#### TO SMILE OR NOT TO SMILE?


Are women more interested in a man that smiles?

#### INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND


- We asked Ai to generate pictures of 9 different men grouped into 3 levels of attractiveness (high, medium, low) and then within each group we have the same Ai generated man smile and not smile.
- We then showed over 3,000 people across the US the pictures. Each person saw a total of 6 pictures.
- The people were asked 2 questions:
  - How attractive they think the person is on a scale of I-20 (I being not attractive and 20 being very attractive)
  - On a scale of 1-20 (I being un-interested and 20 being very interested), how much do they think a women would be interested in that man.
- We then grouped the results into gender, sexuality and rating which we will go into more detail later.








Percentage of straight men and women who rated medium attractive men between 6 and 15










When it comes to straight women, they tended to give higher ratings to men that did not smile in pictures regardless of attractiveness; while men thought that more attractive people should smile, and less attractive people should not.

Men thought that women would be interested in men that did not smile in picture regardless of attractiveness; while women thought that women would be interested in very attractive men that did not smile and less attractive men that smiled





### BOTH GAY MEN AND WOMEN SHOWED PREFERENCE TO THE SMILING "LOW-ATTRACTIVE" MEN









This was consistent for both rating and interest








### BOTH BISEXUAL MEN AND WOMEN THOUGHT WOMEN WOULD BE INTERESTED IN THE NON-SMILING MEN



### MORE BISEXUAL MALES THOUGHT WOMEN WOULD BE INTERESTED IN THE SMILING MAN WHILE SLIGHTLY MORE BISEXUAL FEMALES THOUGHT WOMEN WOULD BE INTERESTED IN THE NON-SMILING MEN



### CONVERSELY, BISEXUAL MEN THOUGHT WOMEN WOULD BE INTERESTED IN THE NON-SMILING MEN WHILE BISEXUAL WOMEN THOUGHT THAT THE SMILING MEN WOULD INTEREST WOMEN MORE



#### **KEY TAKEAWAYS**

Bisexual women showed different responses across the attractiveness levels Preference to nonsmiling when it Preference to smiling comes to high when it comes to low attractive men attractive men Indifference when it came to medium attractive men

Bisexual men showed contradiction in what they rated and what they thought women would prefer

This applied to the high and medium attractiveness but did not for the low attractiveness

#### **KEY TAKEAWAYS**

- Overall, both men and women thought that women would be more interested in the men that did not smile in pictures regardless of level of attractiveness of the men in the pictures.
- Overall, more women rated men that did not smile in pictures while more men rated men that smiled in pictures.
