Millicent Fawcett Suffragist

Dame Millicent Fawcett (11 June 1847 – 5 August 1929) was an English politician, writer and activist.

She campaigned for <u>women's suffrage</u> by <u>legal change</u>. She was a frequent public speaker on women's rights. Her tactical and determined leadership of the National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies (NUWSS) from 1897 made it a substantial and influential force in the campaign for women's votes.



The Dorset Mammal Group HEDGEHOG DOs and DONTs

The hedgehog is protected by the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 and is listed on Schedule 6 of that act, prohibiting the taking or killing of these animals. The animal is also protected by the Wild Mammals (Protection) Act 1996, which made it an offence to kick, mutilate, burn or otherwise cause deliberate cruelty to wild mammals. The hedgehog is declining in Britain at an alarming rate. In 2015 the People's Trust for Endangered Species published the report 'The State of Britain's Hedgehogs'. The findings of this report were based on results from four major surveys covering both rural and urban habitats. It concluded that between the years 2000 and 2015 the hedgehog population in Britain had declined by 50% in rural areas and by 30% in urban habitats. This represents a national emergency, which, we all need to do something about.








Community Energy




Community Fund

Current funding criteria:

- 1. The project must aim to reduce carbon emissions and/or address fuel poverty. Carbon reduction does not just relate to energy projects; it might also include local food, sustainable transport or waste reduction or indeed any activity that reduces carbon emissions.
- 2. The location of the project must be within the geographical area of the Dorset and BCP Councils.
- 3. The application must be on behalf of a community, self-help or voluntary group, a community enterprise or a charity.
