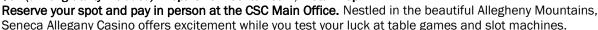

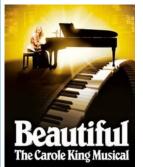

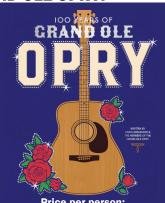

PROCEDURES & REMINDERS

KEY TAGS: Please stop in office to get your FREE key tag. All members will need to have one. Swipe your key tag at the kiosk in the main entrance foyer. This will replace paper sign in & out starting June 2. The key tag sign-in and sign-out process is important so we know who is in the building and what events you are participating in so we can give info to potential donors & assess what events/activities are popular.

REGISTERING FOR EVENTS: There are three ways to register or sign up for events:

- On line at myactivecenter.com. (Instructions below)
- By phone: 716-633-5138
- In person at Main Office

CREATING AN ACCOUNT ON MyActiveCenter:

Go to myactivecenter.com, click on Sign Up button and follow the directions. Your MySeniorCenter keytag is required to set up your account. Stop in the office to get your key tag (they are free). If you are unable to find your keytag or have questions, please call 716-633-5138. It is a requirement to get a key tag and use it to sign in when you are at the Center, but it is not a requirement to make an account on MyActiveCenter. It's just an option you can choose if you are interested in signing up for events/activities on your home computer, iPad or smartphone.

REMINDER: You can always register for an activity, event or meal **IN PERSON or ON THE PHONE**.

For those of you who want to sign up for events at home on your computer, iPad or smartphone on MyActiveCenter.com, please follow these instructions:

TO REGISTER FOR A CLASS, EVENT, MEAL OR PROGRAM ON MyActiveCenter.com:

- Sign in to myactivecenter.com
- Search box and filters are on the left side
- Once you have found the event you want to attend, click on the name of the event. This will open a more detailed view of the activity. The upcoming dates for the schedule will be listed below.
- To register for an event that you have chosen, click Add to Cart.
- A small box will appear to let you know that the event has been reserved in your cart
- If this is the only activity you want to register for, click Go to Cart button OR click on any area NOT in the pop-up box to continue looking for events.
- In order to complete the registration process you must finish your order by going to your Shopping Cart.
- Click Register for selected items

PAYMENTS TAKEN IN PERSON ONLY: We currently do not take payments on line. The wording in MyActiveCenter is "shopping" focused (Add to Cart, Payment, Receipt etc.), but we do not ask for any payment information. Online payment will be available in the future.

WHAT ACTIVITIES DO I NEED TO REGISTER FOR? Activity descriptions will mention if you need to sign up for events ahead of

time. If there is nothing noted about signing up ahead of time, you do not need to sign up - just show up for the event, although some activities do require a payment to the instructor when you arrive. Presign up and is required for lunch, dinner, trips, CSC Diners, University Express and any other events that indicate pre-sign up and may require pre-payment.

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE: Any current member can participate in CSC events. Please visit the office to register for a membership or to renew your membership. Residents 55 and up are welcome to join. Membership fee for Clarence residents is \$10 for the calendar year and \$15 for non-residents.

UNVERSITY EXPRESS & ERIE COUNTY MEALS: Any Erie County resident age 60 and up can attend a University Express event and/or an Erie County meal. Reservations are required by phone, in person or on line at myactivecenter.com.

AUDIT A CLASS: If you are uncertain about a particular class, we encourage you to observe the class as a guest before joining as a member. Please check in at the office.

PAYING FOR ACTIVITIES: Please pay your instructor on the day of the activity you are attending. If an activity such as a lunch or musical event needs to be paid for ahead of time, please visit us in person in the office. All trips and activities that require prior payment must be paid for in person in the office. No payments are taken on line. We accept cash or check. **Sign up and pay for all trips in person at the office.**

CHECKING IN: Members are asked to use their key tag to sign in at the kiosk in the main entrance foyer each time you enter the Center. This enables us to know who is in the building, and to track how many people are going to events.

CHECKING OUT: When you are done with your activity, please visit the kiosk and swipe your key tag once more to check out. The kiosk will beep and say "Thank You" on the right side of the screen and that means you have checked out for the day.

WHAT IF I COME BACK FOR AN ACTIVITY LATER IN THE DAY? If you know you are going to participate in multiple activities in a day, you can choose all those activities at your first sign in. If not, simply swipe in again to choose your activities when you arrive later in the day.

LUNCH & DINNER: To sign up for lunch and dinner, visit us in the office in person, call 716-633-5138 or sign up on MyActiveCenter.

LUNCH & DINNER FEE: Cost for lunches and dinners are a recommended donation of \$3.50 and are due when you get to the Dining Room check-in table near the kitchen. However, there are some meals where the cost is more and pre-payment is required (picnics, theme meals, special events, etc.). This is a meal that is not provided by Erie County. The fee for these meals is for the food and entertainment provided.

FROZEN MEAL PROGRAM: Stop in the office for a frozen meal menu and to sign up for delivery or pick up the Wednesday before the week you want the meals.

CANCEL IF YOU CAN'T MAKE IT: If you cannot make it to an activity, lunch or dinner, please contact the office. If you have signed up for an activity on MyActiveCenter you are able to log in to your account and cancel events you have signed up for, however, on the day of, you are unable to cancel on MyActiveCenter, so please call or stop in to see us to cancel a lunch or dinner on the day of.
