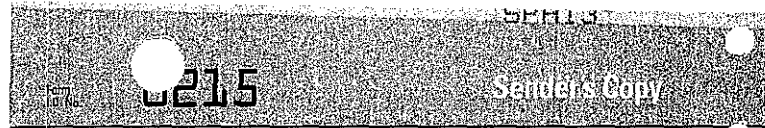

When I arrived on the scene I saw a blue Crown Victoria and a man in the drive way. I approached the man and introduced myself as a Conway police officer. The man told me his name was,

[REDACTED],

and that he owned the unit and it had been burglarized. He also told me that he was a Private investigator out of Massachusetts. [REDACTED] told that this unit was a second home of his and that he had only come to stay the night. [REDACTED] said that when he arrived at his residence he went in through the front door, and noticed that the dead bolt was not locked, as he always keeps it. [REDACTED] then went to the kitchen and made himself a snack. [REDACTED] went to the basement and got some laundry to put away in his dresser. When [REDACTED] went to his bed room on the second floor he noticed that his closet door was open and one of his dresser drawers was half way open.

[REDACTED] checked the dresser drawer very quickly because he knew that he kept his fire arm in the draw. [REDACTED] found that his fire arm, a

1974, Colt Python 4 inch blue steel 357 magnum,

and holster had been taken. He than looked in the closet, that he found open, and saw that a green army bag that he kept his ammunition in was missing. [REDACTED] realized his home had been broken into and went outside and called the police.

[REDACTED] told me that he had been at the residence on the weekend of 03/19/00 and knew that the firearm was there. He said that nobody had been at the residence since that weekend. Before I arrived he called his property care taker, Summit Property Maintenance, and found that they had not been to the residence.

I asked [REDACTED] if there were any signs of a forced entry and he told me that two of his glass sliders had been sliced by a sharp object and three of his screens had been pried open. I started to walk around the house with Tate and he showed me where the suspects had tried to gain entry. On the first floor deck the screen door had been sliced and opened. The slider that was directly behind that screen door had a square cutting mark next to the lock. It looked like the suspects were trying to cut the glass out of the door but failed. As I walked to the back of the house I saw that the back screen door had been pried open. There was also a ladder under the first floor deck. The only door that was open was the second floor slider on the east side of the house. Tate told me this was the only door that did not have a secondary lock on it.

I called dispatch and had them call in Detective Dicey. While we were waiting for Detective Dicey, [REDACTED] told me that he thought the Gun had been used in a homicide in Boston, MA. He told me that Boston Homicide had contacted a family member and told him that [REDACTED] daughter,

was a suspect in a homicide where a 357 revolver was used. The family member than called [REDACTED] on 03/31/00 and informed him of the status of his daughter. [REDACTED] told me that his daughter had been in a lot of trouble and he had not seen her in a while. He told me that last time she was in the house was in 12/99, after she had been kicked out of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said that his daughter had been living with her grandmother since 12/99 in [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said that his daughter did have knowledge of where the weapon was.

[REDACTED] called Boston PD while we were waiting for Dicey. He told,

what had happened. [REDACTED] told him that we were investigating a burglary of his weapon, and he knew that his daughter was a suspect of a crime with a similar weapon. Traylor did not want to talk with [REDACTED] over the phone about it and set up an appointment for 04/03/00. The detective was given the Conway PD phone number and told to use Detective Dicey as a contact person.

Detective Dicey than arrived at the scene and took over the investigation. I assisted as he took multiple pictures of foot prints he found in the house by the point of entry, the second floor slider door. After Dicey finished his on scene investigation we left the scene. Tate was told to come the Police Station so we could get a copy of his finger prints to compare to the finger prints Dicey lifted.

[REDACTED] came to the station and gave his finger prints. I asked [REDACTED] when and where he had last fired the stolen weapon,. [REDACTED] said it was three years ago at Black Mt. I gave [REDACTED] the Police Department Fax number and asked him to fax the serial number and other information he had on the stolen weapon. [REDACTED] left the department and said he would contact us on 04/03/00.

I questioned neighbors on both sides of the [REDACTED] residence. The only neighbor that could say she heard something out of the ordinary was [REDACTED], [REDACTED], [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said on 03/30/00 she head a pounding on her side door and rear screen door.

On 4-1-00 at 1615 hrs I was requested to respond to a burglary at

Upon arrival I met with Ptl Colby and the victim

[REDACTED]  
who informed me that he was missing a handgun from his dresser drawer and that his daughter

[REDACTED]  
was a potential suspect. I was also advised that there had been a homicide in Boston and that the burglary and the homicide may be connected. [REDACTED] also informed me that he had not been to the condo for a couple of weeks. [REDACTED] followed by saying that his daughter had been attending [REDACTED] until 12-99 and she was expelled. [REDACTED] said that his daughter had not been to the condo to his knowledge since 12-99. [REDACTED] said that nothing else appeared to be missing or disturbed in the house except for the gun and a knapsack which contained ammo from the closet.

The condo was a story and one half with a walkin basement at the lower level. In reviewing the scene, the suspects appeared to have walked to a basement window on the west side. I later photographed the imprint. The suspect(s) gained entry by using a step ladder to climb to the first floor back deck. The suspect(s) then walked to the west side of the unit and climbed to the second floor deck and may have used a screen door as a ladder to access the deck. The suspect(s) then pryed the sliding glass door to gain access to what was known as [REDACTED]'s room. The suspect(s) first tried using a glass cutter or similar device to cut the glass near the lock. The suspects also tried prying a sliding glass door on the first floor screened in area as well as trying to cut the glass but were unable to slide the door because of a wooden prop. The sliding glass door at [REDACTED]'s room was the only door that did not have a door prop.

I photographed shoe impressions in the carpet in [REDACTED]'s room that I believe that belonged to the suspects. I determined that the impressions were not that of [REDACTED].

I developed a latent print on the inside of the door handle on the screen door and removed the handle for evidence. I also developed three partial latent prints on the inside of the glass of the main entry storm door, I photographed and removed the latents and were marked as JLD-1 & JLD-2.

I dusted for latent prints on all of the sliding glass doors and handles as well as the dresser drawer where the gun was kept and did not see anything of evidentiary value.

