March 8, 2021 – Regular Monthly Meeting @ Town Hall – 7:00 pm.

Notice of the meeting was posted according to the OML, {19.84 (3), on the town website and published in the Ad Delite. The chairman called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. All town board members were present along with several from the community.

The Pledge of Allegiance was said.

The agenda was approved on a motion made by Matt Krenz, seconded by Dean Klingbeil, and carried.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved on a motion made by Dean Klingbeil and seconded by Matt Krenz.

There was nothing for the monthly mailing.

Public Input included: Brian Westrate said that the base course that is on Deer Road has metal in it. There is a need a fresh layer of base.

Kyle Schiefelbein said that Green Meadow Road to Hwy 12 has a ditch that needs to be cleaned out for better flow of water.

The request to barricade Morning Crest Road while using a hose across the road for Otten Minnow farm was granted. Ken Kiesow reported there were 46 residents that voted at the Spring Primary Election on February 16th.

Item 8a – Mark and Barbara Goings were given approval for rezoning 34.68 acres from A-3 to A-P. Dean Klingbeil made the motion to approve and seconded by Matt Krenz. A letter will be sent to the county.

Item 8b – There are still complaints of barking dogs after a board member talked to the owners. It has been agreed to have the chairman along with the residents having the issues to go and talk to the dogs owners.

Item 8c– Kyle Schiefelbein provided information on Wind Towers. A representative from RWE also answered questions. It was suggested to have an informational meeting on Wind Towers sometime this Summer for the community.

Item 8d – The Big Creek ATV club will be responsible for the trails. The signs for the ATV trail can be affixed to the town signpost or if none are available the Big Creek ATV Club may put up their own post after the approval of the town board. There may be a possibility to share the cost of the signs. The complete ordinance can be viewed on the town website. The ordinance will be posted as

required. It will go into effect on March 30, 2021. The motion to approve was made by Matt Krenz and seconded by Dean Klingbeil.

Item 8e – The retirement backpay for the months before the state retirement started will be paid to the road employees. Motion to settle the retirement was made my Matt Krenz and seconded by Dean Klingbeil.

Item 8f – After reviewing neighboring township wages for elections workers it was decided to pay the Chief Inspectors \$12.00 and Poll Workers \$11.00 an hour. Audit and Special meetings will receive \$50.00. The motion to approve was made by Dean Klingbeil and seconded by Matt Krenz.

Item 8g – The sand contract was updated and will be sent out, it was approved by Matt Krenz and seconded by Dean Klingbeil. A safety meeting video on operating to use the loader will be held Thursday April 8th at 8:30am and again at 5:00pm.

Item 8h – The Road Bans were put up today, March 8. Countryside has asked for an exception to travel on Kopplin Road because of the propane needing to go through.

Discussing Roads and Town Business: There maybe 2 culverts, for sure 1 new one needed for Gablers. A fresh layer of base course will be needed on Deer Road. Green Meadow road will be looked at to keep the water running and is the responsibility of the town.

On the future agenda will be the Annual Meeting that will be held on April 20th at 7:30 pm.

The treasures report was read as follows: GENERAL FUNDS \$1,094,997.99 MACHINE FUND - \$33,029.85 TOWN HALL FUND - \$14,067.70 PETTY CASH \$75.00. TOTAL FOR TONIGHTS BILLS \$453.057.48. A motion to accept the treasures report made by Matt Krenz and seconded by Dean Klingbeil. A motion to transfer money to pay the bills was made by Dean Klingbeil and seconded by Matt Krenz. The motions carried.

The next meeting was set for April 12,2021 at 7:30pm.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:34 pm on a motion by Matt Krenz and seconded by Dean Klingbeil.
