## **ONE-POT ENCHILADA PASTA**

- 4 cups uncooked mini penne or other small pasta
- 4 cups vegetable broth or water
- 1 can (15 ounces) black beans, rinsed and drained
- 1 can (14-1/2 ounces) diced tomatoes, undrained
- 1 medium sweet yellow pepper, chopped
- 1 medium sweet red pepper, chopped
- 1 cup fresh or frozen corn, thawed
- 1 can (10 ounces) enchilada sauce
- 2 tablespoons taco seasoning
- 1/2 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- Optional: Fresh cilantro leaves, cherry tomatoes and lime wedges

### **DIRECTIONS:**

1. In a Dutch oven or large skillet, combine the first 9 ingredients. Bring to a boil; reduce heat. Simmer, uncovered, until pasta is al dente and sauce has thickened slightly, 12-15 minutes. Add cheese; stir until melted. Serve with desired toppings.



Ironically, in many ways, Walden today is even more natural than when Thoreau lived there. Thoreau chose Walden for his solitary retreat because it was a quiet, wooded spot within walking distance of his Concord, Massachusetts, home and because the land was owned by his dear friend Ralph Waldo Emerson. Thoreau found the inspiration he sought at Walden; but in addition to the birds and animals, he also shared the woods with railroad workers laying tracks to connect Concord to Boston, with ice cutters carving great chunks from the frozen pond for shipment to India, and with woodsmen thinning the forest to build homes and fuel fires. Today, even though suburban development squeezes in all around, Walden pond and its more than three hundred acres of woods are a protected sanctuary. The forests are thick again; and although Walden is a public state park today—a place for swimming, hiking, canoeing, and picnicking—access is controlled and limited. On a cloudless, but very cold, early morning in November, I found myself all but alone at Thoreau's pond.

A replica of the rustic cabin Thoreau built stands just yards away from the public parking area. Inside are representatives of his crude furnishings: a bed, a desk, a chair, and a woodstove. The true site of the cabin lies a half-mile down a well-worn path through bare-limbed trees. The outline of the cabin's foundation lies near a pile of stones—a cairn begun by admirers of Thoreau's work in the years after his death. For more than one hundred years, visitors have laid stones on the pile in memory of Thoreau; each stone represents a life touched in some way by the words written on this very spot. I placed my own stone on the pile and stood back to reflect on Thoreau's oft-quoted words:

*“I went to the woods because I wished to live deliberately, to front out the essential facts of life and see if I could learn what it had to teach and not, when I came to die, discover that I had not lived.”*

Later, standing on the edge of the pond's icy waters, I was struck by the beauty of the spot. To the left rose Emerson Cliff, named for Thoreau's friend and mentor. The pond itself was quiet and still; the summer swimmers and boaters long gone and the water losing its battle with the coming winter and the spreading ice. All around, the banks rose up from the water's edge, creating a kind of natural amphitheater. It was cold and quiet and beautiful. I felt in harmony with nature. I felt close to Henry David Thoreau.

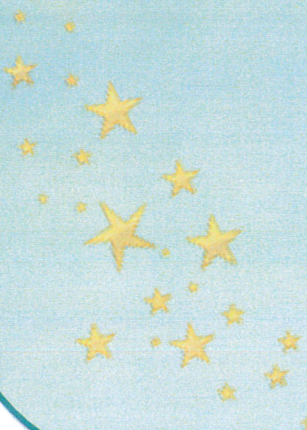

We are continuing to get to know our valued residents. This month we learn about Duke and Sally Cutshaw Apt. 339.

## **Duke and Sally's Story**

Duke and I were both born in Kalamazoo at Borgess Hospital. He was raised on the East side and I in Westwood. My first years of school were in a three room schoolhouse, Alamo Avenue School. When Westwood school was complete, I was part of the first classes there. Duke went to Woodrow Wilson, then onto Roosevelt Junior High. We both went to Kalamazoo Central. After Duke graduated he went to KVCC, U of M for Fire Science classes, National Fire Academy for Training. Periodically, he attended many classes to further his education in firefighter science.

I got into the dental field after high school because I was lucky to babysit our neighbor's boys whose father happened to be a dentist, Dr. Purdy. I worked for several great dentists in Kalamazoo.

Duke and I were both busy raising our families with our former spouses. After our marriages failed we started our lives together.

Our life together started in 1991, after a previous life. Duke has two children; Cathy and Steve in Toledo, and son Jeff and Annalisa in Caledonia, Michigan. And two grandchildren. I have three boys, Mike and Cara, Scott and Jeff.

When we married, Duke was a sergeant with the City of Kalamazoo Department of Public Safety, Training Division, and at the same time was a paid on-call assistant chief at Eastwood Fire Station in Kalamazoo Township. I was a Dental Assistant not nearly as exciting or dangerous but I loved seeing patients every day.