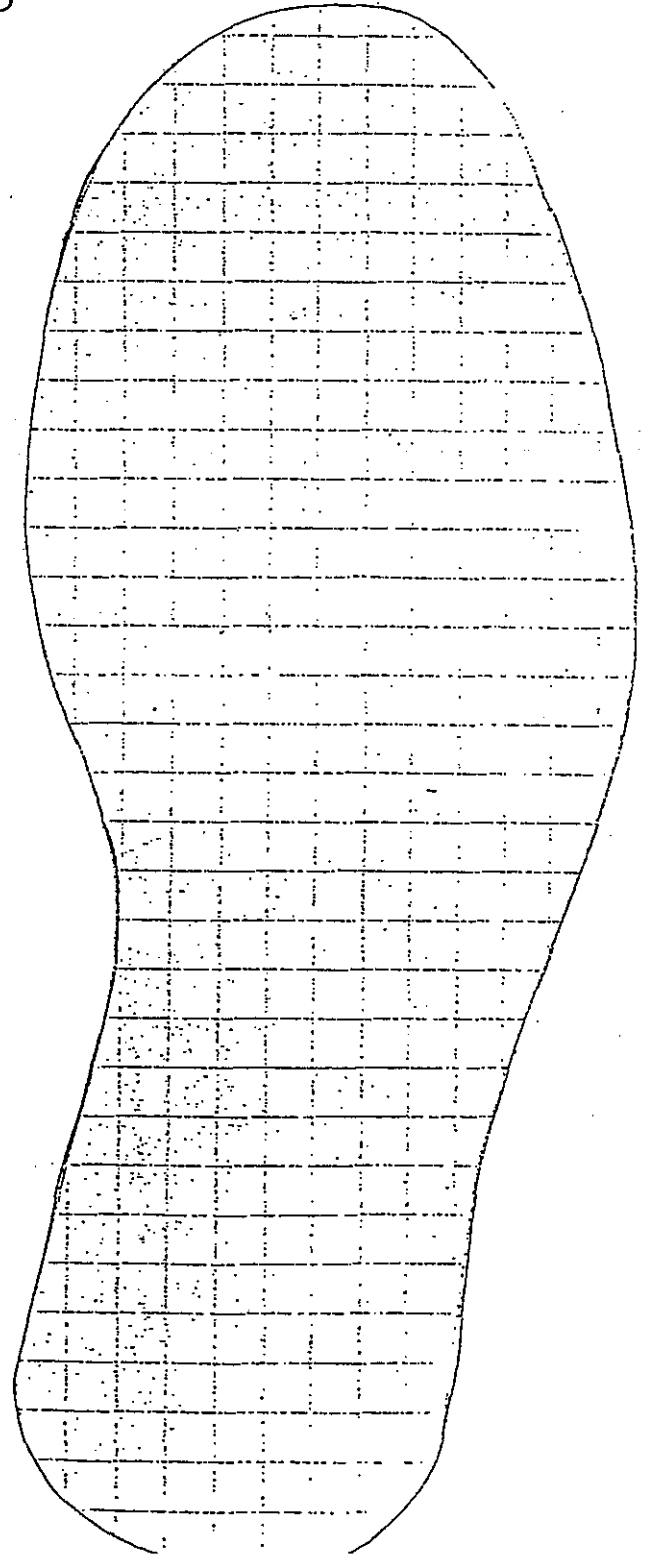
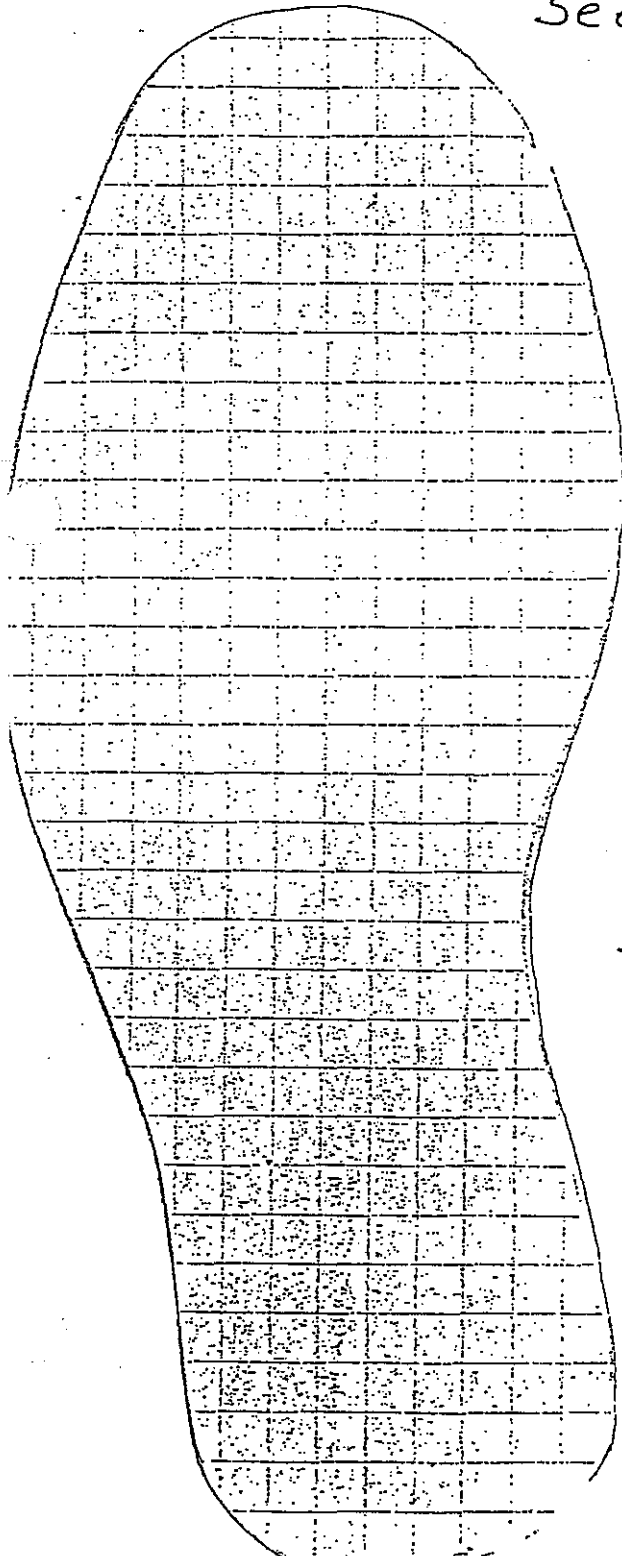

Juan Torres interviewed ██████████ at the Yankee Clipper Motor Lodge in North Conway, N.H. Ms. ██████████ was the clerk on duty during the overnight shift on March 25, 2000 at the motel when an individual rented room ██████████ using the name of ██████████. Ms. ██████████ could not specifically recall who she rented the room to on this date but informed the investigators that she would typically fill in certain sections of a rental folio and require the person renting the room to complete other sections. Ms. ██████████ was shown a copy of rental folio # 008521 dated 03/25/00 and asked to point out which sections she would typically complete. Ms. ██████████ indicated that she would fill in the room number and name at the top left above the folio number and then the room number and departure date on the next section. Ms. ██████████ stated that she would usually mark the sections that need to be completed by the guest. Ms. ██████████ stated that the remainder of folio #008521 was completed by the guest renting room # 302 on 3/25/00.

