The past year has been a busy and interesting time for everyone in the Village and we hope you enjoyed the various events including the Gala Day, Light Shows, Fireworks display as well as the various clubs and events held at the Craig Inn Community Centre.

#### **CRAIG INN COMMUNITY CENTRE - OUR FUTURE**

The Community Centre is currently the subject of a review being carried out by West Lothian Council regarding the deficit within the Council budget. At present the future of the Craig Inn Community Centre is only secure until April 2026.

Ideas to increase and expand the use of the Community Centre are being sought, including raising awareness of the various clubs currently available to members of the community as well as exploring the demand for new clubs or indoor games at the Community Centre. The facilities unfortunately, do not offer the possibility of football or other ball games. The Community Centre can be used for all age groups including those from a few months old (Tutti Tots) through primary school to teenagers, adults and senior citizens.

The Community Centre can also be used for events such as Birthday and Anniversary celebrations, Weddings, along with those organised by the various clubs which use the Community Centre.

The Craig Inn Centre in Blackridge, a cherished hub for community activities and events, faces an uncertain future due to proposed budget cuts by the local council. The council's plan to save £1.7 million from the community centres budget has put the centre at risk, with management groups being forced to consider options such as Community Asset Transfer (CAT), Full Repair and Insuring (FRI) lease agreements, or bearing the full costs themselves. These potential changes have caused significant concern among volunteers and community members who fear the disruption and financial burden it may impose. The future of the Craig Inn Centre now hinges on the community's ability to come together and find a sustainable solution to keep this vital local resource operational.

As part of our ongoing commitment to helping out local charities, our group recently knitted and crocheted hundreds of poppies for a poppy display for local churches.

Additionally, we are proud to announce that two of our members recently received prizes for their knitting and quilting at a local event, showcasing the remarkable talents within our group.

### BLACKRIDGE COMMUNITY FUND

Since the Blackridge Community Fund began 10 years ago, it has awarded nearly £350,000 to 29 different groups for community and charitable activity in Blackridge. 116 grants of varying sizes have made a big difference in community life – most of the groups featured in this newsletter (and the newsletter itself!) have benefited from funding over the years.

With one round still to go at the time of writing (decisions in November 2024), this year has seen twelve grants worth nearly £50,000 awarded. Both the Blackridge Social Activities and Entertainment Group and Blackridge, West Craigs, and Westrigg Gala Day groups received £15,000 each to support the annual fireworks and Gala Day respectively over the next three years. Blackridge, Westrigg, West Craigs OAP Association, Blackridge Senior Ladies Indoor Bowling Group and the Monday Club all received grants towards their annual programmes of activity, whilst four groups recently received £500 each to cover the unexpected introduction of new Craig Inn annual fees as a result of planned reductions in local authority support to the venue. The smallest grant went to cover the costs of storing and seasoning felled timber from the primary school for a bit longer whilst Beechbrae SCIO, pupils, the Community Council and other groups work out the final arrangements to transform the timber into a lasting legacy within the school, benefiting generations of children for years to come. The Blackridge Primary School Parent Council also received funding to run a food voucher scheme helping alleviate the effects of the cost of living crisis for families across Blackridge.

#### **Blackridge Community Fund Panel**

As well as making award decisions, the Blackridge Panel and Foundation Scotland this year worked hard both to promote the Fund (hopefully you've seen the posters!) and to arrange additional support for community groups in the area. As a result, Voluntary Sector Gateway West Lothian (VSGWL if you like acronyms) offered to provide a session dedicated to Blackridge groups at the Craig Inn in early November. VSGWL is the "Third Sector Interface" for West Lothian, dedicated to supporting and developing volunteer community groups, charities and social enterprises in the area. They are experts at supporting groups around the issues groups highlighted during a recent survey – things like funding and fundraising; policies; safeguarding; accounts/financial practice; constitutions; banking; and volunteer policies/management. Hopefully this will help groups continue to deliver the fantastic range of activities and projects that make such a difference in Blackridge community life.

#### **EDF Renewables**

EDF Renewables (from the Burnhead Moss wind farm), Gresham House (from the Torrance wind farm) and FIM services/Netro (from the Harthill wind farm) all continue to provide annual community benefit payments into the Fund.

#### **Burnhead Moss Education & Training (BMET) Fund**

As part of community benefit arrangements from the EDF Renewables Burnhead Moss Wind Farm Fund, Blackridge residents can apply for bursary grants from the BMET scheme to help them take up education and training courses. Since launch in 2016, 106 Blackridge residents have benefited. From Hair & Make-up Artistry to Dental Nursing, Joinery apprenticeships to degrees in Social Work, Italian and Education & Teaching, a huge number of people have gained new skills, got into jobs and progressed in their careers thanks to BMET. It is hard to believe that we are almost half way through the school year but 2024-25 has so far been hugely successful for everyone at Blackridge Primary & ELC.

In September, we welcomed our Education Officer and a team of Head Teachers from across the authority for our Validated Self Evaluation (VSE). Over the three days, the team visited classes and the ELC, spoke to staff, learners, parents and partners and looked at evidence of our improvement journey. We were delighted with the positive feedback from the team which highlighted the wonderful children we have within our school community, the commitment from staff to continually improve and most importantly, the positive relationships which underpin all that we do at Blackridge.

This term, our children have been working hard, with our youngest learners learning about the changes in seasons and light and dark, P2-4 learning about forces and movement and how these are so important in our world, especially when designing toys. Our P5-7 children had a chance to put their learning on the Rainforest into action with their recent trip to Amazonia, where learners got the chance to experience a wide range of tropical habitats.

We have a full calendar of family learning events underway, with PPP sessions happening in the ELC and Family Club taking place in the school. We look forward to welcoming our school community to our Nativity in December too.


We are a welcoming social community that supports and educates one another. Throughout the year, members frequently go to model train exhibitions and shows.


In the coming months, our ladies' bowling club have several trips planned that wouldn't have been possible without the generous support of community funding.

# Mincemeat Cup Cakes

This mixture makes 24 muffin size cakes.

225gms butter 225gms sugar 4 eggs 250gms mincemeat 210gms self raising flour 25gms cornflour 1 teaspoon baking powder

Cream butter and sugar, add eggs one at a time. Fold in mincemeat and stir well. Fold in the flour, cornflour and baking powder.

Bake for 20 to 30 minutes at 160 degrees Celsius.

# **Ecclefechan Tart**

Line patty tins with shortcrust pastry or line a Swiss Roll tin with Shortcrust pastry

Filling

110gms butter 110gms soft brown sugar 2 eggs

300gms raisins 100gms walnuts zest of a lemon

1 tablespoon lemon juice 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon

Mix all ingredients together and fit either the patty tins or the Swiss roll tin.

Bake in a moderate oven till set. If using the Swiss roll tin cut into fingers when cool.
