

2023 is soon appoarching. Quilt Retreat for CCU is March 7-10, 2023, Tuesday thru Friday. The registration form will be in the newsletter and available at the meeting. We will be at a new location, Camp Egan, in Tahlequah, OK visit their website, <a href="www.okcamps.org/egan">www.okcamps.org/egan</a> Address and phone number is above. Internet and phone service is very limited, the office is open from 8-4 pm, if you go outside or in the office they will work. The camp is run by the United Methodist Church.

We will be staying in the Holliman Lodge. Each bedroom has their own bathroom and can sleep up to four with two twin beds and a queen bed, bedding, pillows and towels are furnished. A way of continueing the fun, ask your friends to join you at retreat or come yourself and make new friends.

The sewing room is divided with a gathering area in the middle, everyone will have their own table. We will have ironing stations and cutting stations set up, plus two design walls for all to use, you can bring a small iron for yourself.

Needed now for September:

28 Heavy duty or contractor type 30-45 gallon trash bags on a roll

It has been suggested by the board that the guild members will be better served to offer books from our library for purchase. We have a good selection of books from "how to" beginner books to those specializing in more advanced quilting techniques to new quilt ideas. Having a guide at your fingertips at home, may lead you to use different methods or pursue areas of guilting you had been wanting to try.

A selection of books will be offered each month at our meeting in a "Silent Auction".

A bidding sheet will be placed with each book with a starting bid. The bidding increments will be listed on each sheet. The bidding will end when the meeting starts.

The person with the highest bid will be announced at the close of each meeting.

Payment in full will be due at the end of the meeting. Any item not paid for/picked up at the end of meeting will be offered to the next highest bidder.

We ask that you pay by check or cash. (No credit or debit card, please)

If you are the highest bidder, please see me before leaving at the close of each meeting to pay for your bid and take home your "new to you" quilting book.

Please note that no book which was donated to the guild library as a gift in honor or memory will be sold.

I will list the books each month in the newsletter that will be in the auction.

Always check the auction at each meeting; there may be additional books added after the newsletter was sent, there may be a "bundled" book selection, or a bundle of pre-owned guilting magazines auctioned.

Please be generous in your bidding, in that all proceeds will benefit you as a member of the guild in our future activities. So remember: Come early and bring your extra dollars or checkbook and have fun bidding with your Guild buddies for that book "you can't live without".

Thanks to all who made **tote bags** at our September Special Projects Workday, and to those who took kits home at our September guild meeting!

In September, Guild members returned another **12 holiday-themed pillowcases** (for a total of 47 so far). Our goal is to have at least 50 pillowcases by the end of October, to deliver to Ronald McDonald House and the NWA Children's Shelter, so all the kiddos will have a special holiday decoration for November/December. (I think we're gonna make it!) We also collected **18 bibs** made from Christmas flannel, for Kids First NWA.





You also brought 12 quilted flannel blankets and 3 finished quilts that will be sent to the "Wrap Ukraine in Quilts" project. Thanks to Sue Wagner for collecting and shipping quilts for this project. If you are interested in contributing, they especially need lap quilts (smaller than bedsized) for kids ages 0-18