Ms. ██████████ was shown a photo array consisting of nine black males including ██████████ (#00-000435) and asked if she could identify the person who had rented room ██████████ on 3/25/00. Ms. ██████████ was not able to identify anyone but stated that the individual in position #1 looks like someone who may have rented a room in the past. (██████████ is not position #1). Ms. ██████████ was then shown a second photo array consisting of nine black males including ██████████ (#00-000460) and asked if she could identify the person who rented room ██████████ on 3/25/00. Ms. ██████████ was not able to identify any of the individuals within this array. Ms. ██████████ was then shown a photo array consisting of nine white females including ██████████ (#00-000434) and asked if she could identify anyone. Ms. ██████████ was not able to identify anyone within this gallery but stated that position #1 appeared to be someone who might have stayed at the hotel in the past. (position #1 is not ██████████).

Upon completing the interview with Ms. ██████████ Sgt. Coleman took photographs of the Yankee Clipper Motor Lodge, including photographs of the door marked as room ██████████. The Motor Lodge includes three buildings; the main building contains the check-in area, guest rooms, and a restaurant, there are two additional buildings which are located to the rear of the main building. Room ██████████ is located in the building directly behind the main building and is on the first floor toward the left side as you face the doors.

On Monday July 17, 2000 members of the Y.V.S.F. arrested [REDACTED] for an outstanding Brighton District Court Warrant for Murder. Upon his arrest [REDACTED] was transported to the Homicide Unit. Upon arrival at the Homicide Unit Sgt. Det Coleman and Det McLaughlin met with [REDACTED]. Sgt. Det. Coleman informed Mr. [REDACTED] that he was under arrest for the murder of Inaam Yazbek, which occurred on March 28, 2000. Sgt. Det. Coleman immediately placed a BPD Miranda Warning form in front of [REDACTED] and explained that before engaging in any further conversation with [REDACTED] he must be informed of his Miranda rights (3:50 PM). Sgt. Det Coleman then asked Mr. [REDACTED] to read along as Sgt. Det. Coleman read the form out loud. After each line was read Sgt. Coleman asked Mr. [REDACTED] to initial the line if he understood the right just read to him. Mr. Anderson indicated he understood each line by placing his initials "[REDACTED]" on each line. After being informed of each right and indicating that he understood these rights [REDACTED] then agreed to speak with investigators and indicated so by placing his signature at the bottom of the form.

[REDACTED] stated that he has known [REDACTED] for years and that they had attended school together. He stated that he knows [REDACTED] as an acquaintance through [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. Mr. [REDACTED] described [REDACTED] as a "druggy prostitute" that he has not seen in a long time. Mr. [REDACTED] denies having a dating relationship with [REDACTED]

When [REDACTED] was asked about his activity and whereabouts on March 28, 2000 he told officers that whatever he said when he was interviewed on a prior occasion relative to this same investigation is where he was on the date in question. He told the investigators to check their notes because he couldn't remember and he then stated that he was probably hanging with friends and drinking on Bowdoin St. like he often does. When asked about which friends he would have been with on March 27 and 28 he stated [REDACTED] and maybe "[REDACTED], and [REDACTED]" but he could not be sure because it was such a long time ago.

Mr. [REDACTED] was asked if he let other people drive his green Mazda and he replied that sometimes his brother might use it. He was asked if he or his car would have been in the area of the Faneuil development in Brighton during the late hours of March 27 and early hours of March 28, 2000 and he replied that neither he nor his car was in that area. Sgt. Det. Coleman informed him that numerous persons have told the police that both he and his car were seen in that area on those dates and he stated that those people must be wrong because he was sure that he was not in the area. Sgt. Det Coleman then

asked him how he could be so sure that he was not in that area on these particular dates yet his recollection is not so certain with regard to where he might have been. Mr. ██████████ responded by stating that he only knows that he was not in Brighton on those dates.

Mr. ██████████ was asked if he ever had occasion to travel to New Hampshire. He stated that he would often travel to the Concord and Manchester area. He was asked if he ever went to North Conway, Conway section of New Hampshire and he stated that he did not. He was asked if he ever went to New Hampshire with ██████████ and he stated "never".

At approximately 4:15 PM the interview was concluded.

A. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]

Q. And what floor?

A. [REDACTED]

Q. All right do you stay there some time?

A. On occasion.

Q. Did you stay there that Monday night?

A. Yup, I've been there, Sunday night, Monday night, Tuesday night. I think

Wednesday, Thursday I came home. I'm there this weekend. I stayed for the last three nights.

- Q. So you, you're not sure if you was over in the Faneuil Housing Projects on Monday night or it could have been on Sunday night?
- A. It could have been on Sunday night. Whenever his grandmother tells you the day, I'll go, I'll go with that. That's the day.
- Q. .... so either one of those two days that you're talking about, did you see [REDACTED]?
- A. Yup, yes I did.
- Q. And where did you see him first?
- A. First time I seen him is down around Dudley Station. Picked him up to receive information that he asked me to get from his grandmother.

Q. So you didn't have [REDACTED] with you on Tuesday when

Q. you left work. Picked your girlfriend up and picked the baby up? Did you pick him up after that you dropped off your girlfriend and your baby?

