Grade Breakdowns

Grades K–2

- Tuesdays & Fridays Attend School, 9:30 AM–3:30 PM
- Mondays & Wednesdays, Work at Home on teacher prepared assignments/lessons
- Parents are required to purchase some curriculum for the at home days.

Grades 3–6

- Monday–Thursday, 9:30 AM–3:30 PM.
- No homework; all work completed at school.
- Optional Fridays, 9am to 3:30pm students can work in the classroom independently or take Discovery Day classes

Grades 7–12

- Monday–Thursday, 8:30 AM–3:30 PM.
- No homework; all work completed at school.
- Optional Fridays, 9am to 3:30pm students can work in the classroom independently

*To successfully run these groups, there must be at least 3 students registered.

Our flexible schedule and no-homework structure are designed to protect family time and provide time for students to enjoy after-school activities.

Before & After Care

- Before Care: 7:00–9:00 AM
- After Care: 3:45–5:00 PM
- Rate: \$25 per day (no hourly rate available)

Parents may drop students off up to 15 minutes before start time and must pick them up within 15 Arrivals or departures outside those windows are billed as Before/After Care.

School Lunch

- Optional School Provided Lunch
- \$400 per student per school year/\$150 for 1 day a week
- \$5 per student per day if needed occasionally
