YOUTH

Drug prevention programs, education and awareness campaigns to reduce substance use/misuse consequences.



ADULTS

Education and awareness to reduce DUIs, opioid overdoses, and drug-related health consequences.

The Monroe County Coalition (MCC) is dedicated to educating our community on important health topics. Our educational pamphlets cover a wide range of topics including alcohol misuse, vaping, and drug use. We also offer pamphlets such as "Let's Talk About Cirrhosis," "Save a Life Carry Naloxone," and "No One's House is a Safe Place for Teen Drinking." Our 360 Virtual Directory is another great resource for those seeking information.



In addition to these resources, we also provide information on SAMHSA's Talk They Hear You parent campaign, which encourages communication between parents and teens. We also offer a unique virtual platform called Hidden in Plain Sight, which encourages parents to search for and locate items sold online as "Diversion Safes" that some teens may be using as stash places for alcohol and/or drugs.



Our brochures are widely distributed throughout the community, including doctor's offices, dentists, law firms, schools, government offices, libraries, and community-level events. We are committed to providing our community with the knowledge and resources needed to make informed decisions about their health and wellness.



VAPE PREVENTION

This brochure explains that vaping is often seen as socially acceptable among youth, leading to increased peer pressure. E-cigarettes expose young people to harmful substances and negatively affect brain development.

Our coalition actively distributes these materials at schools, community events, and healthcare facilities to ensure families have access to accurate, up-to-date information about the risks of vaping.



“TALK. THEY HEAR YOU.” UNDERAGE DRINKING CAMPAIGN

This brochure encourages parents to have open, honest conversations with their teens about alcohol and drug use. It emphasizes that parents are a major influence and that ongoing, judgment-free communication leads to better outcomes.

Research shows that teens who have regular conversations with their parents about substance use are significantly less likely to engage in risky behaviors. Starting early and staying consistent makes a difference.

Opioid Prevention

This brochure highlights naloxone (Narcan) as a life-saving medication that can reverse opioid overdoses. It explains how to recognize overdose signs, respond quickly, and emphasizes community resources and legal protections.

Through partnerships with local pharmacies and first responders, we ensure naloxone is accessible and that community members feel confident using it in emergency situations.

MATERIALS DISSEMINATED

This brochure focuses on preventing underage drinking by explaining the serious risks alcohol poses to teens, including brain development issues, poor decision-making, and increased chances of accidents, violence, and long-term addiction. It also encourages parents to take an active role by securing alcohol at home, communicating clear expectations, and staying involved in their teen’s activities to help prevent alcohol use.



I STEER CLEAR

733 Adults & 70 Youth Reached

"I STEER CLEAR", is a research-based social norms campaign to reduce the number of drivers who drive while under the influence. Many substances can impair driving including alcohol, marijuana, some over-the-counter drugs, prescription and illegal drugs.

This brochure promotes the Monroe County Coalition’s virtual 360° service directory, which allows users to explore local behavioral health services and facilities throughout the Florida Keys. It also highlights available prevention programs, parent and opioid resources, and community services aimed at reducing substance abuse and supporting a safe, drug-free community.





RESPONSIBLE VENDOR TRAINING

By meeting Florida Responsible Vendor Training requirements, the business ensures that its staff is thoroughly trained to implement safe serving practices.

Responsible Vendor Training (RVT) provides local alcohol licensed vendors and their sellers and servers with training that meets requirements of Florida States. In an industry with a relatively high degree of turnover, RVT can provide sellers and servers with information they need to protect themselves, their business, and the community. MCC trained **68** participants in the Monroe County area.



WE I.D. SIGNAGE & CHECKING GUIDE

Monroe County Coalition provides legal age signage to local alcohol vendors supporting safe serving practices. Signs are a deterrent to underage youth who may attempt to purchase alcohol at the establishment.

580 WE I.D. Signs were provided to alcohol establishment and I.D. checking guides were disseminated to **27** businesses who completed MCC's Responsible Vendor Training.



We I.D. Guides include the latest I.D.'s from all US states as a tool for sellers and servers. MCC distributed **91** Guides to local businesses.