A. No sir.

Q. Did you pick anybody up after you dropped your baby and girlfriend off?

A. Yes I think, I believe I picked up my friend, [REDACTED] and we went back to her house. And I had a couple of beers.

Q. And where did you go after you guys finished with the beer?

A. Ahm he went home and I went to sleep.

Q. Did you go out after [REDACTED] left? Yes or no?

A. No sir.

Q. The next time you went out was Wednesday morning?

A. I believe so, yes sir.

Q. And where were you going when you went out Wednesday morning?

A. Work I believe. ....

Q. When you leave to go to work, who's, who's at home when you leave to go to work?

- A. Everybody. All the kids. Ahm my girlfriend's little brothers and sisters. Her mother.
- Q. Your girlfriend lives there with her mother?
- A. Yup.
- Q. What time do your girlfriend go to work?
- A. She has to be in work at 10:00 o'clock. So she leaves about 9:00 o'clock.
- Q. And what time do you get off from work Wednesday?
- A. Five o'clock. I work the same hours everyday.
- Q. You didn't get off from work early Wednesday?
- A. Ya Wednesday I got out. I did get out of work early. I got out of work, I got out of work early Wednesday. I got out about not sure if it's Wednesday, I, I think. Wednesday night I work, one of the days I had got into a car accident .....while I was at lunch ..... No that wasn't Wednesday.
- Wednesday I did leave work early. Yup I left about 3:30, 4:00 o'clock. 3:30.
- Q. Going back to Tuesday, did you get to work late Tuesday morning?
- A. I'm not sure, I don't think so.
- Q. You said you have to be in work around 7:15.
- A. Ya about 7:15. ....he tells us to get in at 7:15 cause we have to be there working by 7:20 so. .... I don't want to be to exact with the answers. Because I don't clock every second of my life and every day of my life. So I'm not really exactly sure. I give you
- Q. All I want you to be is you know as sure as you can be.

- A. No, I'm, I'm pretty sure that that's what took place. But I do not want to say, I don't want to say exactly I was here at 7:15 and then you at my job and it says you punched in at 7:16 or 7:20. Cause I don't clock my life, every single day. You say what you do last week. Well I don't know. I can't tell you exactly what I did. ....sit down and talk oh remember you did this?
- Q. I think we can understand that sir.
- A. Oh all right. Just trying to put that out there sir.
- Q. What, what did you do when you left work early Wednesday?
- A. Shaved up. ....got out early. Just shaved, shaved up. Ahm had to go the barbershop I believe and there was, it was too crowded.
- Q. Did you go to your mother's house when you got out of work early?
- A. Yup.
- Q. And who was there when you got there?
- A. Nobody. I don't
- Q. And why did you go there?
- A. Because I go, just about everyday. I try to go home. All my clothes are at my house. Everything I have is at my house.
- Q. Was [REDACTED] at your mother's house Wednesday?
- A. Not Wednesday, no. No (inaudible)
- Q. Do you pick up your girlfriend and the baby Wednesday?
- A. Yup.
- Q. And when you took them home what did you do?

A. I believe I just hung out at her house.

Q. You didn't see [REDACTED] on Wednesday?

A. Yup. I think Wednesday I did see him. But I basically see him everyday.

.....at the house.

Q. Okay. You didn't go back out Thursday. I mean Wednesday. Sorry.

A. Maybe ah, maybe rent a movie at Blockbuster. But I was with my girl

On April 21, 2000 [REDACTED] was interviewed at BPD Headquarters in the Homicide Unit. [REDACTED] had been arrested by the BPD Youth Violence Strike Force on an outstanding Roxbury Court default warrant. Present during this interview were Sgt. Det Coleman, Sgt. Det Duggan, and Det Traylor. [REDACTED] was not handcuffed during this interview, and prior to initiating any questioning or conversation Sgt. Det Coleman informed [REDACTED] that he was under arrest for a default warrant. [REDACTED] was informed that he was at the Homicide Unit as part of an ongoing investigation into the homicide of Inaam Yazbak which occurred in the Faneuil Development in Brighton on March 28, 2000. [REDACTED] was informed of his rights pursuant to Miranda. A BPD Miranda Form was placed before [REDACTED] and Sgt. Det Coleman asked him if he was able to read it; he replied that he could. Sgt. Det Coleman then completed the top portion of the form and asked [REDACTED] to read along as each line was read to him aloud. After each line Sgt. Det Coleman asked [REDACTED] if he understood the right just read; he verbally responded that he did and placed his initials on the line indicating so. After initialing each right [REDACTED] was asked if he was willing to give a statement without a lawyer being present; he stated that he was and placed his signature on the line indicating so. Sgt. Det Coleman and Det Traylor also signed the form. This form was completed at 11:48 AM.

Sgt. Det Coleman inquired of [REDACTED] where he resided and [REDACTED] replied that he moved around and stayed "all over". He provided his grandmother's address as [REDACTED] in [REDACTED], but then stated that he could no longer stay at that location because he was ordered to stay out of the Faneuil Development as a result of a recent arrest. [REDACTED] described that arrest as being found sleeping in a hallway with a firearm on his person along with some ammunition. [REDACTED] also stated that he occasionally stayed at [REDACTED] in [REDACTED] with a friend named [REDACTED] (no phone, cell # [REDACTED]). [REDACTED] then stated that most recently he had been staying with a friend at [REDACTED] (which is the location of his arrest).

[REDACTED] was asked if he knew anyone called [REDACTED]. He replied that [REDACTED] was his very close friend named [REDACTED] and provided his address as [REDACTED] in [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated that he grew up with [REDACTED] and that they had been in the same class at the Tobin School when the entire class was given scholarships to Northeastern University as part of a mentoring program. [REDACTED] stated that he had not seen [REDACTED] in weeks. He stated that "we were tight", but recently they would only see each other occasionally. Sgt. Det Coleman asked [REDACTED] if he had been at the Faneuil

Development on March 27, 2000 or during the several days following. [REDACTED] replied that he does not go there due to his recent arrest. He was confronted with information that he may have gotten a ride to the development from [REDACTED] around that same period and [REDACTED] remembered that he did get a ride from [REDACTED]. He stated that [REDACTED] went to [REDACTED]'s grandmother to get some money while [REDACTED] waited outside the development in [REDACTED]'s car. [REDACTED] denied being with [REDACTED] at the Faneuil Development on March 27 and 28 and the days following; except for waiting in [REDACTED]'s car during the visit described above. [REDACTED] repeated that he has not seen [REDACTED] in weeks other than getting a ride that day.

[REDACTED] was asked if he knew [REDACTED]. He stated that he knew [REDACTED] well as a result of growing up together in the development. He smiled and described [REDACTED] as "my girl". When asked if [REDACTED] was his girlfriend he stated that she used to be, but most recently they were just really close friends. [REDACTED] stated that while he was locked up for the gun [REDACTED] had been carrying his pager ([REDACTED]). He stated that he had gotten it back from [REDACTED] only recently, and guessed that it was around the first week of April. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] lives with her mother and her phone # is [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated that the last time he saw [REDACTED] was "2 1/2 to 3 weeks ago". He denies being with [REDACTED] in the Faneuil Development during the last days of March 2000.

