On Monday, March 25th, Denise Stahl (The Curious Kansas Quilter) will be our guest speaker. Denise will share her trunk show: "50 States/50 Quilts". On Tuesday, March 26th, Denise will provide a half-day workshop featuring the delightful Carolina Dogwoods pattern designed by Annette Ornelas with Southwind Designs. Workshop fee is \$30.



Denise comes to us from Lawrence Kansas, and her journey to quilting was about as far as the distance between Germany, where she was stationed, and Kansas, where she lives now. After 16 years in the US Army, 17 years at the University of Kansas studying and working in the field of families of children with disabilities, years of cross stitch, knitting, weaving and beading, she finally arrived at quilting! Denise calls herself the Curious Kansas Quilter because she's never met a technique she won't try at least once. She also has a tough time passing up new patterns, BOM, and workshops. Currently she teaches various quilting classes in person and virtually and spends as much time quilting as her family, housework, reading, and traveling will allow.

Mary Honas, owner of First Rate Designs, will travel from Overland Park, Kansas to be our April 22nd speaker. Mary's lecture and trunk show is titled Color, Value, Scale and Intensity. 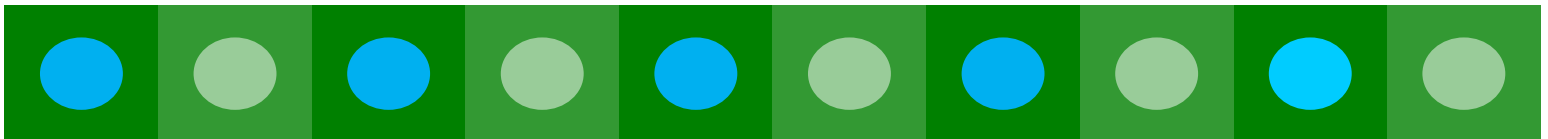


Beginning Quilt Class

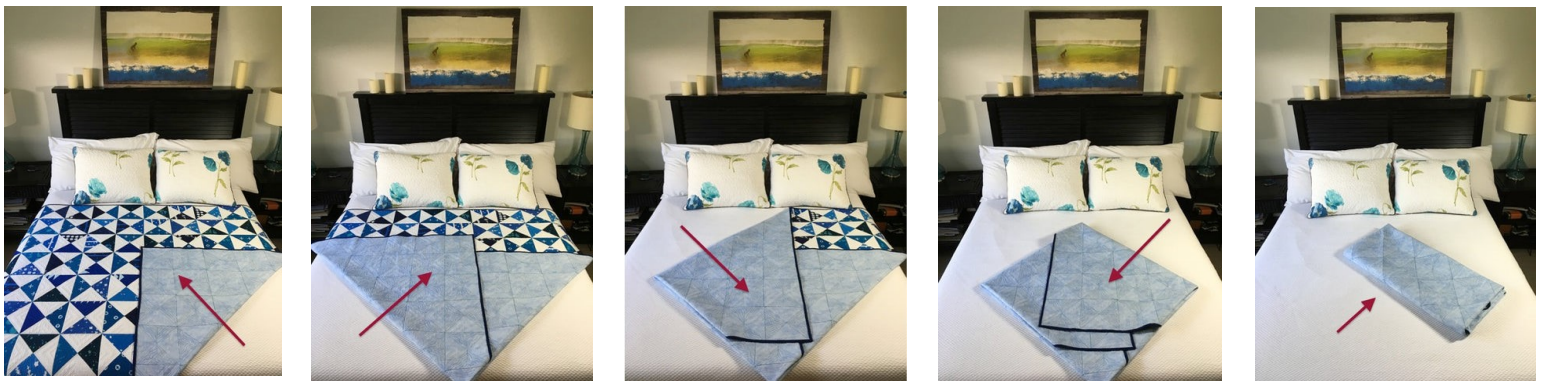
Alice McElwain shares her tips for Caring for Your Quilt

CARING FOR YOUR QUILT

The following basic tips are to help you conserve and display your quilted textile for future generations and their enjoyment.

