Beechbrae is full of green and flowers are starting to pop out and show their colours. We've enjoying the sounds of birds echoing through the woods this spring. We really enjoyed the very sunny May, but our plants, trees and wildlife are grateful to have a little rain back after a month of cracked earth.

Tree Damage

Storm Éowyn brought down a large number of trees across Beechbrae in January. The 100+ that fell are overwhelmingly Pine, Larch & Spruce, ones that cling on to their neighbours as they fall to the ground.

It will take us a long time and a lot of work to tend to the fallen trees. Once the nesting season is over we'll begin the process of removing the windblown trees. We're starting with ones blocking paths and will work our way through the rest this year, maybe next.

Beechbrae Summer Activity Days 2025

Beechbrae and Nature Scot are teaming up to run 4 summer outdoor activity sessions this Summer. These will be held at both Beechbrae and Blawhorn Moss (always starting at Beechbrae) and are open to young people from P5 and up. The sessions will run from 10am - 2pm.
