

Calico Cut-Ups will be having our first stand-alone Country Store April 1 & 2 at Bella Vista Assembly of God. This is the time to donate those gently used items you purchased and either never used or already had one. Bring your items to the next meeting. I hope you will consider donating a little of your time to help man the store during the sale.

It is the responsibility of your Executive Committee to be good stewards of the money and resources of Calico Cut-Ups. I wanted to give you a State of the Guild so that each of you will understand our finances. Below is a shortened version of our current budget. Some of our income sources from the past have gone away. We need about \$10,000 in fund raising per year to break even. Yes, we have approximately \$27,000 in savings, but those savings will only last approximately 2 ½ years without continued fund raisers.

The Quilt Auction we held last Fall brought in \$4,100 after all expenses and we hope to bring in \$1,800 with our Country Store the first of April. As you can see, even this does not bring in all that is needed.

What can we do?

Raise dues - doing this will not give us the needed funds.

Cut expenses - Where, what do you want to continue to do? What do you enjoy most about Calico Cut-Ups? Fund Raisers - What are you as a member willing to help with?

Sponsors/Donations - As a member, are you willing to contribute extra funds to our budget?

Our emphasis is on education and charity. In keeping with this, we need to know what is important to you as a guild member. What is most important to you? Outside speakers and workshops, service projects such as Quilts of Valor, donation quilts, etc., What is not important to you? What would you suggest we stop doing? Your input is valued and needed. 