[REDACTED] was asked if he knew a girl named [REDACTED]. He stated that he knew [REDACTED] because she was [REDACTED]'s girlfriend. [REDACTED] stated that he did not like [REDACTED] and would only associate with her because of her friendship with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated that he last saw [REDACTED] shortly after he got out of jail for the gun arrest. He denies being with [REDACTED] in the Faneuil Development at all during the last days of March 2000. [REDACTED] then stated that [REDACTED] used to "mess with [REDACTED]". [REDACTED] described [REDACTED] as a former enemy of his, but they have since resolved their differences.

[REDACTED] was asked if he knew "[REDACTED]" from Faneuil Development. [REDACTED] stated that he knew "[REDACTED]" but has not seen him in "a while".

He was asked about "[REDACTED]". He stated that he knew "[REDACTED]" but hadn't seen him for about two weeks.

Sgt. Det Coleman asked [REDACTED] if he knew of anyone else in the development named "[REDACTED]" and he stated that he knows [REDACTED], a 20 year old, racially mixed male that lives near the recreation hall at the development.

Sgt. Det Coleman asked [REDACTED] why people would say that they saw [REDACTED] in the Faneuil Development on March 27, 28 and the days following. [REDACTED] stated that people might be confused because he was not in the development. He was asked why people would say that they saw him with [REDACTED], [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] in the general area of the development and he stated that it wasn't him because he hasn't seen those people lately.

[REDACTED] was asked how he became aware of the murder at the development. He stated that his grandmother mentioned it to him, and that he heard about it on the news and in newspapers. Sgt. Det Coleman asked [REDACTED] where he was staying during the latter part of March. [REDACTED] thought for a moment and replied that he was occasionally staying in the Intervale St. area with a girl named [REDACTED] ([REDACTED]).

He was asked if he had ever had discussion with the group of people mentioned above relative to the murder and he replied that he did not. Sgt. Det Coleman confronted [REDACTED] with the idea that Inaam Yazbek might have been the intended victim of a robbery, but due to additional circumstances was killed during the robbery. [REDACTED] responded to this information by looking down at the floor for a moment and then staring directly at Sgt. Det Coleman for a long time while no one in the room spoke a word. Sgt. Det. Coleman then asked [REDACTED] "did you kill this guy?" [REDACTED] replied in a low but even toned voice "No, I didn't" and stared downward at the floor. He would then repeat that he was never in the area of the Faneuil development at all during the time of this incident and the days following.

During the interview he was asked if he had a watch, he lifted his sleeve and revealed no watch, he rubbed his wrist, and stated "it's broken".

The interview was concluded at 1:20 PM and [REDACTED] was informed that the investigation would continue. Sgt. Det Coleman provided him with a business card and invited him to call if there was any information that he could provide relative to this investigation. [REDACTED] was then turned over to members of the Y.V.S.F. for further processing.

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On Thursday May 18, 2000 at approximately 10:40 AM Sgt Det Coleman, Sgt Det Duggan, and Det Traylor of the Homicide Unit and A.D.A. Robert Tochka met with [REDACTED] and her attorney James Doyle at the Boston Municipal Court. At the time of this meeting [REDACTED] was in custody for charges unrelated to this investigation. The purpose of the meeting was to execute a proffer agreement between Ms. [REDACTED] and the District attorney's Office facilitating a debriefing of Ms. [REDACTED] relative to her knowledge of the death of Inaam Yazbek on 3-28-00.

During the interview [REDACTED] stated that she has known Inaam "Yaz" Yazbek for a long time. She stated that her relationship with him consisted mainly of socializing with groups of friends. Ms. [REDACTED] stated she knew "Yaz" to frequently carry large sums of money and would often pay for the group while socializing at restaurants and clubs.

Ms. [REDACTED] stated that at the time of this incident she was involved in a dating relationship with a black male named [REDACTED] who is also known as [REDACTED]. Ms. [REDACTED] also frequently associated with a white female named [REDACTED], a white male named [REDACTED], and a black male named [REDACTED] all of which are known to frequent the Faneuil Housing Development.

Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she and [REDACTED] had several conversations prior to this incident relative to committing a robbery. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that on the evening of Monday March 27, 2000 she was present at [REDACTED]'s house with [REDACTED], [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and [REDACTED]. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that the group was playing cards and video games, and at some point [REDACTED] announced that he was going home. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that at this point she went into another room and had a private conversation with [REDACTED] during which she asked him if he wanted to rob "Yaz" before he went home. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] then called [REDACTED] into the room and asked him if he was "down for a robbery". Ms. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] replied that he would participate in the robbery. Ms. [REDACTED] was asked if any of the other persons in the apartment at that time were aware of, or involved in, the robbery and she stated that they were not.

Ms. [REDACTED] stated that after the conversation between her, [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] the three left [REDACTED]'s house and drove to [REDACTED]'s house at [REDACTED] in [REDACTED]. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that they drove in [REDACTED] green Mazda. Once at Dunboy St. Joleena went inside her house to call "Yaz" to arrange a meeting, while [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] waited outside for confirmation that the meeting would take place.

Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she phoned "Yaz" on his cell phone and asked him to come and pick her up at [REDACTED]. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that when she spoke with "Yaz" he was at Wadi's restaurant in Watertown and that he would come right over and pick her up. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she went outside and spoke with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] and informed them that she would page [REDACTED] when they were leaving the restaurant and enroute back to Brighton. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] did not carry a pager. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that the plan was for her to ask "Yaz" to drive into the alley/driveway at 89 Faneuil St. and escort her into the first floor hallway. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were supposed to be waiting inside the hallway where they would then rob "Yaz" while Ms. [REDACTED] pretended to run away from the "robbers".

Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she was picked up by "Yaz" and then they went directly back to Wadi's where they sat at a table alone and had drinks and light food. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that while at Wadi's she telephoned [REDACTED] using "Yaz's" phone in an effort to place an order for marijuana, but she did not speak with [REDACTED]. A short time later [REDACTED] called Ms. [REDACTED] back on "Yaz's" cell number (via caller ID). Ms. [REDACTED] then stated that at approximately 11:15 PM she paged [REDACTED] as planned and entered a time, indicating what time she would arrive at the prearranged location. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that each of these phone calls was made using "Yaz's" cell phone. After paging [REDACTED] she and "Yaz" left Wadi's and drove directly to 89 Faneuil St. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that after arriving at 89 Faneuil St she asked "Yaz" to escort her into the hallway and he did. She stated that after entering the hallway she realized that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were not inside and she knocked on a first floor door which she knows to be an unoccupied maintenance room. She stated to "Yaz" that her friends must not be home and the two then exited the hallway. Once outside they were near the driver's door of "Yaz's" car when Ms. [REDACTED] and "Yaz" were confronted by [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she exclaimed something to the effect of "oh no they're gonna rob us" and she walked away toward the play area inside the development. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that when she last observed "Yaz" he was being lead toward the hallway by [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] who were on either side of "Yaz" and holding him by the arms.

