7 8 9 10 11 12 13 14 15 16 17	The National Spiritual Assembly has, over the course of nearly a year, observed with great pride and happiness your devoted efforts to advance the aims of the Nine Year Plan , the latest stage of 'Abdu'l- Bahá's Divine Plan for the spiritual regeneration of human civilization. In so doing, you are working shoulder to shoulder with your fellow believers in every part of the world. While each national community is advancing within a specific cultural context, all are striving to create communities that stand in stark contrast to <u>a world that is riven with prejudice, divisiveness, and injustice</u> . The patterns of life resulting from these efforts will stand together as a beacon of hope, guiding the way forward at a time of <u>increasing distress and despair</u> .
18 19 20	unite our approach, and channel our efforts along the most productive lines. Indeed, one is astonished at the clarity, potency, and breadth of its loving guidance to the friends everywhere. One recent example is its letter of November 1, 2022 to believers in the Democratic Republic of the Congo, in which
	the House of Justice addresses themes that are as relevant to us as to our precious brothers and

25	• <i>a succinct but profound perspective on this moment in history,</i>
26 27	 its fundamental challenges, and our proper response as Bahá'ís.

29 30 31	We eagerly commend the entire letter to your study, a copy of which is attached for your convenience, and hope that the following extracts will encourage your own exploration of this weighty message.
32 33	In its opening paragraph, the Supreme Body
33	• acknowledges the possibilities for teaching that exist within the country,
34 35	 the seriousness of ongoing conflicts, and the consequent challenge facing the friends:
36	• und the consequent chuttenge jucing the friends.
37 38 39 40	Your country is blessed with remarkable ethnic and cultural diversity. How happy we have been over the years to witness the receptivity of its peoples to the Teachings of Bahá'u'lláh. Yet, alas, your nation has time and again suffered from conflict among some of its peoples.
41 42 43 44	As a part of Congolese society, you are, of course, not immune to the forces that generate and drive conflict.
45	What this demands is vigilance by all the believers in ensuring that divisions,
46	especially those related to ethnicity, do not take root in your community. Such
47 48 49	divisions can impede your efforts to develop your community and to foster the spiritual and material progress of your nation.
50	Your duty as Bahá'ís is
51 52 53 54 55	 to act as true champions of the oneness of humankind, and to promote unity in your communities and in the life of your nation.
53 54	It is about this <mark>vital duty</mark> that we wish to address you.
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57 Further on, the House of Justice 58 1. *situates current challenges* in the context of history, and 59 *describes what will be required* for humanity to advance from its present stage of development to 2. 60 the next: 61 62 Bahá'u'lláh has appeared to humanity in this period of its adolescence, when it is in 63 need of maturation. As you are well aware, He has provided the means for establishing 64 the unity of humankind, the hallmark of a mature world. 65 66 What will bind the hearts of all people together is the power of the Word of God. 67 That Word has generative power which in every age has provided the means for 68 refining human character and reordering human affairs. The mission of the Bahá'ís is to 69 learn to apply the Revelation of Bahá'u'lláh in their individual and collective lives and 70 in the life of their society. 71 72 Through well-ordered efforts and in collaboration with many others who are 73 dedicated to bettering the world, Bahá'ís 74 bring the principles suited to humanity's age of maturity to bear on the conditions of 75 the world's peoples. They 76 strive for the transformation of the inner and outer realities of human life, and 77 • for the cultivation of spiritual and social conditions that will give rise to a new kind of 78 *people* and a new society founded on unity. 79 80 The Supreme Body then addresses two of the major obstacles to human prosperity: 81 "the distortion of human identity" and 1. 82 "the spread of prejudice." 2. 83 84 In essence, it is humanity's failure to understand our own true nature and essential unity that is 85 the source of the misery and injustices we suffer. The result of this is rampant prejudice, thus 86 perverting our private lives, our relationships with others, our communities, and our civil 87 **institutions.** There is, as well, a view of human nature that does not take into account the spiritual 88 resources available to us to effect lasting change, resulting in modes of language and action that 89 are doomed to failure. 90 91 By contrast, the Bahá'ís are challenged to undertake "efforts in the fields of 92 1. community building, 93 2. *social action*, and 94 3. *public discourse* [that] represent ways of awakening the energies latent in the human soul 95 and channelling them towards the betterment of society." 96 97 The message continues: 98 99 Whether large or small, your community-building efforts are directed at raising the 100 nucleus and pattern of a new World Order by establishing the kind of relationships 101 called for by Bahá'u'lláh. And emerging among all who are labouring together is 102 • a language that elevates all and maligns none, 103 a language with the potency to bind hearts with the indissoluble bond of love 104 and the power to unite minds in common pursuit of a society that can truly be as a 105 garden bursting with flowers of every form, every colour, every fragrance. 106 It is in all these ways that you are creating new communities that can serve as a model 107 and relationships that enable you to act as leaven in the life of your nation. 108 109 And finally, the House of Justice issues a special challenge to the rising generation of believers:

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111	In closing, we now address the youth:	
112	1. The future is in your hands.	
113	2. Make no mistake, you are raising an edifice that will be a haven for your	
114	peoples u pon the foundations your mothers and your fathers have laid.	
115	3. Continued progress will depend	
116	a. on your dedication to building true unity and	
117	b. on the extent to which you strengthen your practice of those spiritual	
118	disciplines enjoined by Bahá'u'lláh that help you polish the mirrors of	
119	your hearts to reflect the attributes of God.	
120	4. We hope that you will foster among yourselves enduring spiritual bonds that	
121	resist the forces of prejudice.	
122	5. Let the example of 'Abdu'l-Bahá be your guide –	
123	a. how He <i>lived</i> His life as a <i>daily sacrifice</i> to the cause of the oneness of	
124	humanity,	
125	b. how He <i>embraced with selfless love all people who</i> crossed His path,	
126	c. how He saw reflected in each soul the image of a loving God.	
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128	So, too, are you to see all your compatriots.	
129		
130	We hope that you will take time to study this significant letter in depth, and that you will derive from i	
131	increased resolve as you continue your steadfast labors in the path of service. Be assured of our ardent	
132	prayers for your confirmation and well-being.
