Three Initial
Paint Chip Challenge Quilt



Rules:

This will be a three color quilt.

Must use a paint chip color starting with the first letter of your first name, the first letter of your second name (not your maiden name unless you have no middle name) and the first letter of your last name.

Can be any shape as long as it is no larger than 18" x 18" or 72" perimeter.

This is open to: block choice, applique, quilting, embellishment, your imagination!

Due date is December 10, 2018 (Guild Christmas Party).

Example: my initials are EES the paint colors I could use in my quilt are: Earthen Jug, Escapade Gold & Sociable.

If you chose a print fabric, it has to have just the three colors of your paint chips. Example: your colors are red, white and blue. You could find a print fabric with red, white and blue but no other colors. Another example of using print fabric if two of your three colors are red and yellow and you find a red print fabric with white flowers you could color the white flowers yellow.

The three paint chips you used for your colors must be attached to your quilt in whatever manner you choose.

Tools of the Trade with Jenifer Dick


Guided Improv Workshop | Quilt Size: 42" x 38"

Supply List

- Working sewing machine
- Medium-neutral thread or thread to match, and wound bobbin
- The usual quiltmaking supplies, including: rotary cutter, pins, acrylic rulers, and anything else you like to use.
- Trash bag*
- Extension cord and power strip*
- Personal size iron/ironing surface*

Fabrics

• 1 yard bold solid or near solid such as Moda Cherry Grunge (*Note:* This amount is an approximation. Since this is improv pieced, some will use more and some will use less.)



- Scraps of a minimum of 16-20 black prints avoid prints with too much white. You want them to be little ditties that read more black than white. A 5" charm pack of precuts is perfect. You want a large variety of black to make the handle more interesting. Come prepared to swap and share!
- Scraps of 4-5 medium gray prints
- Scraps of 8-10 light gray

Before Class:

Having some squares precut will make the decision-making go faster! These are just guidelines for precutting. You may cut more at the workshop.

Pink – 15-20 squares

Red – 25-30 squares

Black - 15-20 squares

Light Gray – 6-7 squares

Pattern cost: \$10 (required)



^{*}Depending on the facility, you might not need these. If you don't have them, we'll share if necessary!

Pearl of Grace Ranch Update Where Heartache Meets Healing

The Pearl of Grace Ranch home for troubled teen girls in Tryon, OK will host an open house September 29, 2:00 – 5:00 p.m. with an expected opening of October 1, after more than a year of delays. This project does not receive government money so the project is completed as funding becomes available.

Several of you last year donated fabric and finished quilts in anticipation of an earlier opening. I delivered 18 completed quilts to them last December. I have plenty of fabric set aside to make more quilts as needed. Each girl will get to choose her quilt and take it with her when she leaves.

They are currently completing one of four pods for eight girls each plus two mentors per pod. Eight girls have been approved by a judge and are awaiting opening. The other three pods will be completed as funding becomes available. This is the only facility of its kind in Oklahoma and there is a great need for it.

The reason for the "Ranch" name is they will have horses on site for the girls to work with. The horses will come from abusive environments so the girls can make a connection with them and assist with their healing.

Fabric Advice For Beginning Quilters

Last month we talked about some of the different cuts of fabric available. We talked about type of fabric to use for top and backing and also batting. We defined Fat Quarters, Charm Squares, Jelly Rolls, and Layer Cakes. We'll continue with more definitions this month.

Charming Jelly Cakes

These are a Charm Pack, Jelly Roll and a Layer Cake of every fabric in a fabric line. There are patterns written specifically for these.

Quilting Turnover

These are 6" triangles of each fabric in the line with 40 pieces in every pack. This eliminates the need for you to have to cut the charm squares into triangles.

Honey Buns

These are 1½ inch wide strips of each fabric in a fabric line. Used the same way as Jelly Rolls, they eliminate having to cut the strips yourself.

Quilt Panels

Quilt Panels are a panel of fabric with a preprinted design. The whole panel may be quilted or sections of the panel may be cut out and used in a pieced quilt. These are time savers if you use the whole panel because they can be sandwiched and then hand or machine quilted.

September Block of the Month

Sampling different techniques is the theme for 2018. I'll be demonstrating the block of the month at the New Bees on the 2nd Wednesday of the month at 10:30 to noon in room 28, lower level of the First United Methodist Church.

The block for September is Crazy House.

The blocks will be 12 1/2" squares that can be made into purses, wall hangings, pillows, lap throws, or a sampler quilt. No set colors. We'll be using fabrics from your stash.

Anyone who is new to quilting or would just like help, or just to socialize are invited to come.

Crazy House for the Calico Cut-Ups



For a 12 1/2 inch Crazy House block (12 inches when sewn in a quilt) you need:

Four 5 1/2 by 3 inch rectangles of your background (B&W print)


Four 5 1/2 by 3 inch rectangles of red Eight 3 1/4 inch squares of white

Four 3 by 2 1/2 inch strips of the black Four 3 by 2 1/2 inch strips and one 2 1/2 inch square of white




If you have trouble sewing a straight line, mark a line diagonally from corner to corner on the wrong side of each one of your white 3 1/4 inch squares.

Place a 3 1/4 inch block right sides together with one of the rectangles as shown here, the left and top sides meeting evenly. Sew on the marked line. Press to the darker fabric. Now square the rectangle on the right side, then trim the corner leaving a 1/4 inch seam allowance.



Repeat with all of the rectangles. Next sew them together into pairs, one each of the print and the red, one pointing up and one pointing down.