When Duke retired from Kalamazoo Public Safety he accepted an appointment with Kalamazoo Township as Deputy Chief at the Eastwood Fire Station, which included a residence attached to the station. We moved in and it soon became evident that I was not going to be able to continue as a Dental Assistant after being up several times a night for rescues and →

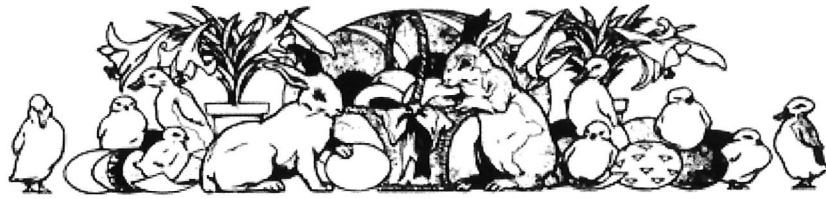

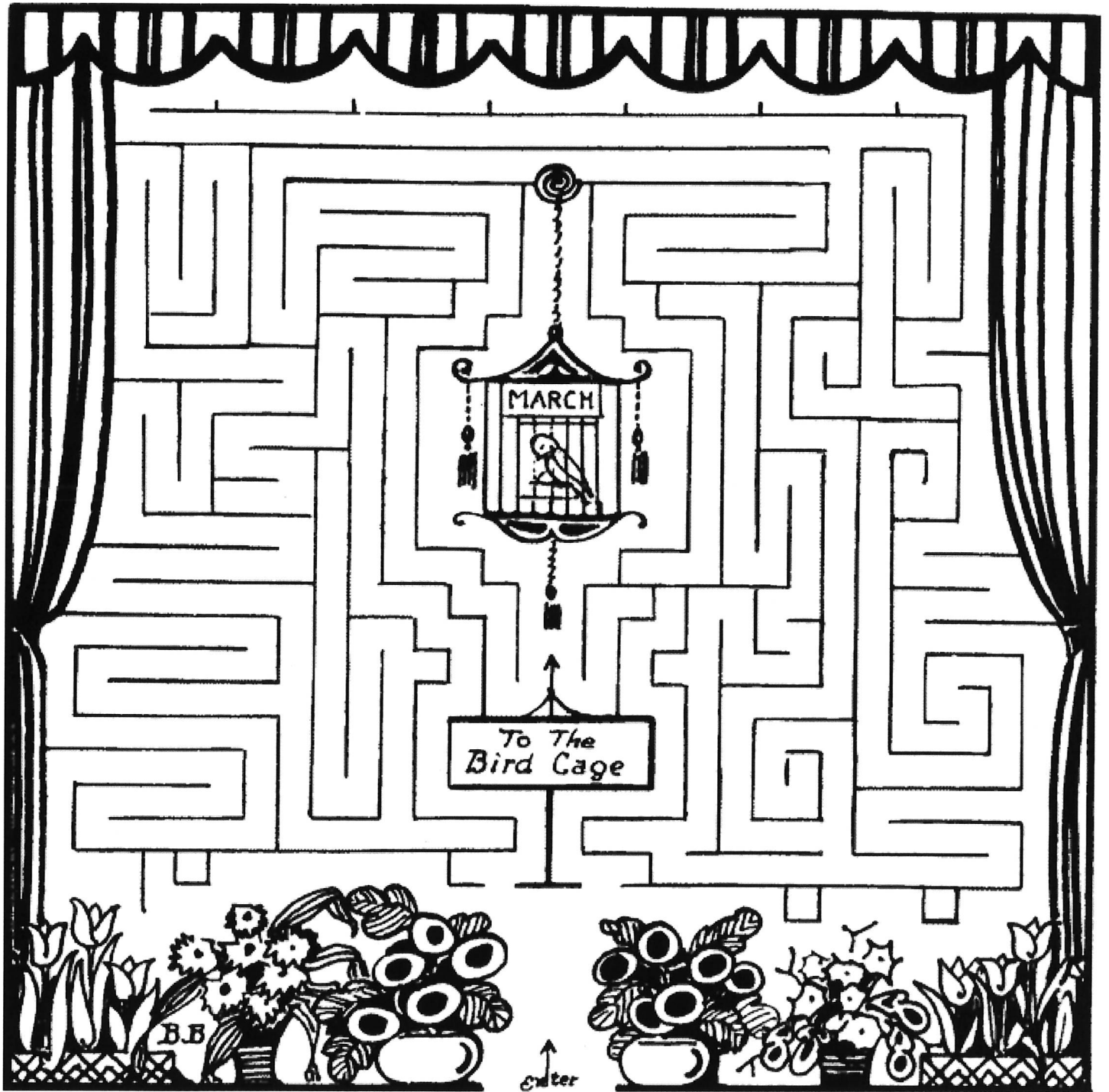
