2019 Committee Events

Recycle

Lake facts

Here are a few miscellaneous facts about covenants and assessments:

- 400 lots that have covenants signed (57 more than a year ago)
- 28 lots paid assessment this year that didn't pay the year before
- 70 lots have been sent to collections.
- Several members are paying back due assessments, the following are the years they have paid back assessments off: 2013 73 lots paid, 2014 92 lots paid, 2015 84 lots paid, 2016 45 lots paid, 2017 101 lots paid.



Assessments for 2019

Assessments are for the membership year January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2019. If you have not paid your assessments yet, they need to be paid by February 28 to avoid a 10% penalty. To remain a member in good standing, have use of the lake facilities and to be eligible to vote, you must have assessments paid by May 31st. Just a reminder the Assessment on the 1st lot was raised to \$130, additional lots will remain at \$50. The Special Assessments are now \$25 per lot. Commercial assessment has been increased to \$400 per year. We do not accept credit cards, but you can have your credit card company issue a check to us if you wish to pursue that route.

Payment Plans

If you would like to pay the assessments in installments, you can set up a payment plan. As long as you make your monthly payments, you will be considered a member in good standing. If you set up the payment plan to be completed by May 31, 2019, you will be able to vote for board directors. Otherwise payments need to be completed no later than December 31. If you owe back due assessment and cannot pay it off by the end of the year, you have two options. You can contact the office to come up with a plan to get it paid off or you can sign a covenant to have back due assessments forgiven and only owe the current year assessment.

Willing to Run

If you are a currently a member in good standing, you will have a willing to run form included with your newsletter. To be eligible to run for a Director, seat you must have your dues paid by May 31, sign a covenant on each property you own and not be in violation of bylaws. This year, there will be 5 Director seats on the ballot. Each unit has 1 seat (2 year term) and an at-large seat (3 year term), will be on the ballot.
