



CHICKEN SPAGHETTI

- 1 lb. spaghetti
- 1 tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil
- 1 onion, chopped
- 1 red bell pepper, chopped
- 1 lb. boneless skinless chicken breasts, cut into 1" pieces
- Kosher salt
- Freshly ground black pepper
- 1/2 tsp. chili powder

- 3 tbsp. butter
- 3 tbsp. all-purpose flour
- 2 c. whole milk
- 1 c. low-sodium chicken broth
- 2 1/2 c. shredded cheddar, divided
- Freshly chopped parsley, for garnish

DIRECTIONS:



Preheat oven to 350°. In a large pot of salted boiling water, cook spaghetti according to package directions until al dente, about 7 minutes.

In a large skillet over medium heat, heat oil. Add onion and bell pepper and cook until soft, 5 minutes. Transfer to a plate.

Add chicken go skillet and season with salt, pepper, and chili powder. Cook until chicken is golden, about 5 minutes. Transfer to a plate.

Melt butter in skillet over medium heat. Whisk in flour and cook 1 minute. Add milk and broth and cook until thick, about 3 minutes. Stir in spaghetti, 11/2 cups cheddar, peppers and onions, and chicken. Transfer to a baking dish and top with remaining cup cheese. Bake until bubbly, about 45 minutes.



I was born in Lansing, Michigan in 1947, the 3rd of 5 children. We moved to Gobles, Michigan when I was 2. I attended the 7th Day Adventist Junior Academy until I was 15. Then I developed hepatitis and had to quit school. We moved to Kalamazoo and I started working at Verdries Nursing Home.

I worked at Verdries Nursing Home for 10 years. Then I worked at Birch Manor for 10 years. Then I worked at Verdries again on the 3rd shift, but I am not a night person!

I met Bob at a bowling alley in 1975. Our first date was at Demitri's Restaurant. I attended adult education and finished high school. We married on February 29, 1976. (He said he had to buy anniversary presents only every 4 years!) Bob had 4 daughters when we married. 2 lived with Bob and me, and 2 lived in California. His second daughter had 2 young children. At a later time, they came to live with us.

I worked as a home health aide for 37 years with Visiting Nurses.

Sometimes with hospice care. I found the work very rewarding and continue to work part time at Hope Woods and elsewhere. I feel very fortunate to be able to help those who need it. During this time, I had breast cancer, I but am a survivor.


