**Chairman Coffey** called the Regular Monthly Meeting of the *Commission of the Unified Government of Cusseta-Chattahoochee County, Georgia* to order at 6:00 p.m., with all other Commissioners present, and live streaming on our Facebook page.

### APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE JULY 1, 2025, REGULAR MEETING

Commissioner Hoyte made the motion to approve the minutes as written. Seconded by Commissioner Frost. The vote was unanimous.

### APPROVAL OF THE JULY 28, 2025, WORK SESSION MINUTES

Commissioner Douglas made the motion to approve the minutes as written. Seconded by Commissioner Biddle. The vote was unanimous.

### OLD BUSINESS

**ATTORNEY** - The only old business he had at this time is the cemetery draft which is on the agenda.

County Manager will be bringing some projects to the Commission at the next Work Session that can be done with SPLOST and Tourism funding, such projects include a dock at Riverbend Park, bathrooms at the basketball court on King St, and a Welcome Center at City Hall, we should be able to get some estimated costs at the next Work Session. He did get with Mordie, and he reached out with a dredging company to see if they would come out and dredge out the sand at the river around where the boats go into the water at the boat ramp. Commissioner Frost asked if we had reached out to the Army Core of Engineers before we spend any money, and the County Manager replied that the way they do it is they put you on a list, and you could be waiting for months to years before they get to you. We will look at the costs and see if it is something that is reasonably low it might be worth doing now.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

**ATTORNEY** - nothing at this time.

**County Manager** - There is one thing that Johnny Floyd has brought to him that we will need to amend the agenda for and add as a voting item so we can get GEMA to approve, we have been waiting a year for GEMA. This will be for the hazard mitigation plan, so we can submit for reimbursement.

Motion to amend the agenda and add the hazard mitigation plan made by Commissioner Biddle, Seconded by Commissioner Frost. The vote was unanimous.

Motion to approve the Hazard Mitigation Plan made by Commissioner Biddle, Seconded by Commissioner Douglas, the vote was unanimous.

### **AGENDA ITEMS**

<u>Friendship Rd Bids, Recommendation for Award:</u> Motion to approve Oxford for winning bid, made by **Commissioner Hoyte**, seconded by **Commissioner Biddle**. The vote was unanimous.

Planning & Zoning Board (Changing from a Seven to Five Member Board): Motion to approve changing to a five-member board made by Commissioner Frost, Seconded by Commissioner Douglas. Opposed were Commissioners Biddle and Commissioner Hoyte, Chairman Coffey was the tie breaker, and his vote is to approve. The motion passes. The attorney a long-term fix would be to amend the zoning ordinance, but the short-term fix would be a resolution and recording in the minutes today. Commissioner Hoyte stated there is someone in the audience who would like to speak. Latrese Brown in the audience put an application in and would like to be on the Planning and Zoning Board, and she would be willing to be the seventh member. Commissioner Frost asked to Ms. Browns point he does love that she wants to be on the board, however he still believes that a five-member board is the best route to go. We do keep all applications on file for anyone that wants to be on a board. The Commission thanked Ms. Brown for coming to speak and for wanting to be a board. The attorney asked if the terms are two or four years, the Commission stated they are four years. Motion is to reduce from a seven-member board to a five-member board, as someone resigns, or as someone's term comes to and end it will not get filled, the first two, which one is already available, and the next one will be open shortly. This will take us to a five-member board, this is the motion that was voted on.

<u>Board of Health Appointment Alison Wigand:</u> Motion made by **Commissioner Biddle**, seconded by **Commissioner Douglas**. The vote was unanimous. The Commissioner thanked her for stepping up and volunteering for the Board of Health, we have needed a certified nurse for some time now.

<u>FLOST Resolution</u> –  $1^{st}$  Reading:  $1^{st}$  Reading, Chairman Coffey asked if we could also get it posted on the website, will have  $2^{nd}$  reading at Work Session, and vote at regular meeting.

<u>SEID Grant/Trail Grant Application:</u> Motion made by **Commissioner Biddle**, seconded by **Commissioner Frost**. The vote was unanimous. This will help us move forward with possible funding to get our trail project funding.

<u>4H- Annual Agreement Renewal:</u> Motion made by **Commissioner Frost**, seconded by **Commissioner Douglas**. The vote was unanimous.

