Timna Tarr

On Monday, June 24th nationally recognized guilter, Timna Tarr will present her Flying Colors trunk show. Timna is known for making fun, colorful, award winning guilts. Timna will share her guilting journey as she talks about her design and color choices, as well as the personal stories behind the quilts.

Timna comes from a long line of guilters but did not begin guilting until after studying art history in college. She bought her first longarm in 2001 and began guilting clients' guilts shortly thereafter. Timna's nationally award winning guilts are in private and corporate collections and have been seen in exhibits, publications, and on The Quilt Show and Quilting Arts TV. Timna is a designer for Studio e Fabrics, the author of Stitched Photo Mosaic Quilting,

and is an in-demand teacher and speaker.

JULY 22nd PROGRAM

David and Teresa Duwe (Yesweduquilts.com), from Overland Park, Kansas will be our speakers in July. The July 22nd guild meeting presentation is titled: "What's Old Is New Again". The program will feature a collection of over 40 quilts recreated and reborn using newer techniques. Many of the quilts use old linens. David and Teresa blend their unique approaches to quilting in their collaborations.


