Here's what you need to know (and please go over this with your student participants):

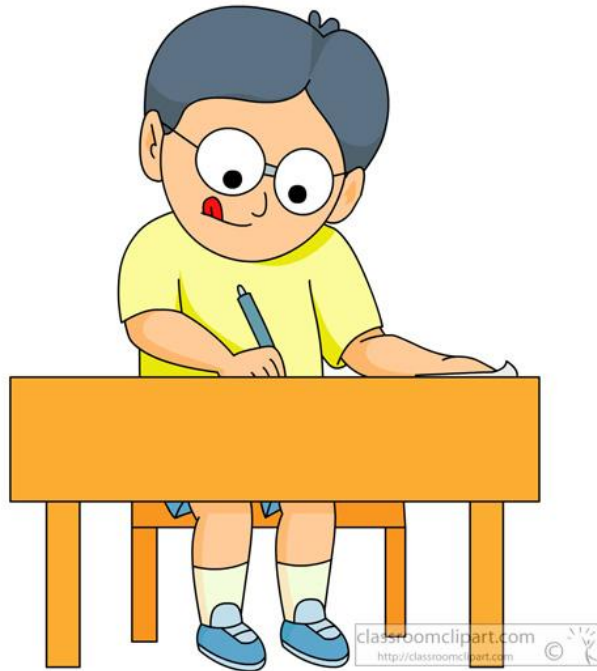
- Doors open promptly at 7 p.m.
- Young men should wear a suit and tie. Tuxedo's are also acceptable.
- Young ladies should be in formal attire.
- The theme of the prom is *A Masquerade Ball*.
- We will serve hot dogs, popcorn, and water, included in the cost of admission. The students may buy sodas as we will have them available for purchase.
- Students must stay inside the venue. If students want to get some fresh air, we will allow two students outdoors at one time for a maximum of 10 minutes, and they must stay within the parameters of the venue.
- Students will not be allowed to sit in their cars with other students. Of course, students may go to their cars when they are leaving.
- Students may leave at any hour they want. Once students leave the premises, they will not be allowed back into the venue.
- Doors close promptly at 11 p.m.
- If you are planning on dropping your student off and picking them up, please don't keep them waiting. After 11 p.m., they will not be under our supervision.

Turning in Final Checksheets



We've done this a few times, and we know how it goes if we say nothing. So, we're aiming to make the end of the 2024 school year go as smoothly as possible, and we want you to know ahead of time what that will involve so you are prepared.

Sometimes, kids get behind on their assignments, and parents who want to avoid having their student do any amount of summer school attempt to push them through more than one checksheet before the last day of the 2024 school year: May 23. This usually goes regretfully wrong. Rushed students do not normally produce quality work, and they often wind up failing several subjects or, worse, the school year.

Here's what you need to know:

- Summer school is required for any student who has missed more than ten (10) days of school during one semester. This is not a new rule, and actually, it isn't even solely *our* rule. It is the *state's* requirement of days spent in actual study. Failure to adhere to this requirements affects all manner of things: credits, ability to receive social security benefits, ability to acquire of verification of enrollment for driver's ed, ability to get into college.
- Students who have not completed the work for their grade levels and are in grades Kindergarten to 12th must attend summer school.
- All assignments for checksheets #1 to #9 on any grade level must be *completed in full and turned in by May 23*. There are no exceptions. This applies to on-campus, hybrid, and Remote Study students.

Pre-Enrollment Deadline Approaches



Deadline: April 15

If you haven't done so already, please use the link below to *[Pre-Enroll Your Student today](#)* if he or she is returning for the 2025 school year.

Pre-enrollment not only secures your child's seat for the coming year but also saves you money. Tuition fees are scheduled to increase in 2025, but we want to give you the opportunity to keep yours at the current rate.

Once pre-enrollment concludes on April 15, NHHSA opens enrollment to other students who are not currently enrolled. So, consider this your "heads-up!"

Click the link below to complete the Pre-Enrollment Form. The NHHSA Finance Dept. will then forward you an invoice for the \$100.00/per student pre-enrollment fee. The invoice must be paid by April 15 to avoid tuition increases.

We appreciate your confidence and trust and look forward to having you on board again

next year.

Pre-enrollment requires that your student activate the enrollment by attending classes or by picking up study materials if your child is a hybrid student within the first week of the 2024-2025 school year. The new school year begins August 1, 2024. Students who do not activate their enrollment within this time period will lose their seats. Please keep this in mind. Enrollment fees are not refundable.
