1. Minutes from last meeting

2. Matters Arising: None.

3. School Update: None available.

**4. Police Update:** Police sent a report highlighting four incidents.

- 1. Windows smashed at the Health Centre over a weekend. As there was no CCTV or witnesses, suspects could not be identified.
- 2. Group of six youths throwing rocks at windows of an address, but they had run off before the Police arrived. There were a further six calls of a similar nature in the same area over the month including ASB, shoplifting, and vandalism. Reactions from parents are mixed, with a lack of responsibility taken by many. The behaviour is continuing.
- 3. A disturbance between two males, with fighting, broken bottles, and threats. Both parties traced and no injuries and did not want to cooperate with Police.
- 4. Total of five calls over one week relating to off-road bikes on main roads. The last of these reported an offroad bike colliding with a fence and causing damage. Officers attended, but the male had made off before they arrived.

Discussion followed on other ASB issues. Graffiti on bus shelters, telephone junction boxes, etc. If the words are sectarian or abusive, the Council will clean it. Further discussion on a rock thrown by children, breaking a window of a house on Westcraigs Road. Cllr Kenna advised that she is trying re-activate an initiative used in the past to tackle ASB. General agreement that the problems are getting worse again and that it is a small cohort of children and youths who are difficult to manage and unwilling to engage with adult supervision.

There is an untaxed vehicle parked in the village. Details will be sent to DVLA.