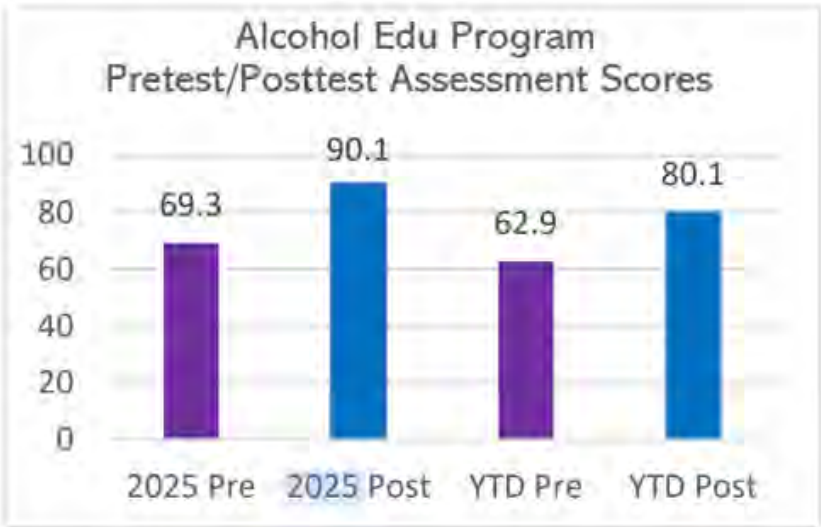

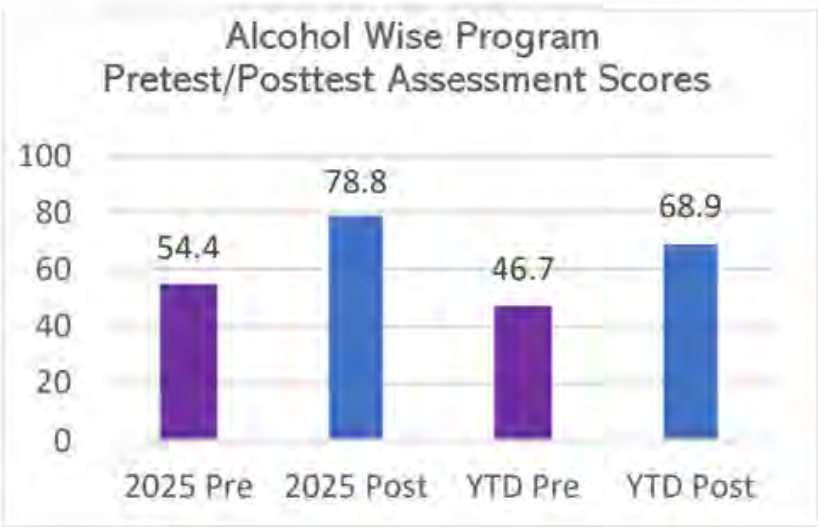

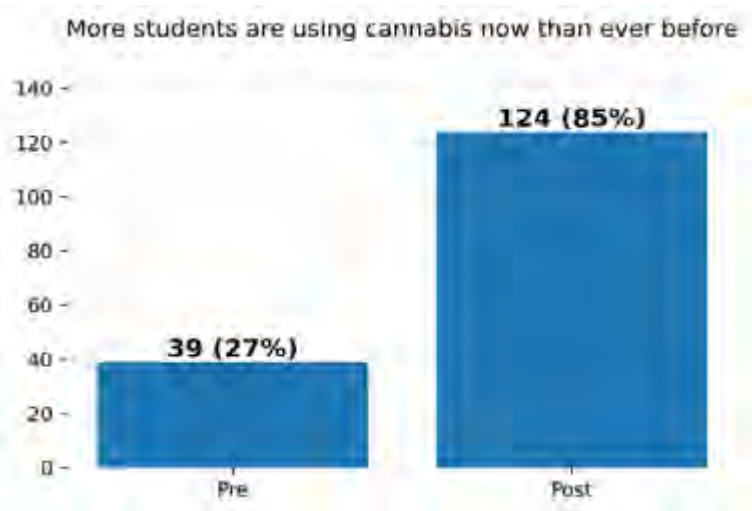

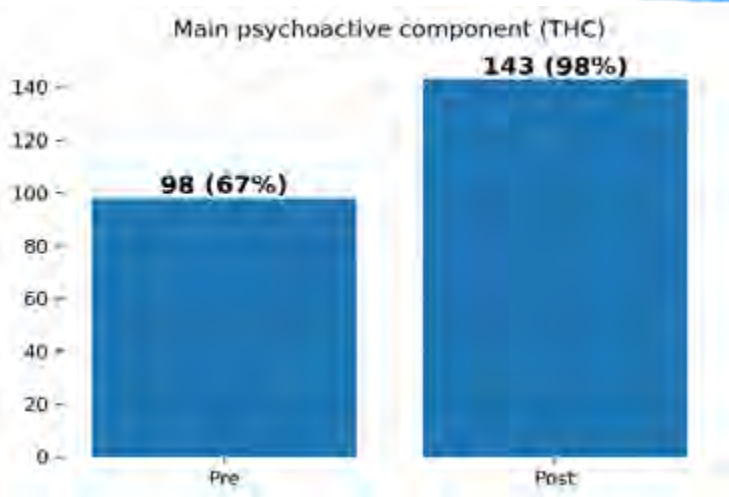
Vector Solutions Grades 9–12 Drug Prevention Trainings

The Vector Solutions platform offers modular middle and high school drug prevention trainings that can be linked into a series, with courses ranging from 15–40 minutes. Youth have not reported participatio or usability concerns; however, ongoing platform challenges persist, and we continue working with Vector Solutions technical support to resolve them. First, the Understanding Alcohol and Its Effects course was unintentionally disconnected from the larger training series. Sixty-three (63) participants were enrolled in late 2025, with some still completing the course. Despite multiple support requests, data cannot be exported by timeframe, and cohorts