 - Included a comparison of the 2023 and 2024 Fisherees
- Old Business:
- Eurasian Watermilfoil (EWM): Brett Kaehne
- **Brett shared a slideshow** detailing the approach thus far and future possibilities for managing EWM on Roberts
- \bullet **Property owners surveys** sent out last fall we had just over 60% participation
 - 92% of respondents oppose the "Do Nothing" option
 - 74% of respondents support herbicide treatment

• Project Status:

- 2025 First time in history of the lake there's a Lake Management Plan (LMP) in place. This plan needs to be updated every 5 years.
- Roberts Lake Association (RLA) could have done nothing beyond hand harvesting and Diver Assisted Suction Harvesting (DASH) -- to manage EWM without a Lake Management Plan.

• Overview and history of EWM in Roberts Lake and beyond:

- EMW ebbs and flows year to year, never constant amount, spreads by fragmentation.
- EWM can be managed but can never be eradicated, once it's in the lake it's there to stay.
- A Point Intercept Survey has shown there's only one Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) in Roberts Lake EWM, the rest are native plant species.
- 2015 a small colony was seen by mapping and a survey on Roberts, rapid growth since then
 - RLA has spent \$10,000/year since 2015 on hand harvesting and DASH
- 2020 44 ½ cu feet extracted
- 2022 404.5 cu feet extracted
- 2024 survey showed 47.5 acres of EWM on Roberts (2024 saw an explosion of EWM in all WI lakes)
 - North Shore by the resort now well beyond hand harvesting and DASH
- What we can do this summer? don't start jet skis from shore through the milfoil. Watch your boat propellers going through the milfoil.
 - Can hand harvest around your own shoreline Don't dispose of EWM in the lake! That only increases the spread.

• Goals and Timeline:

 Goal: get EWM to a manageable level and eliminate negative impacts as much as possible. We can do nothing further without Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR) permits.

• Timeline:

• Fall 2023 - First of two possible grants: We submitted a management plan grant application to WDNR to draft the next grant application including goals, issues and a management plan

- March 2023 received \$10,000 grant from WDNR, the maximum allowable amount
- 2024 put aforementioned plan into action
 - Testing for water clarity, zebra mussel and water sampling
 - Worked with Todd Hanke at Onterra to investigate possible further actions and their implications
 - Cost in 2024: Total \$17,325, minus \$10,000 grant, left RLA paying \$7325 out of pocket
- **Spring 2025** EMW committee had 2 Zoom meetings with Todd Hanke of Onterra, and two WDNR representatives, Scott VanEgeren and Ty Krawejewski, and one face-to-face meeting.
- Possible Methods for EWM control:
 - Hand harvesting and DASH, have been tried for 10 years on Roberts
 - Milfoil weevil unproven and can't purchase weevils, must grow your own
 - Rusty crayfish illegal to introduce any invasive species to the lake
 - Mechanical harvesting limited in scope bandaid approach
 - Can cut lanes, especially on north shore
 - Lanes last for only for a few weeks and must be recut
 - Cost approximately \$2000 / day a two day job, must be done at least 2 times per summer for a total of \$8000
 - Cutting lanes from docks on Hamilton Drive would cost an additional \$8-10,000/year
 - Who decides which property owners get lanes cut?
 - Herbicide treatment 2 possible methods
 - Spot treatment
 - Whole lake treatment
- Herbicide treatment options, definition and application:
 - Whole lake treatment not recommended as necessary at this time
 - RLA doesn't have the money for it nevertheless
 - Spot treatment knock down the largest colony (North Shore)
 - One treatment with annual survey mapping to determine rebound
 - Hand harvesting and DASH to mitigate
 - Wouldn't treat with herbicide every year or even every other year

- Possible dissipation to surrounding colonies depending on factors like wind, etc.
- ProcellaCOR herbicide Brett had several copies of a fact sheet available
 - Approved by WDNR in 2019 (REPLACES 2, 4-D)
 - Safer for humans and aquatic fauna than 2, 4-D
 - WDNR found there is an impact to native plants to a low degree (especially coontail), practically non-toxic - no risk to human health, no drinking water or recreational use restrictions
 - Kills the entire EWM plant. 2 4 weeks for plant to die and decompose.
 - WDNR permit required, they're not in favor of a yearly application.
 - It was mentioned.
 - Brett Kaehne mentioned that it was brought to the EWM committee's attention, minutes before the association meeting, that Minnesota DNR has listed ProcellaCOR as a polyfluoroalkyl substance. Brett said he was not aware of that. He stated neither the WDNR nor the EPA has deemed ProcellaCOR as a polyfluoroalkyl substance.
- Next Steps
- Committee must finalize Lake Management Plan by end of July 2025.
 - We'll make the final plan available via email, Facebook and RLA website.
- Recommended process:
 - Year 1 one spot treatment late May or early June of Spring 2026, 23 acres
 @ \$44,000 plus fees for a total of \$66,000 (North Shore)
 - Year 2 spring and fall mapping to see if there had been dissipation affecting surrounding patches of EWM
 - Year 3 any new growth? DASH and hand harvesting if necessary
- Second of two possible grants, AIS control grant, application due September 15, 2025, which would be 75% state funding with a cap of \$66,000. We could get any part of that 75%, or none at all.
- We **may not** get grant funding, as it's a very competitive grant. We need to make a decision if we go forward with or without grant funding. We will vote at the fall membership meeting (August 30, 2025). Are we willing to fully fund if the state doesn't give us the grant?
- We recommend obtaining the permits necessary, doesn't mean we must use them.


Enhanced Wake Ordinance

- Tony Abitz explained the Wake Enhanced Ordinance passed by the Town of Freedom in Spring of 2025.
- He described the 2024-2025 process toward getting the ordinance passed.
- He pointed out the signage at the public boat landing and future signage at the resort landing.
- Tony recognized the help Last Wilderness Alliance of Presque Isle had given us and the Town on passage of the ordinance. A motion was made, seconded and passed by voice vote to donate \$400 to the Last Wilderness Alliance.
- If property owners see someone in violation of the ordinance they should video the boat and contact the Forest County Sheriff's Department Recreational Officer for enforcement.

• FCAL

- Lee Lamers displayed two monofilament line containers which will be located at each boat landing. These should be used to dispose of monofilament line.
- A motion was made, seconded and passed by voice vote to purchase a number of "Stop Aquatic Hitchhikers" pamphlets to distribute to new property owners.

• Fish Rehabilitation Project



- Mark Hauser read Gus Nordholm's report.
- •RLA planted 6500 walleye in 2024, Mole Lake planted 2966 for a total of 9466.
- •Average size 7.8"
- •Mole lake stocked some additional 13" walleyes last summer.
- •Muskies were also stocked in 2024.
- •A comprehensive survey was done in fall of 2024 walleyes, muskies and panfish.

•Loon Report:

- Jim Borsche reported 2 nesting pairs. The pair on Switzer's Point has not been seen this year.
- Jim also reported he is continuing to do the water quality testing