<u>New Horizons Reappointment of April Hughes:</u> Motion made by **Commissioner Hoyte**, seconded by **Commissioner Biddle**. The vote was unanimous.

<u>Cemetery Ordinance:</u> Post on website, ordinance change, starting the process, 90-day process, no vote needed at this time. 2<sup>nd</sup> reading at Work Session.

Chairman Coffey asked the County Manager to look into vandalism at the cemetery, a citizen had reached out and stated that they didn't know if it was the public works accidently hitting grave markers when they were cutting grass or someone else.

### **EXECUTIVE SESSION:**

A Motion was made to go into executive session at 6:41 p.m. **Commissioner Biddle** made the Motion, seconded by **Commissioner Douglas.** The vote to enter executive session was unanimous.

### Regular meeting reconvened:

The regular meeting reconvened at 7:12 p.m. **Chairman Coffey** made the statement that the subjects discussed during the closed meetings were within the legal exceptions to the open meetings law and that no votes were cast within the session. Subjects discussed were personnel & land.

Motion to amend the agenda so the County Manager can make a personnel change on a director's position, made by **Commissioner Douglas**, Seconded by **Commissioner Hoyte**. The vote was unanimous. Motion to allow the County Manager to make the appropriate change that was discussed in executive session made by **Commissioner Frost**, Seconded by **Commissioner Douglas**, the vote was unanimous.

Commissioner Douglas asked about the shoulder work on Firetower Rd, Commissioner Biddle said that DOT had dropped the project, and we were going to do it in house. County Manager Weaver stated he is familiar with one project, but not the one Commissioner Douglas is referring to. Commissioner Biddle stated this is one that we received grant money for it, and it got taken away, or they didn't give it to us, he stated Ms. Lou might remember some of this, but we were going to do it in house, Commissioner Douglas said the shoulder is getting worse. Commissioner Biddle stated look into DOT they might be a good starting point.

### CUSSETA-CHATTAHOOCHEE COUNTY HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN

WHEREAS, Cusseta-Chattahoochee County recognizes that it is threatened by several different types of natural and man-made hazards that can result in loss of life, property loss, economic hardship and threats to public health and safety; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has required that every county and municipality have a pre-disaster mitigation plan in place, and requires the adoption of such plans in order to receive funding from the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, a Hazard Mitigation Plan is a community's plan for evaluating hazards, identifying resources and capabilities, selecting appropriate actions, and developing and implementing the preferred mitigation actions to eliminate or reduce future damage in order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the residents in the community; and

WHEREAS, the Cusseta-Chattahoochee County Hazard Mitigation Plan 2024 has been prepared in accordance with FEMA requirements at 44 CFR 201.6; and

WHEREAS, the Plan will be updated every five years;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT** *RESOLVED***,** by the Board of Commissioners of Cusseta-Chattahoochee County, Georgia, that:

- 1) Cusseta-Chattahoochee County, Georgia, has adopted the Cusseta-Chattahoochee County Hazard Mitigation Plan 2024; and
- 2) It is intended that the Plan be a working document and is the first of many steps toward improving rational, long-range mitigation planning and budgeting for Cusseta-Chattahoochee County.

### Cusseta-Chattahoochee County Hazard Mitigation Plan Information

### Executive Summary

Cusseta-Chattahoochee County Emergency Management Agency completed the update of the 2018 Cusseta-Chattahoochee County Hazard Mitigation Plan as required by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). FEMA requires the Hazard Mitigation Plan be updated every five (5) years. This update involved 21 people who comprised the Cusseta-Chattahoochee County Hazard Mitigation Plan Update Committee. The committee included representatives from throughout the Unified Cusseta-Chattahoochee County Government as well other organizations, such as the Cusseta-Chattahochee County School District. Three Committee meetings were held to review the 2018 Hazard Mitigation Plan, Identify hazards facing Cusseta-Chattahoochee County, perform a full risk assessment of those hazards, review previous mitigation strategies, and identify new mitigation strategies for Cusseta-Chattahoochee County. The plan has been approved by the Georgia Emergency Management Agency (GEMA) and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

### Major Changes and Updates from the 2018 Cusseta-Chattahoochee County Hazard Mitigation Plan

Cusseta-Chattahoochee County's updated Hazard Mitigation Plan identified nine (9) natural hazards and four (4) technological/manmade hazards. The hazards identified were:

Natural	Technological/Manmade
Severe Thunderstorms	Hazardous Materials Incident

Winter Storms, Earthquake, and Transportation Incident were new hazards identified as part of the Hazard Mitigation planning process for this update.

