An interactive dance performance developed for home-educated, neurodivergent and/or disabled children aged 3-8 years.

Coming to Surrey Libraries this autumn, these performances are adapted for a smaller audience. The Sticky Dance fosters a relaxed and inclusive space, supporting diverse sensory and accessibility needs for children to interact with dance in their own unique way.

Two dancers' shimmy through the audience inviting you to explore freely, to stick and groove or be still, watch and listen

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### Silent Strikes at Guildford Spectrum


On a Thursday afternoon (excluding holidays) from 4pm to 6pm Guildford Spectrum hosts an sensory friendly bowling session.

We supported him to run a pilot event at Woking Library on Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> September. It went well, and dates for future events will be published soon.

### **Cinemas**

Beth and Kira from our team tried out a 'Relaxed Screening' at The Light in Redhill during September.

The LED lights are kept on during the film in case people needed to move around. This is great for some people, but distracting for others.

Later this month we will be designing an online survey to find out what would make cinemas more inclusive for autistic adults and families with autistic children.



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### **Guildford Aspire Group**

We attended the Guildford Aspire Adult Support Group on 2<sup>nd</sup> October.

The group is run by The National Autistic Society and meets of the first Thursday evening of each month.

There were 15 attendees at their October meeting and we gave a presentation about Autism Friendly Surrey.

One member is keen to work with us to set up an autism friendly walking group.

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### **Camberley Autism Group**

We have been supporting members of the Camberley Autism Group (for adults) to re-start their group which hasn't had a venue to meet for the last year.

We helped the group secure funds to hire a room once a month on a Wednesday evening to meet from 7pm to 9pm.

Group members are working on their guidelines, safeguarding and sign up form.

We hope to be able to promote this group to new people later this year.



# **Guildford Autism and ADHD Friendly Meet up Group**

We met online with the organiser of this group, and plan to work together with them to offer some support ongoing.

They meet once a month in a venue in Guildford on a Saturday afternoon and have 372 members on their MeetUp site.

We plan to explore the idea supporting a network where people can connect with others with similar interests e.g:

- Gaming
- Cinema
- Walking
- Gym
- Art and crafts

Some autistic people are keen to organise activities that are open to others, and we are keen to work with them.




### Opportunities open to all

# **Sport in Mind**


We met with Sport in Mind on Monday 6th October.
