After years of spending time in the outdoors and my love for adventuring, I realized the need to be more educated about areas and prepared for unforeseen circumstances is crucial. I've always been passionate about sharing outdoor experiences with others and get excited when others are inspired by both the woods and water alike. This passion is not only what led me to become a Board Member for the Kentucky Riverkeeper but to also join the Wolfe County Search and Rescue Team this year.

This year, I never imagined one of my first rescue missions would be so impactful. Being part of the rescue team finding the hiker, Scott Hern who has been missing for14 days in July. Hern had lost his way and his ability while hiking a dense part of the Red River Gorge in search of a waterfall. The experience from the search and rescue changed the way I saw how one can contribute to someone else's greatest time of need. This mission also showed me the greatness that can happen when people can come together—in this case, so that someone could live!

I am still inspired by people that embrace the world's wildness, but hope with that curiosity to also be educated and prepared for their surrounding areas. Most importantly I encourage folks to always be inspired to be part of something bigger than themselves – you never know where it will take you!

The Kentucky Riverkeeper and our partner, LiKEN Secures \$3.1 Million USDA Forest Service Funding for Agroforestry and Watershed Restoration in Appalachia

Project aims to boost local economies through sustainable land management in Eastern Kentucky and Southern West Virginia

Lexington, KY, May 1, 2024 - The Livelihoods Knowledge Exchange Network (LiKEN) has been awarded over \$3.1 million in funding from the United States Department of Agriculture Forest Service, under the bipartisan Inflation Reduction Act. This grant will support LiKEN's "Community Wealth from Healthy Rivers and Forests" project across 26 counties in eastern Kentucky and southern West Virginia. The project focuses on increasing household incomes through the sustainable use of nontimber forest products and enhancing local watershed management.

This funding includes a \$1 million subaward from the Center for Heirs' Property Preservation. LiKEN will distribute a portion of its grant funds to partner organizations including Friends of the Tug Fork River and Kentucky Riverkeeper.

Three Sisters Casserole with Cornbread

Topping Makes 8 servings

For the cornbread topping:

I/ and I/4 cups yellow cornmeal

1/2 cup all-purpose flour

2 teaspoons baking powder

I teaspoon salt

2 tablespoons unsalted butter, melted

½ cup whole milk

½ cup water

For the Filling:

3 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil

2 tablespoons tomato paste or ½ cup dried tomatoes

I yellow onion, diced

4 cloves of garlic, minced

I pound of any squash or pumpkin, peeled and cubed

Continued:

I can (15 ounces) diced fire roasted tomatoes

I teaspoon coriander

1/1/2 teaspoon ground cumin

1/2 teaspoon chili powder

1/4 teaspoon smoked paprika

1/2 teaspoon salt

I cup vegetable broth

I cup fresh or frozen corn kernels

I (15 ounce) can of any beans, rinsed and drained

2 cups chopped spinach or kale

Inspired form the Native American Gardening of corn, squash and beans.

Heat your oven to 350 degrees F., Grease a 9x13 inch baking dish and put it aside. Make the filling:

Use a large skillet or a Dutch oven (or if you are adventurous, a cast iron pan with a lid over an open fire!!!) Put the oil in, heat it, add the onion and cook for about 4-5 minutes.

Add the garlic and cook for another minute.

Add the squash, tomatoes, tomato paste or dried tomatoes, spices and salt. Add in the broth and bring mixture to a boil. Cover the pot and turn down the heat. Simmer for about 15-18 minutes or until the squash or pumpkin is tender.

While yor filling is simmering:

Mix the cornmeal, flour, baking powder, and salt. With a wooden spoon slowly stir in the butter, milk, water. Set aside for about 10 minutes.

Get back to the filling that has been simmering and add in the corn, beans and greens. Continue cooking, covered, for 3-5 minutes until the mixture thickens and all ingredients are well mixed.

Transfer to a baking dish (or if you are adventurous and cooking over an open fire just add the cornbread mixture in biscuit sized clumps on top of the mixture in your cast iron pan and put the lid on!)

Form generous biscuit sized clumps of cornbread topping and place on top of the mixture

Bake for about 20-25 minutes 350 degrees (the adventurous cook needs to check the iron pan in the open fire to see when the cornbread is done!)

Let the casserole sit for about 5-10 minutes before serving!!

This freezes well should anything be left over!!! If you do so, let it thaw in the refrigerator overnight
