A MESSAGE FROM YOUR CONFERENCE PLANNER, BARBARA TALLEY

I am so very excited about this last day of Kwanzaa. Four very special presentations will be given. We'll start with Ayo Handy-Kendi, the Breath Sekou, and founder of Optimum Life Breatholgy and Black Love Day, who specializes in African-centered culture and it's impact on mental health, stress, trauma and self-love. She also has discovered a process for healing addictions through breath work. Kaytura Felix will share some insights from her recent travels. Masud Olufani who recently returned from Africa as a full citizen of Sierra Leone, will share his experiences from his month long cultural pilgrimage that culminated in his dual citizenship and repatriation. CELEBRATED PRIMARILY IN THE UNITED STATES, EUROPE, AND THE CARIBBEAN – BASED ON THE AFRICAN TRADITION OF CELEBRATING THE FIRST FRUITS OF THE HARVEST. IT WAS CONCEIVED AND DEVELOPED BY DR. MAULANA RON KARENGA IN 1966 TO CELEBRATE THE BOND BETWEEN THE ANCIENT ROOTS OF AFRICAN PEOPLE AND HER DESCENDANTS THROUGHOUT THE WORLD.

SINCE ITS BEGINNINGS IN THE PAN-AFRICANIST MOVEMENT OF THE 1960S, KWANZAA HAS GROWN TO INCLUDE AFRICAN-AMERICANS, AFRICANS, AND THOSE FROM MULTIPLE CULTURAL AND RELIGIOUS TRADITIONS WHO JOIN IN THE CELEBRATION.
