WHO WE ARE

The Center for Organ Recovery & Education (CORE) is one of 57 federally designated not-for-profit organ procurement organizations (OPOs) in the United States, serving more than five million people in western Pennsylvania, West Virginia and Chemung County, New York.

CORE partners with the staff from more than 150 hospitals and health care facilities, as well as medical examiners and corneal transplant surgeons, to offer hope and a second chance at life to the thousands of people who are waiting nationwide for life-saving organ, healing tissue and sight-restoring corneal transplants.

CORE's Eye Bank Association of America (EBAA)-accredited eye bank provides donor eye tissue for vision-saving corneal transplants, medical education and research.

CORE is one of only four OPOs nationwide that is structured as a "complete OPO," meaning our facilities include an on-site eye bank at our Pittsburgh headquarters. CORE's campus also includes the state-of-the-art Broznick Surgical Pavilion, which features three operating rooms and two ICUs, allowing organ, tissue and cornea recovery to occur on-site. Having the eye bank and surgical recovery suites in one location means CORE is able to better medically manage each donor before recovery, and that donor eye tissue recoveries are performed under optimal conditions and by highly skilled staff. The result is a more efficient and, ultimately, more successful transplantation process.

In 2019, CORE won the Malcolm Baldrige National Quality Award, a Presidential-level honor recognizing organizations with an unceasing drive for innovative solutions to complex challenges, visionary leadership and operational excellence. Only of one of only five Pennsylvania organizations ever to achieve the Baldrige Award in its more than 30-year history, this award was the result of a near decade-long performance excellence journey — a journey that focused on the satisfaction of corneal transplant surgeons as a key group.

EBAA ACCREDITATION

EBAA Accreditation is the gold standard for eye banking. EBAA Accreditation is the only corneal tissue program recognized by the FDA and CDC, and EBAA medical standards are endorsed by the American Academy of Ophthalmology. It is the most thorough and comprehensive eye banking accreditations in the field. This distinction confirms that the CORE Eye Bank is of the highest quality and ensures the best patient outcomes. Continually accredited since our founding in 1977, CORE is certified through 2023.

To achieve this designation, CORE must meet strict criteria regarding:

- · Staff qualifications and training
- Serology, infection disease testing and sterilization
- · Processing and storage equipment
- Quality assurance procedures
- Tissue distribution records
- · Handing and preparation processes

HOW IS TISSUE REQUESTED?

HOW LONG BEFORE SURGERY SHOULD TISSUE BE REQUESTED?

Although we always appreciate as much advanced notice as possible, the CORE Eye Bank is able to provide tissue for emergency surgeries with less than 24 hours' notice.

IS THERE ADEQUATE TISSUE TO MEET ALL REQUESTS?

Yes. The CORE Eye Bank can always meet tissue needs. If we don't have tissue available, our long-standing relationships with partnering eye banks allow us to import tissue should it be necessary.

CAN TISSUE BE CUSTOMIZED?

Yes. The CORE Eye Bank has the extensive knowledge and expertise to customize your tissue requests. We offer DSEK and DMEK processing options, with special requests for ultra-thin DSEK grafts, pre-punch/pre-load DMEK grafts and customized corneal markings. Surgeons can also make special requests for cell counts and preservation times.

WHAT IF A CASE IS CANCELLED AFTER TISSUE HAS ALREADY BEEN REQUESTED?

Simply, call the CORE Eye Bank at (412) 963-3550 to cancel an order. In cases where the tissue has already been delivered, the CORE Eye Bank will come to collect the unused tissue. There will be no charge in these cases.

WHAT ONBOARDING AND EDUCATION PROGRAMS ARE OFFERED?

The CORE Eye Bank staff are more than happy to assist new surgeons with setting up their new corneal surgical practice, or educating current corneal surgeons with our tissue and processing. We can set up operating room time at a local hospital or surgical center to educate the surgeons and their staff on what to expect from our Eye Bank. We can also provide on-site education in one of our state-of-the-art OR's at CORE. We also have educational opportunities for ophthalmic residents and fellows just beginning their surgical journeys. We provide no-cost practice tissue if a practice is looking to offer a new procedure to patients.

HOW ARE PAYMENTS HANDLED?

The CORE Eye Bank Finance Department will invoice each office after the delivery of any corneal tissue. If there are questions about a payment, please call (412) 963-3550.
