

School Visit

Parents or legal guardians of students who are enrolled in the District, or who wish to enroll their student in a District school or program, may request a visit, tour, and/or classroom observation. Requests shall be made by contacting the front office. Visits, tours, and/or observations shall be permitted unless doing so would threaten the health or safety (including physical, intellectual, social, or emotional) of students or District staff or significantly disrupt the educational environment. The school may determine the time, duration, and conditions of a visit, tour, and/or observation in order to minimize disruption to instruction and school operations.

The following conduct constitutes interference with or disruption of an educational institution under Arizona law:

- Threatening to cause physical injury to any student, employee, or other person on District property.
- Threatening to damage District property or the personal property of any District employee or student.
- Intentionally or knowingly refusing to leave District property after being directed to do so by the Superintendent, a building administrator, or a District employee authorized to maintain order.
- Engaging in conduct that disrupts or interferes with classroom instruction or school activities.

Interference with or disruption of an educational institution may constitute a criminal offense under Arizona law.

Visitors on District property must comply with all applicable laws and District rules, including prohibitions on weapons, alcohol, drugs, and the use of tobacco products, including e-cigarettes, on District property.
