This tool called "Hustle" allows our Faculty Association to send out text messages from a virtual number. It is a two-way communication tool that you can reply to at any time. Please note that it does not go directly to my phone, but is checked regularly. We hope to use this to send out important reminders, get member opinions on issues, and improve the speed at which information can flow out and back to the Faculty Association leadership.

If you received a text message from (708)593-5748, that was not a scam- it was me from the HUSTLE virtual number! You cannot call that number but can text it. If you ever need to call, feel free to call the Faculty Association Office at (708)333-5522.

Here is the first message sent out on 10/7:

"Hi, <member name> This is Mark Danielson (Faculty Association of D205 President). I'm using a texting app to reach members with important union updates/info. Please note, this is not my personal cell so it is not always monitored. You can save this # as Faculty Association of D205. Can you reply back with an emoji so I know you received this? stop 2quit"

If you did not receive this text message on 10/7, be sure to email me to let me know you'd like to start receiving them. There are about 125 members that did not receive a message for one of two reasons: they opted out of IEA texts at some point (possibly by accident) or they do not have a cell phone on their IEA profile. I can assist in opting you back in. It's a great tool for us and for you to get information!