were automatically closed in June without notice, creating uncertainty around summer participation. Second, the Cannabis Use report contains duplicate entries from youth who restarted the program after forgetting login credentials. We are seeking access to raw data to correct this issue. This course serves as the first in a five-part series addressing cannabis, substance use, fentanyl, opioids, and alcohol. Third, the Understanding Opioid Misuse report reflects fewer cases than expected. We will follow up with the development team to address this discrepancy. Despite intermittent functionality, youth feedback has been positive and knowledge gains have been exceptional.

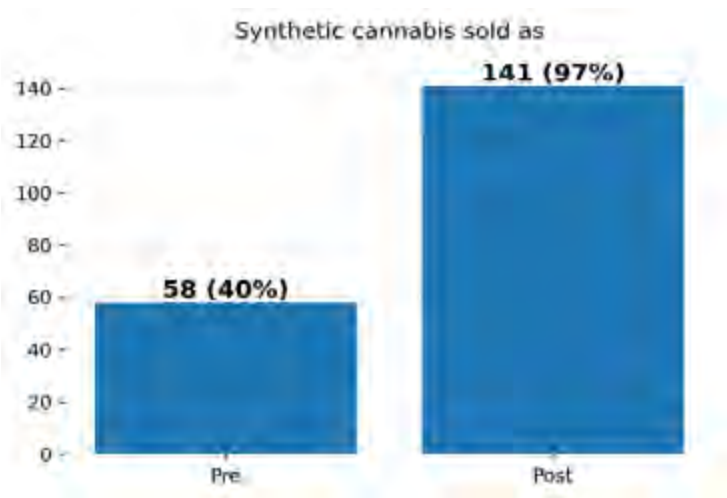

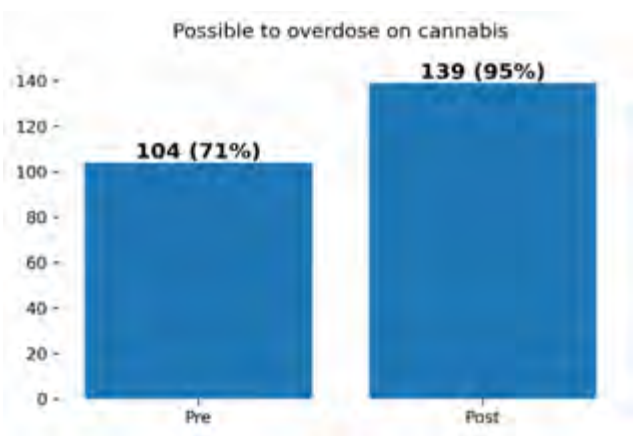

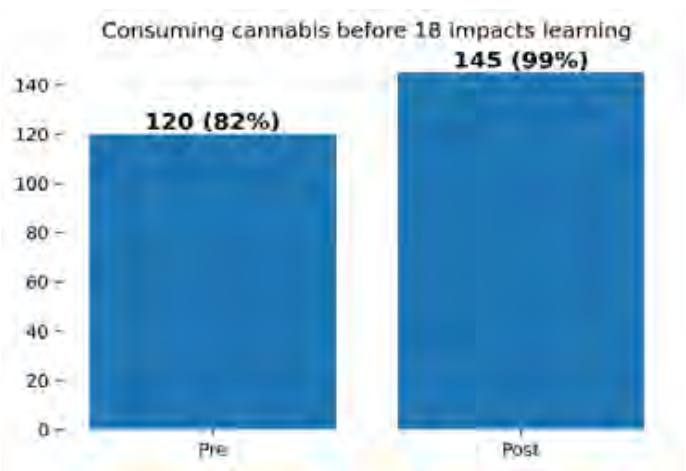
Knowledge of THC as the psychoactive component increased from 67% to 98%.



