Grapheme - A written way of showing a sound.

Can be one letter (s) or more (sh, igh).

Vowel - a, e, i, o, u.

Consonant - All the other letters.

Blending - Saying sounds together to read a word.

Segmenting – Breaking a word into its sounds.

 \bigstar dog \rightarrow /d/ /o/ /g/.

Digraph – Two letters making one sound.

🔭 sh, ch, ee, oa.

Split digraph – A digraph split by another letter.

🜟 a-e (cake), i-e (bike).

Trigraph - Three letters making one sound.

🗯 igh in night.

Decodable words - Words you can sound out.

🔭 cat, ship, rain.

High frequency words – Words that appear often in texts.

and, it, was.

Tricky words - Words that don't follow usual rules.

raid, the, you.
