10. AOB:

There seems to be a lot of dog poo around the village. This has been an issue in the past and there are plenty of bins, so no excuse for not picking up. Would it be possible to involve the school in converting juice bottles to make poo bag dispensers that could be placed around the village? There is a supply of bags at the Craig Inn Centre that could be used. Alternatively, could there be a grant application to provide dispensers and bags?

The trees that were felled at the school have been stored at a farm until they can be used. D Orr is asking how much longer they will be there and is requesting payment for storage. A Graham will speak to Malcolm at FS to see if application for a grant could be made for this.

There are a number of empty houses in the village. Why are they vacant for so long when there is a waiting list? Cllr McGuire advised that there are 16 void properties in Blackridge and the Council have stopped work on non-urgent repairs so they can deal with these voids.

The road to Harthill is in a poor state of repair and recent repairs have broken down. Cllr McGuire has previously contacted NLC about this and will do so again.
