



POLICIES

1. Meeting Day

Regular meetings of the entire membership will be held on the fourth Monday of the month (except December) unless a change is deemed necessary by the Board. In addition, there will be no meeting in November. 5/14/18

2. Weather-Related Cancellation

In the event of inclement weather, Guild activities will be canceled if the Bentonville School system closes.

In the event of inclement weather, members will be notified by email of the cancellation. 8/8/22

3. Dues

Annual member dues are set at \$25.00 \$35.00 per year. 6/10/13 5/23/22

After July 1, pro-rated new member dues for the current year will be reduced to \$12.50 \$17.50. 5/14/18 5/23/22

4. Visitor Fee

A first-time guest to Calico Cut-Ups will not be charged a visitor fee. After their first visit, visitors to Guild Meetings, where there is a paid speaker, will be charged \$5.00 to attend the meeting. If a paid visitor decides to join the Guild on the same day as their visit, the visitor fee will be applied to the membership fee. 5/14/18

5. No Nametag Fee

Having a guide at your fingertips at home, may lead you to use different methods or pursue areas of quilting you had been wanting to try.

A selection of books will be offered each month at our meeting in a "Silent Auction".

A bidding sheet will be placed with each book with a starting bid. The bidding increments will be listed on each sheet. The bidding will end when the meeting starts.

The person with the highest bid will be announced at the close of each meeting.

We are now using some of the guild library books as door prizes. It's always fun to get a door prize but even more exciting to get a quilting book to take home to keep and use. This is one way to explore new patterns and perhaps learn a different technique.

The following books will be our Silent Auction Library Books for August.

I try to have the books ready by 12:30 on the day of our guild meeting so you can come early, preview the books, and put your bid in.

1. Peeled Back Patchwork - Curves Without Piecing by Annette Ornelas
Add curves to your quilts with just simple straight seams by inserting folded Pieces between the seams and peel the folds back.
2. The Perfect Stitch- The Secrets of Fine Hand Quilting by Roxanne McElroy
This book includes color photographs of precise hand movements above and below the quilt. Includes end of chapter workshops to practice and build skills.
3. Quilts, Quilts, and More Quilts by Diana McClun and Laura Nownes
Included are patterns for 32 quilts along with the techniques to make them.
4. Threadplay by Libby Lehman
This book teaches you to create beautiful thread embellished quilts on your sewing machine to help you master embroidery techniques.
5. Yes You Can! Make stunning Quilts from Simple Patterns by Judy Martin
Introducing the "short strips" technique with full size patterns and Instructions for traditional methods.


“Pumpkin Spice Doodle Quilting

Students will then use textile paints to add color into the piece and enhance the quilting. Students will use Linda’s **Pumpkin Spice Pattern** to build their skills.

This is a FREE program, if downloaded from the Facebook Page (Calico Cutups Christmas Quilt). A printed copy is available by request for \$8.00, which covers the cost of photocopy. I will not be at the August meeting, so sign up at the September meeting OR email me at ellis.kim24@yahoo.com with your name and phone number. Once signed up, I will send you an invitation to join the Facebook "private" group. Fabric requirements are listed below as a guide to colors used in the quilt sample but feel free to change up your fabric choices.

This would also be a great stash buster!! If you're new to quilting, I will be available after the meetings to answer questions. If you want to make just a few blocks into a pillow or table runner, that's ok too. My hope is that quilts (tops or projects) will be finished to share at the Christmas luncheon next year. Quilt Size is 82" x 97"

* 38 Fat Quarters

(13 light, 7 red, 5 dark blue, 3 light blue, 3 pink, 1 light green,

6 medium/dark greens) blocks and pieced borders

* 1/3-yard solid navy (tree block border, flower block, applique

* 1/2 yard solid red (snowman block border, patchwork block, applique

* 2/3-yard solid green (2 nd and 4 th border)

* 3/8-yard green polka dot (sashing)

* 1 3/4 yard red pinecones (outer border)

* 2/3 yard green (binding)

* 7 1/2 yards (backing)

Special Projects

Thanks to all who participated in our July Special Projects Workday! We completed a dozen *holiday-themed pillowcases* and made kits for 30 more. And thanks to all of you at the guild meeting who picked up the kits to take home and make more! Our goal is to have at least 50 pillowcases by the end of October, to deliver to Ronald McDonald House and the NWA Children's Shelter, so all the kiddos will have a special holiday decoration for November/December.

Another of our projects is making *flannel bibs* for NWA Kids First. Ava Harrold delivered another 37 bibs in July and reported that they were very excited to receive them to use in their preschool therapy programs. Thanks to all of you who took kits home and made these needed items. We will also be making a new batch for delivery in October, using holiday themed flannel, and will have kits available for these at the August meeting.

In July, we delivered 15 *fidget quilts* and 15 *fat-quarter lap quilts* to the McDonald County Living Center, just across the border in Anderson, Missouri, and we took 21 *pillowcases* and 17 *tote bags* to the NWA Children's Shelter.

In July, we also contributed to the “**Wrap Ukraine in Quilts**” project. Sue Wagner attended the International Quilt Show in Salt Lake City in July, where there was a booth requesting quilts be sent to Poland for the Ukrainian refugees. Our Guild contributed 15 quilts to this cause, and Sue added three of her own. For \$17/box, UPS will ship these to a site in Illinois where they are loaded on cargo planes going to Poland. They are accepting quilts throughout 2022. Sue sent two boxes so far with plans to send more in September if you are interested in donating. Sue is happy to share her 15 yards of sunflower fabric to make quilts for them if you are interested, although ANY fabric and designs are greatly appreciated. They especially need lap quilts (smaller than bed-sized) for kids ages 0-18. Thank you, Sue, for bringing this project to our attention!



August Workday, coming up on Monday, August 15th, 10-2, at the church. We will be making *holiday-themed lap quilts* for delivery to nursing homes in October-November. The guild has plenty of fabric available for you to use, or you can dig into your own stash. The size we are aiming for is about 42x48 inches. At the workday, we will also have kits to make “*button buddies*,” which have been requested by Arkansas Children's Northwest. These are cloth covers used to prevent G-tube leakage and prevent skin breakdown. They are quick to make and provide a needed resource for the hospital.