Ms. [REDACTED] stated that as she walked toward the play area she observed [REDACTED] and she called [REDACTED]'s name and whistled at her to get her attention. Ms. [REDACTED] then met with [REDACTED] along a pathway leading to the play area and told [REDACTED] to just keep walking with her. While walking along Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she heard the sound of a gunshot and she stated to [REDACTED] "Oh Shit". [REDACTED] then asked Ms. [REDACTED] what was going on and Ms. [REDACTED] told her to just keep walking. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she walked in the direction of the parking lot on the Faneuil St. side of the development and directly to [REDACTED]'s green Mazda which was parked there. At the vehicle she met [REDACTED] who had come from the direction of the rear entrance to #89 Faneuil St. [REDACTED] got in the driver's seat and Ms. [REDACTED] got into the passenger seat and the two drove toward Faneuil St. At about the same time [REDACTED] came running toward the car from the other side of the building and got into the rear seat of the car. The three then exited the parking lot, turned left onto Faneuil St, then left onto Market St., then right onto North Beacon St. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that they drove straight down North Beacon St. and past the firehouse in Union Sq. and turned onto a side street. During this drive [REDACTED] stated to [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] "I got my body for the summer". Ms. [REDACTED] stated that while they were driving in the vehicle [REDACTED]

removed a revolver from his dark colored down vest and handed it into the back seat to . When they turned onto the side street they arrived at a parking lot and drove over to a piece of construction equipment (bobcat style) and took the gun back from and placed the gun under the equipment. The three then drove away and onto the Mass Pike and killed some time. During this ride Ms. stated that and were complaining that they only got \$46.00 from the victim's wallet.

Approximately 30 to 40 minutes later the three drove back to the area of the Faneuil Development and went into the park across from the development and met with and . Ms. stated that she bought \$10.00 worth of marijuana from . Ms. stated while this group was together and repeatedly asked what was going on and what had just happened. Ms. stated that then stated that he had lost his watch during the robbery and he asked if she would go over to the area of 89 Faneuil St. and look for it. Ms. stated that after approximately 5-10 minutes she, and left the park and and stayed behind. Ms. stated that the three of them got back into the green Mazda and drove around smoking marijuana and after a while drove back to the parking lot. After arriving at the parking lot got out of the car and retrieved the gun from under the construction equipment. got back into the car and handed the gun back to . Ms. stated that at this time they drove to where she went into her house and and drove away.

Upon entering her house Ms. stated that she saw and sitting talking with her mother. Ms. stated that she and left the room and went into a bathroom together. While in the bathroom Ms. stated that Heather told her that her and went to 89 Faneuil St looking for's watch. Heather told Ms. that she saw the body and that the guy's face was blown off. Ms. stated that she and discussed the fact that , and were in big trouble and Ms. stated that she had to leave the area.

Ms. stated that when she awoke the next morning she spoke with and told her that the police had been at her house and that police were everywhere. Ms. stated that several days later called her and picked her up in his green Mazda. She stated that told her to get hold of and because they needed to talk about what had happened. Ms. stated that the group met at the car wash on Market St. While together they agreed that they should all stick to the story that they did not see anything and that none of them should say anything to the police. During the conversation and discussed what had happened and how they kept telling the victim to turn around and not look at them because they weren't wearing any masks. They described how the victim kept saying that he was not a "cop" and kept trying to turn around and continuously refused to do what they told him to do. During this conversation described how he was holding the gun to the victim's head while searched the victim's pockets. Ms. stated that during this conversation she asked what happened when he shot the victim and he described how the victim's head snapped and then his body collapsed.

Ms. stated that she was only aware of the victim being robbed of \$46.00 and a wallet, and a cell phone. She was asked about a ring which the victim might have been wearing and denied having seen the ring at all. Ms. was asked if she had used, or

been present at anytime when the victim's property (i.e. credit cards, bank cards) was being used after the murder and she replied that she was not aware that any property had been used.

Ms. [REDACTED] was asked about her knowledge of either [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] having access to a firearm. She replied that she had told [REDACTED] that her father owned firearms and kept them at his property in the North Conway, New Hampshire area. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she suggested to [REDACTED] that they steal the guns and sell them for cash. She described how she and [REDACTED] drove to her father's condo in New Hampshire and forcibly entered the location and removed at least one firearm and ammunition from the home. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she and [REDACTED] returned to Boston with the firearm and [REDACTED] would try to sell it in Boston. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that it was her belief that the gun was sold and that she did not see it again until after the incident involving "Yaz". Ms. [REDACTED] stated that it is her belief that the gun used during this incident is the same gun which was stolen in New Hampshire.

Ms. [REDACTED] described numerous conversations with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] prior to this incident during which the two men would speak about their plan to start a gang and call it "The Commission". She described how these conversations would involve discussions of robbing drug dealers in order to get drugs and money to support the group's goal of becoming a major force throughout the city in controlling drug dealing. She stated that there was a discussion about wearing leather jackets with the words "The Commission" on the back, to signify membership within the group and recruiting youths within various high schools to conduct drug dealing throughout Boston. Ms. [REDACTED] described [REDACTED] as being "very smart" and [REDACTED] as a person who looks up to [REDACTED].

At the conclusion of this interview Ms. [REDACTED] was returned to the B.M.C. lockup and transported back to the Nashua St. Jail.

Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that on Monday night (3/27/00) her daughter [REDACTED] was outside the building in the "play area" of the projects sitting on a picnic table.

At approximately 11:40, Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that she went outside her building and observed [REDACTED] sitting at the picnic table with [REDACTED] and a second individual. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that she did not recognize the second person and was not sure whether it was a male or female. She stated that she whistled and yelled to [REDACTED] to remind her that she was supposed to be in the house at 12:00 midnight. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that she went to sleep shortly thereafter and did not know what time [REDACTED] came home. She stated that she does not recall having any conversations since that time with [REDACTED] about what time she came in.

Mrs. [REDACTED] also stated that [REDACTED] had also come in the house a short time before 11:40 but she did not know the exact time. She stated that [REDACTED] only remained inside for a short time and went back outside. She stated that she also reminded her at that time that she should be in the house at midnight.

In addition, Mrs. [REDACTED] was asked if she had seen [REDACTED] with [REDACTED] on that night and she stated that she had not. She also stated that Heather had told her that [REDACTED] had left earlier in the night at about 8:00 PM.