The mitigation strategies are the most important aspect of the Cusseta-Chattahoochee County Hazard Mitigation Plan. These strategies provide a blueprint for how Cusseta-Chattahoochee County can decrease the impact of the identified hazards on the community and/or prevent the hazards from occurring. The Cusseta-Chattahoochee County Hazard Mitigation Planning Committee identified thirteen (13) mitigation strategies that had been completed during the five years between the previous plan and the updated plan. The completed strategies specific to Cusseta-Chattahoochee County include:

### Cusseta-Chattahoochee County Hazard Mitigation Plan Information

- Thorough building code standards, require mobile hoes to be tied down and withstand 75 mph winds loads
- Work with FEMA to create digital flood insurance rate maps with base flood elevations for all of Chattahoochee County
- Enforce floodplain development regulations
- Create inventory assessment of current equipment versus meeting the need
- Schedule and perform initial database list for critical facilities
- Schedule and perform the American Red Cross Shelter Simulation Course to DFCS employees
- Assess vulnerability of the critical facilities
- Create procedure to call off-duty employees at the scene of the disaster event
- Incorporate cost of association memberships into EMA budgets
- Form local emergency response team (CERT)
- Be in contact with emergency personnel staff at the state and federal level to find funding sources
- Analyze land uses for the purpose of identifying and securing an area to temporarily park commercial vehicles transporting hazardous materials overnight
- Develop an evacuation plan for locations with high concentrations of people

Overall, the Cusseta-Chattahoochee County Hazard Mitigation Planning Committee identified seventy-nine (79) mitigation strategies – seventy (70) for natural hazards and nine (9) for technological hazards. This includes twenty-seven (27) new mitigation strategies. It should be noted that jurisdictions are not required to complete the mitigation strategies identified in the Cusseta-Chattahoochee County Hazard Mitigation Plan. These strategies are expected to be guidelines to help jurisdictions make decisions when the opportunity arises to implement strategies to reduce the impact hazards may have on the community. Research has shown that for every \$1 spent on mitigation projects, a community can save \$6-12 in response and recovery costs when a disaster happens. As such, this document can be particularly helpful as justification of grant applications when attempting to secure grant monies for projects identified in this plan. Some of the new mitigation strategies identified in the Cusseta-Chattahoochee County Hazard Mitigation Plan include, but are not limited to:

- Maintain NFIP Compliance
- Build a tornado shelter in the area of the three main mobile home parks
- Purchase portable generator for water utility
- Enhance radio communications and radio system for all departments
- Purchase NOAA weather radios for distribution to citizenry
- Perform a study to identify best locations for outdoor warning sirens and install at those sites
- Purchase mobile electronic signage
- Support and utilize Weather Smart program to disseminate information to the public
- Encourage citizens to follow rules for outdoor burning via county website and social media

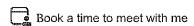

**Chairman Coffey** called the Monthly Work Session of the *Commission of the Unified Government of Cusseta-Chattahoochee County, Georgia* to order at 9:00 a.m., with all other Commissioners present, with the exceptions of Commissioners Douglas, and live streaming on our Facebook page.

### SPEAKER:

Eston Hood — Came and introduced himself, he is from Atlanta and with the MCL JAS CO, he would like to come back next week with lunch and meet again on Tuesday the 2<sup>nd</sup> at noon and show the Commission the seminar he would like to present. The County Manager would like to have the water staff present as well.

