



Interesting Background Information on the EBLGA Chautauqua



2009 marked the first year for the Eagle Bend Ladies Golf Association's member-guest tournament, *The Chautauqua*. "Chautauqua" is an Iroquois term that means *two moccasins tied together*, which describes the unique shape of New York's Chautauqua Lake, where the Chautauqua Institution was established in 1874. The institution served as an educational experiment that led to a nationwide movement of gatherings to exchange ideas in thought, literature, science, the arts, and more. In the 1920s, the movement made its way to the Flathead Valley, where guests could rent hotel rooms or pitch tents on the shore of Flathead Lake. The town of Lakeside was even originally named Chautauqua. **What a fitting foundation upon which to build a two-day golf event filled with fellowship and fun. Our annual tournament has been the best in the valley for over a decade, and we're proud to build** *The Chautauqua* **around such an important tradition.**

Flights: Names are based on notable family names, taken from the history of our community.

- **Dockstader** Jim Dockstader's grandfather was the first sheriff of Flathead County. After WWII, Jim and his wife, Effie, moved to Bigfork and began a Christmas tree operation, and Effie also served as a nurse.
- **Kehoe** James Kehoe came to the valley around 1915. He built a boat and was active in local shipping while his son, Jack, focused on geology and cutting gems. Remains of the old boat can be found just west of Eagle Bend, adding to the charm of the historical family operation, Kehoe's Agate & Gem shop, which is still in business today.
- **Sliter** E.L. Sliter came to Bigfork in the late 1800s. He plotted the town and became postmaster, and by 1910, he owned the land stretching from Ferndale through downtown Bigfork to the lakeshore. The community park just below the dam and west of the village is named Sliter Park to recognize the founder of the town.
- Whitney L.R Whitney came to Bigfork in 1908. He was a carpenter who built many of the town's early buildings, and his sons worked for the power company and were mainstays in the village for decades. The beautiful trail along the Swan River is named Whitney Nature Trail in the family's memory.
- **Wilson** Francis "Rip" Wilson came to the Flathead in 1932. He taught history and geography at Flathead High School and served as the football coach. Rip's son, Dick, with his wife, Lona, built a retirement home on the family property in the early 90s and served as ambassadors for Eagle Bend Golf Club.
