We will hear about the Heroes in Transition organization, a non-profit co-founded by Cyndy Jones, in memory of her son, Captain Eric Jones. Eric was a Marine who earned his Naval Aviator wings in April 2007, was deployed to Iraq in 2008-9 and flew multiple combat missions in Afghanistan where he was killed in October 2009. Cyndy will talk about how Heroes in Transition provides aid in four key areas: transitional support groups for veterans/active duty, couples, families, and spouses; financial assistance for those in need; home modifications and service dogs for veterans.