The interview ended at approximately 4:12 PM.

On April 7, at approximately 3:15 PM, Det. McLaughlin and Det. Traylor of the Homicide Unit provided transportation to [REDACTED] from Boston Police Headquarters to his place of residence. Mr. [REDACTED] stated that he had in fact gone by that location after the shooting and observed a body lying on its side with one arm out straight and the other reaching across its chest (at this time he demonstrated the position of the victim's arms). Mr. [REDACTED] stated that he did not get up close and did not remain at that location for more than a few seconds. Mr. [REDACTED] stated that he did not recognize the victim at that time.

With me, with us today is, ah, [REDACTED]. Ah, [REDACTED], if you could please state your name. Spell your full name and give us your date of birth.

- A. We finished our card game and Heather left to go to her house to walk her dog.  
I stayed in the house and then I left.
- Q. Okay. When you left did you, ah, then meet back up with [REDACTED]?
- A. Yes. I was walking down, ah. Like I came out my house, I was on the stairway of my house, parking lot stairway; and Heather was in the little grass area talking to a gentleman on the second floor with her dog.
- Q. Okay. And then did at some point, shortly thereafter, did she bring her dog back to her house?
- A. Yes, she brought it in the house, came right back out, met in the play area, and sat at a picnic table.
- Q. Okay. What did you do at that time?
- A. About to smoke weed, marijuana.
- Q. Okay. Did you remain there for a period of time?
- A. Maybe about a half hour.
- Q. Okay. And then at some point, ah, did [REDACTED]'s mother come out of her house and say something to you?
- A. Yes, she opened the door to the hallway and yelled to Heather that it was 12:00 o'clock and it was time to come in the house.
- Q. Okay. And what happened after that?
- A. Heather replied to her mother that she would be in in a little while.
- Q. Okay. And did something happen after that?
- A. Yes, maybe about I'd say five or ten minutes later, ah, we were sitting still

on the picnic table, ah, I heard a little ruckus over by 89 Fanueil Street. When I turned back it was [REDACTED] in between the maintenance man's fence area.

Q. Okay. Ah, and is it fair to say, ah, [REDACTED], that from the last time that you were in here when myself and Sergeant Detective Coleman conducted a taped interview that we covered everything that happened as you recall from that point until later in the night or earlier Tuesday morning?

A. Yes.

Q. Okay. And has anything changed in your mind from that point; from that day til today?

A. No.

Q. Okay. And if I could just briefly cover, ah, when you hear [REDACTED] whistle. At some point thereafter you hear [REDACTED] whistle and what happened next?

A. Ah, we heard [REDACTED] whistle, ah, and then she yelled to [REDACTED], "[REDACTED] what are you doing? You're suppose to meet me at 11:30." [REDACTED] got off the picnic table, headed towards [REDACTED] and said, "What; are you talking about?"

Q. Okay. Now I'm going to go to the 29th, which is Wednesday, March 29th, okay. At some point on March 29th did you have a conversation with [REDACTED] relative to what had happened on March 28th?

A. Ah, I. My mom gave me the car while she was at work, and I went to the projects to go pick up [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. We were going to go to the mall. When I went upstairs to [REDACTED]'s house [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] were in the

house and I just left. Heather came downstairs and we talked briefly and I told her that everything was going to, everything was going to follow through. She told me to stick to my story and that she had told the detectives that we had sex and to use that so we could have an alibi.

Q. Okay. And had you had sex with [REDACTED] on that night?

A. No.

Q. Okay. Are you boyfriend/girlfriend with [REDACTED]?

A. No.

Q. Do you have any kind of sexual relation with her?

A. None whatsoever.

Q. Okay. And just for the record, who is [REDACTED]?

A. [REDACTED] is my upstairs neighbor. I call him my cousin.

Q. Okay. And that's [REDACTED]. Do you know his last name.

A. [REDACTED].

Q. [REDACTED], okay. Ah, was there also some mention of fingerprints?

A. Yes. Ah, [REDACTED] had. Heather had told me that, ah, if they found the fingerprints on the gentlemen's car that she was going to say that she was with the gentleman earlier in the day.

Q. Now did [REDACTED] say that or did [REDACTED] say that?

A. [REDACTED] told me that.

Q. Okay. Was she talking about herself or [REDACTED]?

A. [REDACTED].

- Q. Okay. Now if we can go to March 30th, okay, that's the Thursday of the same week. At some point in the day did you end up with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]?
- A. Yes. About 11:30. Actually about 11:00 o'clock Jeffrey had come, come down stairs and told me that [REDACTED] was outside, she wanted to talk to me. So I got up. I got dressed, I went outside, and Heather was sitting on my stairway and telling me that we had to meet [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] at Store 24. They wanted to talk to us.
- Q., Okay. And did you in fact go and meet them?
- A. Yes, we walked down. We walked down Faneuil Street and they were in in Scrub-a-Dub. We sat there and talked for a little while.
- Q. Okay. And, ah, during that conversation what was said?
- A. Well, I told. I told [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] that I had known, I knew the gentleman that they had shot and that I had worked for him when I was about fourteen, fifteen years old. He had a landscaping company and they, ah, they said, "Oh, he wasn't a cop?"
- Q. Okay. And then what happened?
- A. Ah,
- Q. Did they, did they go onto say what made them think that he might have been a cop?

A. [REDACTED] said to me that, ah, that he kept saying that he was, ah. He kept mentioning, police, police; and that they thought that he was waiting, that was a sign for a backup.

Q. Okay. Did they say anything about that that was the reason that they shot him?

A. Yes.

Q. Okay. Was there anything else on that particular day, ah, aside from that that any of those people said relative to the shooting or the victim?

A. They said that they got rid of all the evidence, gun, wallet.

Q. Okay. Just gun and wallet, that's what they concluded?

A. Yes.

Q. Okay. Okay. From that point on, that's the 30th, that's the 30th of March, the year 2000, okay, have you had any contact with either [REDACTED], [REDACTED], [REDACTED], [REDACTED], or the guy you refer to as [REDACTED]

A. I spoke to [REDACTED] later on in the night on the 30th.

Q. Okay. And was there anything else said during that conversation?

A. No.

Q. Okay. From that point on, from the 30th at night when you spoke to [REDACTED] have you had any contact with any of these four individuals?

A. No.

Q. Not at all, okay. Have you seen any of them?

A. No.

Q. Okay. What I'd like to do now is, I'd like to show you an array of nine photos, okay. And is it fair to say that prior to going on tape I showed you this same array and this will be Boston Police Department gallery number zero-zero-zero-zero-zero-4-3-5 and it depicts nine black males. I'm going to show you that again and if you could could you, ah, point to the individual who you know as [REDACTED]?