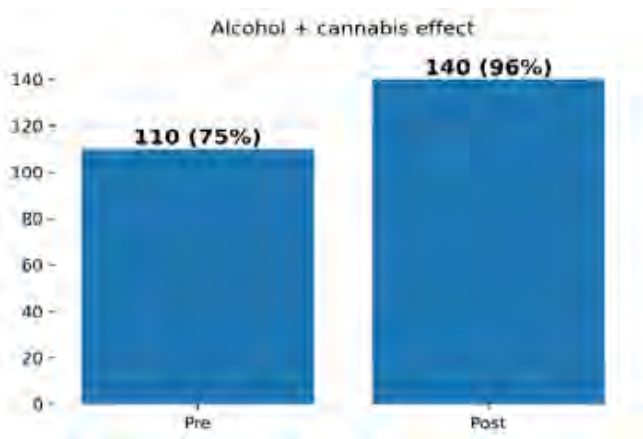
Recognition of synthetic cannabis marketing increased from 40% to 97%.



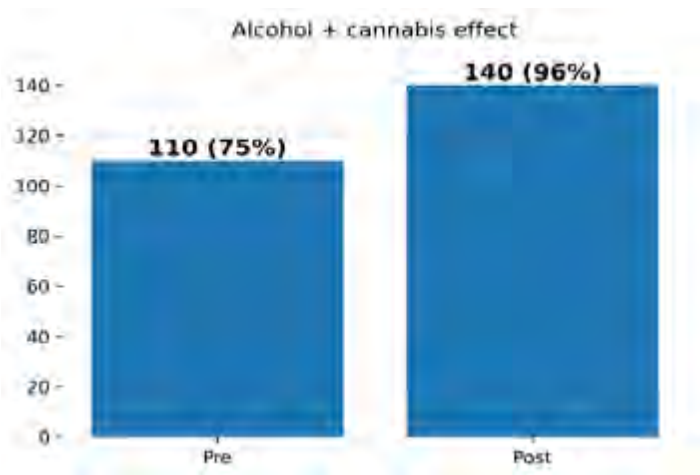
Understanding overdose risk increased from 71% to 95%.



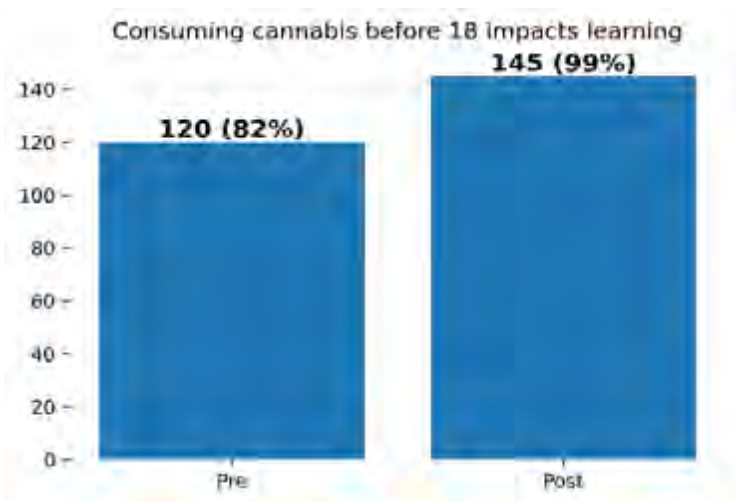
Awareness of youth brain impact increased from 82% to 99%.

Opioid Prevention & Awareness



AHEC is a valued partner of the Monroe County Coalition, supporting community-wide efforts to prevent opioid misuse and reduce overdose-related harm. Through this partnership, we provide free naloxone—an emergency medication that can reverse an opioid overdose—and Detera Drug Deactivation Bags for the safe disposal of unused or expired medications. By expanding access to these lifesaving resources and increasing community awareness, AHEC and the Coalition are helping create a safer, healthier Monroe County.



