

Acquired Brain Injury Services

One participant received supports needed to thrive in the midst of cognitive, emotional, and/or physical long-term disabilities as a result of an acquired brain injury. Individual support, assistance with chore services, community habilitation, supported employment, pre-vocational services, day services, adult companionship and respite are offered through this program.



Adult Foster Care

PRIDE coordinated the care of 101 individuals living in the community with a loving foster parent and/or foster family.



Community-Based Day Services

Individuals improved social skills and community integration by participating in a broad range of activities taking place in a variety of settings in the community. They also received training and education to develop employment skills and job readiness.



Community Employment & Placement Services

Participants received job placement and gained experience in the business community based on individual needs, interests and abilities. Ongoing



Day Habilitation

Individuals were provided with supportive therapies and enjoyed numerous activities to promote developmental skill acquisition. They also received nursing supports.



Mass. Commission for the Blind

One individual with blindness participated actively in our programs thanks to services from the Mass. Commission for the Blind.



Pre-Employment Transition Services

PRIDE helped 42 students ages 14-22 with disabilities ready themselves for transition from high school and/or post-secondary educational programs to competitive employment. Taking place in or outside of school, students received individualized services in job exploration counseling; work readiness training; selfadvocacy; mentoring; a paid community-based internship; and counseling on post-secondary education when applicable.


