Ava said how nice it is to see the smiles of gratitude when masks are delivered knowing we care. The head nurse at Legacy Village said she'd kiss Charlie if she could she was so grateful. Steve Morrow Allen's was ecstatic to receive Razorback and red masks for some of his team.

Vicki received a request last week stating the VP of Medical Affairs at Mercy Hospital is now requesting homemade face masks—pleated with pockets and nose piece- and can use as many as possible. Highlands Oncology also is requesting up to 500 of the same. As this appears to be the standard for the medical facilities now, we ask our members to sew these type only going forward. A link to make these was sent by Rebecca in our weekly Tuesday emails. We currently have 63 of non hospital approved face masks for any groups requesting them; please let us know where to take them or you may pick them up on Friday.

Weekly drop off at Allen's parking lot on Fridays between 4:00-4:30. Please let Ava know if you would like kits to help sew these—tomandava@cox.net or 949-370-2675. They will be available on Fridays. As elastic is almost non-existent, ties are recommended. For the nose piece, if you do not have wire or pipe cleaners, rollup up aluminum foil works well, too.

Thank you to ALL of you who have tirelessly been sewing masks for our community. We appreciate you!



Credit Card Square Terminal

We now have a free-standing credit card reader which connects to wifi and to our bank account. We will be able to take payments for Membership Dues, Workshop Fees, Sewing Machine Rentals, Quilt Congress Country Store and other items.
