Kathi Eubank will be the guest speaker for the March 27, 2023 meeting with a program on 'What the Judge Sees.' Kathi is a certified NACQJ Judge, which is the National Association of Certified Quilt Judges. The self-guided study process to become a certified judge is rigorous and requires time, effort and dedication. The candidate must complete comprehensive written documentation showcasing knowledge of all quilting techniques as well as design elements. After successfully passing the paperwork section the candidate then must pass an oral exam conducted by three Certified Judges. Kathi will review the judging process and alleviate the fear of entering a quilt in a show, describe the criteria used to judge the quilts and the elements of a ribbon-winning quilt. A question and answer session will follow the program. We will all learn ways that we can improve our quilts even if we do not plan to enter them into a contest.
