Proposed Bylaws Changes

Proposed changes to our Faculty Association Bylaws have been posted on the Faculty Association website. Go to https://d205fa.org/contract-%26-bylaws to view the changes that will be voted upon by the Representative Council on 5/14/25. Speak to your Department Reps if you have any questions or concerns. The changes were proposed by our Bylaws committee to align with model IEA language. Highlights include:

- Allowing for the possibility of electronic voting as determined by the Elections Committee
- Cleanup language (grammar errors)
- Language requiring that the Representative Council and the Executive Board shall contain ethnic minority representation at least proportionate to the local association's ethnic-minority membership