### **COUNTY MANAGER UPDATES:**

County Manager Weaver – Gave updates for Lou Beck, had some staffing changes, Heather Lorenz is our new ACO officer. We had a class scheduled, Heather & Gabe attended and passed and are now Level 1 certified. We have purchased some new traps, we have partnered with a group with  $ar{ ext{N}}$ ew York, that is taking 25 cats off our hands. There is a drive through rabies Clinic coming up in September. Public Works has started putting millings down at Steeplechase, they are almost done, culvert at Firetower Rd is coming along, working well. They had several interviews, had two positions moved within. Working on request for proposals, one is City Hall. Water dept updates, two vacancies were filled, they are back up to full staff. Tank had to replace a valve, and the tank is serviceable again, EPD inspection went well. SPLOST projects at 215 McNaughton St., we are struggling with storage, behind this building we would like a storage building that is a climate-controlled shed. This would also house election equipment as well and need the Commission's approval. Commissioner Frost asked that we make sure we get something big enough. County Manager stated he couldn't agree more. The County Manager said Wednesday he will be getting with Alan in the Tax Assessors office to talk about the millage rate, the school has already set there's and we need to get ours started. We will probably need to start setting up some called meetings. The Chamber of Commerce asked about doing a hometown heroes banner and if the tourism money could be used to pay for it. The Board of Assessors came in at 35.75 with our sales ratio. The ACCG conference interferes with our October meeting, we will need to reschedule the meeting either to the day prior or to the morning of. Chairman Coffey and the Commission stated they are fine with changing it to a morning meeting on the 7th.

**Johnny Floyd** — Would like to get a text alert system called IPAWS, should add on to textmygov, it works like emergency amber alerts & if there is an accident in our vicinity like Hwy 520 it will send out an emergency alert. The Commission said they will add it to the agenda as a voting item.

**Mordie Askew** – Will not be participating in youth football, but they will be participating in soccer. GLL Marine went down and looked at the boat ramp a few weeks ago, he hasn't heard anything back from them yet, he will call them today and touch base and see where they are at with a price on dredging. They are looking at bathrooms up at the park at the basketball court on King St, as well as maybe some other amenities as well, maybe a gazebo or pavilion. There is a leak somewhere at the Splashpad, and he is going to get with the water dept and see if they can find where it is.

The following items were discussed as to their relevance for appearance on Sept 2, 2025, regular meeting agenda:

**Conditional Use Permit Process** - Check with Bin and see if he has anything yet for us, ask Bin on old business at meeting.

**Road Projects** — Riverbend Rd paving project, take SPLOST & TSPLOST or wait for LMIG, and we can still move forward with Liberty Hill, we can use the same money and planning towards Liberty Hill. We have one spot on Liberty Hill that need major work, County Manager stated we can do a hybrid and do part of Liberty Hill and Riverbend, he can start doing a project together that does half of each road. We can fix the worst of both. **Commissioner Frost** agrees that Liberty Hill has more people that live in this area, and he thinks it needs to be addressed sooner than later. The **County Manager** stated he will bring a few different prices together for the Commission to look at. **Commissioner Biddle** also stated that Ft. Benning can help with some of the paving of Riverbend Rd.

**FLOST Resolution** -1<sup>st</sup> Reading **Chairman Coffey** read the proposed resolution, the resolution is also on the website, the 2<sup>nd</sup> reading and voting will be at the next meeting, add to the agenda.

**Travel Policy Rates** – Updating mileage rate, we have updated our policy, but does need a vote, add to the agenda for a vote.

**DFACS Reappointment of Martha Burgamy** – Reappointment of Martha Burgamy, add to the agenda as a voting item.

**County Retirement Plan** – Changing from Corebridge we have had ongoing issues with them to ACCG Retirement Plan they offer numerous plans, including our exact plan, add to agenda as voting item.

**Cemetery Ordinance** – 1<sup>st</sup> Reading Chairman Coffey read the ordinance, this is on the website, add to agenda for 2<sup>nd</sup> reading.

**Riverbend Fishing Dock** – Have updated quotes, better to go with the bigger dock, but must be put out to bid, due to the amount, so that is what he is asking for at the meeting, add to the agenda.

Year End Cleanup Budget Amendments — Certain line items that went over and others that didn't, they didn't exceed the bottom line of the budget, we still have to correct, the budget as a whole we stayed 10% under as a whole. This will move funding around to actually help us cover that, it is more of a clean-up, it is more for when we get to the 2024 audit, add to agenda.

**DFACS Annual Lease Renewal Agreement** – Yearly renewal of DFACS lease agreement, add to agenda.

Caselle Payment Portal – This will eliminate xpressbillpay, it will work directly with our software, we will be able to take credit card payments at the recycle center, and adoption fees off site as well. It will be the new way to pay your water bill online, add to agenda.