ENVIRONMENTAL SCANS

A closer look at Monroe County retail environments

WHY WE SCANNED

The Coalition conducted environmental scans at Monroe County businesses that sell or display alcohol, tobacco, vaping products, THC and hemp-derived products, synthetic substances, kratom, and related items. The scan documented what residents and young people may encounter in everyday retail settings - including product availability, placement, packaging, pricing, and promotional messages.

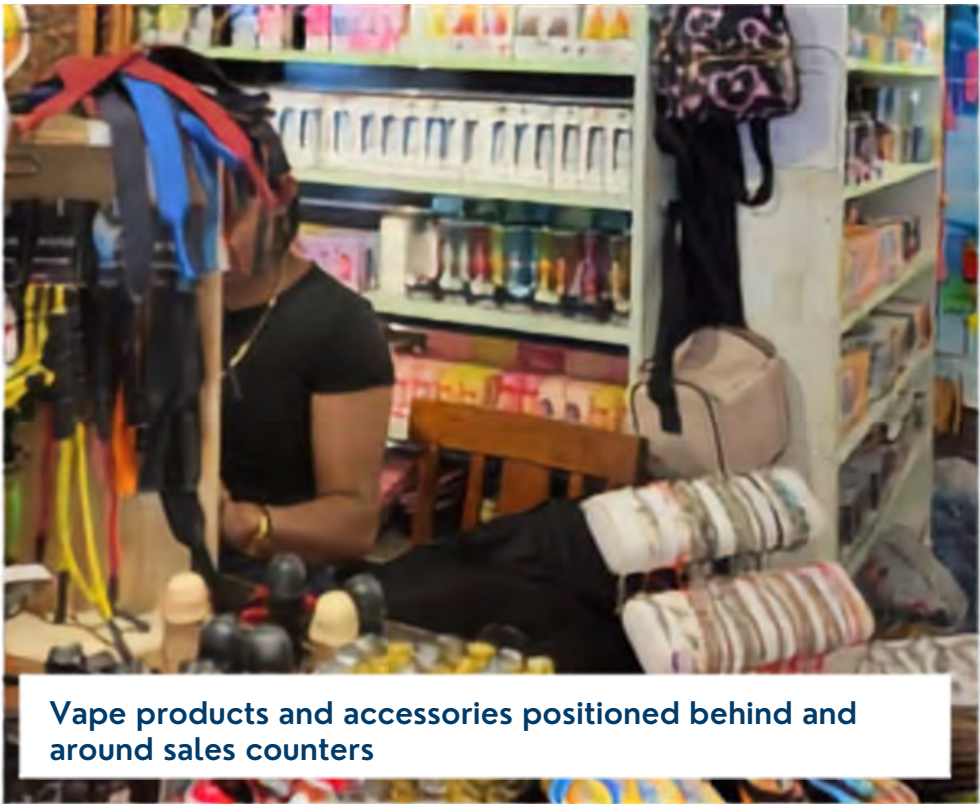

PURPOSE These observations help guide prevention priorities, retailer education, community awareness, and future policy conversations.

PRODUCT AVAILABILITY

WHAT WE OBSERVED

Scans documented a broad mix of psychoactive and emerging products, often sold as shots, gummies, powders, capsules, disposable devices, or brightly packaged novelty items. Displays sometimes grouped these products with common convenience goods, making them appear familiar and easy to purchase.

WHY IT MATTERS

Product names, strengths, and ingredients can be difficult to interpret. Youth-oriented colors, candy-like flavors, compact packaging, and prominent counter placement may reduce perceptions of risk. The scan gives community partners a clearer picture of the fast-changing retail marketplace and supports timely prevention messaging.

PLACEMENT & PROMOTION

How products are presented in Monroe County businesses

RETAIL CONTEXT

Environmental scans look beyond whether a product is sold. They also document where it is placed, how it is promoted, what products surround it, and whether age-related signs or other safeguards are visible. These details can shape perceived availability and social norms.

COMMUNITY AWARENESS

The No One's House campaign reminds parents and caregivers that no home is a safe place for underage drinking. Providing alcohol—or allowing teens to drink under adult supervision—can lead to impaired judgment, injuries, alcohol poisoning and other serious consequences.

Coalition representatives connected with local families, shared prevention resources and encouraged parents to set clear expectations about alcohol.
