Always follow the SkiBiker's Responsibility Code!



As we grow our sport remember to follow the rules. Everybody sliding down the mountain should know this **Responsibility Code.** The National Ski Area Association (NSAA) developed "Your Responsibility Code" which has been adopted by ski areas nationwide to help resort users understand the elements of risk in snowsports. These seven **common sense** rules, combined with personal awareness, can help make the slopes safer and more fun for everyone.

Your SkiBiker's Responsibility Code

Always use devices to help prevent runaway equipment.

Prior to using any chairlift, you must have the ability to <u>load, ride</u> and unload safely.

Whenever starting downhill or merging onto a trail, <u>look uphill</u> and yield to others.

<u>People ahead of you have the Right of Way</u>. It is your responsibility to avoid them.

<u>Always be in control</u>, and able to stop or avoid other people or objects.

<u>Do not stop where you obstruct a trail, or are not visible from above.</u>

Observe all posted signs and warnings. <u>Keep off closed trails</u> and out of closed areas<u>.</u>

Some ski areas have additional requirements for SkiBikes, so always check to be sure. If you need help with chairlift loading, or runaway device restraints, refer to the Ski Area's rules, and manufacturer's instructions for your specific equipment.

E-Bikes in the Bicycle Industry...A lesson for us?

For those of you that follow the regular bicycle industry you have seen the surge in E-bikes and their recent explosion on the scene. The past couple of years they are suddenly in shops across the country and even available at resorts for rent. Is there a lesson to be learned?

E-bikes were scorned for many years and not embraced by the old school bicycle industry. Major brands stood aside and watched smaller companies pioneer the category and develop good reliable products. Die-hard bicyclists looked down on a new trend. Suddenly the marketplace came to life when the early adopters handed off their torch to their friends and famly. The Demand for this new style of riding enlightened the old school and they began renting and selling the category. As this demand grew, the major bike brands jumped on the bandwagon. Now E-bikes are a category entrenched in bike shops and likely here to stay.



Ski bikes are at a similar crossroads. We have been scorned, and outlawed as resorts while managers and riders watch the sport develop. The early adopters pioneered this new sport and told their friends and family all about their new passion. When I finally tried an E-bike last summer and I was blown away at how much fun it was. "Game changer" is what came to mind with an aging body and older legs. This will get me out bike riding more often and with the enthusiasm I hadn't felt in years.

There are so many similarities to the attraction of SkiBiking to the Baby Boomer generation. Like E-bikes, SkiBiking is so much easier on mogul shot knees and well used bodies. SkiBiking gets us out on the mountain and is the great equalizer. Families can enjoy it together. Bored skiers and boarders can rediscover the mountain and remain active participants at ski resorts. Resorts are now suddenly embracing these new activities. Renegade snowboarders of the 1990s changed the resort dynamic and are now a welcomed core of customers.

We believe SkiBikes and other alternate sliding devices are soon to fall the way of the E-bike and be a welcomed addition to resorts worldwide.
