Take seat number two, THE COURT: please.

> Ladies and gentlemen, your jury has now been reconstituted, as we say, and that is going to require you to begin your deliberations anew. And that means that you have to start again as if you had never had discussions on Thursday. I know that you did not have much time on Thursday to begin your work, but you must start today as if you had not had those discussions.

Please continue to observe the instructions I've given you about the case, not discussing it, not going to see or revisiting any of the sites you saw on the view, and not consulting any outside source of whatever kind. It's very, very important