- Choose a dry, clean, dark space to store a quilt, preferably away from outside walls and windows. Air circulation should be good to avoid mold and fungus growth. Keep the space clean and free of pests and dust. Choose a storage area that has an even temperature and humidity level; basements and attics are usually **not good** places to store quilts because of their changing climate. The old saying goes, "If you wouldn't be comfortable living there, then neither will your quilts."
- Ideally, you would want to store your quilts flat, on a spare bed perhaps. If folded in a box, choose an acid free box and use acid free tissue to place between folds to take the stress off fabrics being folded. Rearrange or refold quilts periodically; at least every six months.
- If you are storing your quilts in a drawer or on a shelf, use a cover of washed white cotton or unbleached muslin. You may use **new**, not used, pillowcases, as used pillowcases will contain oil from hair and body no matter how much it is washed. You may use a flat sheet to envelope your quilt, but avoid using the bottom sheets, as they too have more residual body oils from use.
- Never place quilts directly on wood shelves or drawers as the oils from the stain and finish of woods have acid that can discolor and damage fabrics. If you use a cedar chest, make sure the quilt is wrapped in a white cotton sheet and is not touching the wood. **Cedar oil is one of the most harmful to fabrics.**
- **Avoid** storing quilts in **plastic bags or boxes**; plastic can "off-gas" harmful chemicals and create circulation problems. Don't use mothballs or other anti-insect products, as they can be harmful to the very thing they were meant to protect.
- **Avoid dry cleaning** as there are always chemical residues left in fabrics that can deteriorate fabric over time. If a quilt must be cleaned, consult a quilt expert.
- It's best **NOT** to wash your quilt in water until you have consulted an expert, as fabrics can bleed, fade and become unstable.
- The best display of a quilt is flat, on a bed, or sometimes if the quilt is sturdy enough and in good shape, on a wall. Display out of direct sunlight to prevent fading. Indoor lighting can also be hazardous so avoid really bright lights directly on your pieces.
- Display for short periods of time, 3-6 months maximum. Rotate quilts for display, but remember long term display has all sorts of risks involved.
- Do not tack or nail a quilt to a wall, but construct a hanging sleeve so the quilt can be hung with a long dowel or rod to evenly distribute the weight.
- Sew a **cloth label** on the back of the quilt. Include your maiden name.

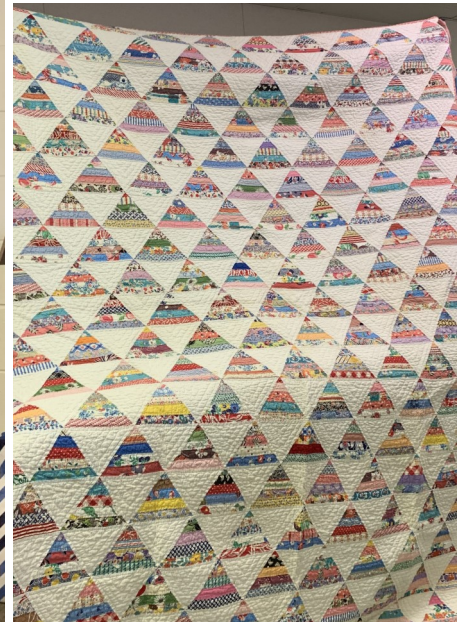

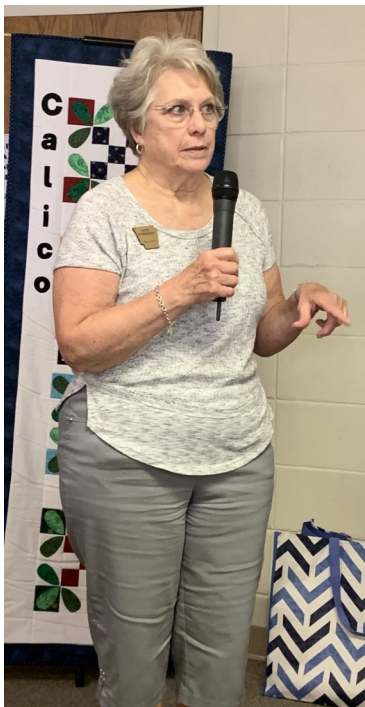

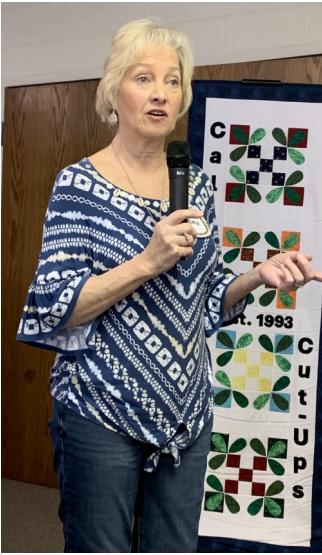