A. Number 4.

Q. Okay. And did you in fact point to that same number 4 prior to going on tape and circle the number 4 and place your initials E. G.?

A. Yes.

Q. Okay. And did you also sign where it says, "Witness", you place your name

[REDACTED]?

A. Yes.

Q. Okay. Relative to this same individual who you know as [REDACTED], ah, does [REDACTED] have a motor vehicle?

A. Yes.

Q. Okay. And do you know the license plate of that motor vehicle?

A. Yes.

Q. Okay. And do you know that off the top of your head?

A. Yes, [REDACTED], Hunter green, Mazda 6-2-6.

Q. Okay. And that's a Massachusetts' registration?

A. Yes.

Q. Okay. And is that the vehicle that you met, ah, those individuals with on



March 30th at the Scrub-a-Dub Car Wash?

A. Correct.

Q. Okay. At that time was there any front end damage, like heavy front end damage, to that motor vehicle?

A. No.

Q. Okay. I'd also like to show you a second group of photographs also depicting nine black males. This is Boston Police Department gallery number zero-zero-zero-zero-zero-4-6-zero. Okay. If you could look at that, and again is it fair to say I did show you the same one before we went on tape. That is correct?

A. Yes.

Q. Okay. And in that group of nine black males do you see the person you know as [REDACTED]?

A. Yes, number 4.

Q. Okay. And that number 4, is it fair to say that you circled number 4 and placed your initials next to it?

A. Correct.

Q. Okay. And on the bottom where it says "witness" did you also sign it [REDACTED] [REDACTED]?

A. Yes.

Q. Okay. And that is the person you know as [REDACTED]?

A. Yes.

Q. How long have you known [REDACTED]?

A. Long time. Just about ten years, eleven years. (Hear a beep).

Q. Okay. I'd like to show you one more group of photographs and this would be a group of nine white females, Boston Police Department gallery number zero-zero-zero-zero-zero-4-3-4. And, again, I showed you this prior to going on tape.

That's correct?

A. Yes.

Q. And in this group of photographs do you see the female who you know as [REDACTED]?

A. Yes, number 2.

Q. Okay. And prior to going on tape did you look at this and circle the number 2 and place your initials next to it?

A. Yes.

Q. Okay. And did you also sign at the bottom where it states "witness", and you signed [REDACTED]?

A. Yes.

Q. And that is the female you know as [REDACTED]

A. [REDACTED]?

Q. [REDACTED] And that is the female who is, ah, who is out in the Faneuil Projects, ah, shortly after midnight on March 28th, 2000? Is that correct?

A. Correct.

Q. Okay. And that's the same female Joleena that was with you on the 30th at the Scrub-a-Dub Car Wash? Is that correct?

A. Yes.

Q. Okay. And how long have you known [REDACTED]?

A. About two years, three years.

Q. Okay. And do you know [REDACTED] to be from the projects?


A. No, she's from Oak Square.

Q. Okay. And do you know what street she lives on?

A. No. I know she lives in a red house.

Q. Okay. Do you know who she lives with?

A. Ah, her mother and, I think, her grandmother.

 Q. Okay. Okay. Going back to the March 28th, okay, and, again, much of this

has been covered on the prior tape. But at some time do you see [REDACTED] and

[REDACTED] leave the area of 89 Faneuil, ah, heading in the direction of the parking lot?

A. Yes. Prior to the shots they came out of the, I didn't see them come out of

the building. But they were in that walkway heading between: the walkway

between 75 and 85, and then I walked through the park. I finished walking

through the play area, I glanced over my shoulder, and they were running

through the parking lot heading towards the car.

Q. Okay. And you said "prior to the shots". Do you mean after the shots?

A. Yes, after the shots.

Q. Okay. And when you say they were heading towards the car, did you know that

car to be in that parking lot?

A. No, I didn't see it. I seen them near the car.

Q. Okay. But, ah, did you see them get into a car?

A. I didn't see them get into it. I seen them around it.

Q. Okay.

A. I heard the door shut.

Q. So then did you hear the car leave?

A. Yes, they sped up, sped out of the parking lot.

Q. Okay. [REDACTED], that's all I have. Detective Traylor?

DET. TRAYLOR: I have nothing.

Q. Okay. [REDACTED], ah, that will conclude our, ah, interview for today. We appreciate your coming in. The time now is 2:46 p.m. on, ah, April 7th, 2000. Thanks very much.

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On March 31, 2000 at about 3:12 PM Detectives McLaughlin & Torres interviewed Ms [REDACTED] Address: [REDACTED] Apt. [REDACTED], (DOB [REDACTED]) Telephone # [REDACTED]. This interview was regarding the Inaam Yazbek homicide investigation and was conducted at the community room at Boston Police station District-14.

Ms [REDACTED] was told that we were aware of new information and would like to speak to her about the homicide that occurred at 89 Faneuil St..

Ms [REDACTED] stated that on Monday, March 27, 2000 she slept late and woke up in the late afternoon. Sometime later that afternoon at about 3:00 PM she went to the basketball court and smoked "weed" (Marijuana). She stated that she was by herself and the only people she saw there were little kids playing basketball. Because there was no one there she knew she went back home and telephoned her boyfriend.

Later that night she went out again, it was dark outside and she doesn't recall what time it was. She saw "[REDACTED]" out there and spent sometime with him in the play area. She said that she went back in the house at about 11:30 PM and her mother told her to come back in the house at 12:00 AM. She said that she went back outside and was with [REDACTED] in the play area, when her mother whistled and then yelled "it was 11:45 PM and to make sure she came inside at 12:00 AM". She said that her and [REDACTED] then left the play area and went across the street to the park and smoked some "weed". She stated that after sometime in the park her and [REDACTED] went back to his house and smoked some more "weed" and had sexual intercourse. She stated that she got home at about 2:30 AM and the only reason she knew the time was because the next day her mother had told her that she had come in at that time.

Ms [REDACTED] was asked if she had seen anyone or heard any gunshots during the time that she was in the play area. She stated that she had seen two people out that night. One was a man who was walking his dog and the other was a white male who walks "funny" and she did not hear any gunshots. She said that she did not see any people her age that night.

She was asked if she knew a female named [REDACTED]. She stated that [REDACTED] is younger than she is and she knew her from the [REDACTED] school. She stated that [REDACTED] is from Brighton and lives near the Oak square area. She stated that she did not see [REDACTED] or any females during that night.

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
