Long time KQHA member Ernestine Morrison passed away at the age of 88 on July 3, 2025. She was predeceased by: her parents, Anna Ball (Gannon) and Wilson Blair Ball; and her husband Harold. She is survived by: her daughters, Kimberly Norwood (Fred), New Cambria and Teri Ann Johnson (Michael) of Temple, TX; and her grandson Brandon Norwood (Mandy).

Ernestine spent over 25 years, being involved with the Kansas Quarter Horse Association as a youth parent, exhibitor, and horse show secretary. In fact, the Morrisons made service to KQHA a family affair as Harold served as a Youth Advisor and President while Ernestine served as executive secretary and publisher of the magazine. They are both in the KQHA Hall of Fame for their contributions to the organization. They also assisted Dr. Stan O'Neil with the Gorthy Serrault scholarship fund when it was created.

Away from the horses, Ernestine had a great passion for community theater and participated in the Salina Community Theater presentations for over 5 decades as an actress, chorographer, staging consultant and director.

Although she stepped away from actively participating in KQHA around 2007 her contributions during some very trying times for the association enabled KQHA to continue on. We are forever in her debt.

With the cancellation of the American Royal show the last chance to get points in the core classes such as hunter under saddle, trail, western riding, western pleasure, horsemanship, equitation etc will be at the PHEK Show in Lyons, Kansas in August. There will be only open halter, youth and amateur showmanship and youth and amateur horsemanship at the Hope in The Heartland in September. Please consider attending the PHEK event which has 2 agha judges with very reasonable entry fees and an all day fee.
