Calico Cut-Ups Quilt Guild Of Bella Vista, Arkansas

Letter from Sue Wagner, President of CCU 2020

As many of you know, my husband and I moved here from Utah 22 years ago. Our daughter still lives there, I visit her often, and of course I visit many beautiful quilt shops while there. My Girlfriends Quilt Shoppe (MGQS) is a fun one (there are actually 3 of them!) that has a daily online "3 at 3" plus many online tutorials. [Side note: Kris, the owner of the three MGQS, is the twin sister of Kim, owner of Kimberbell Designs of Logan UT. Talk about a fun and talented family!]

Anyway, MGQS held a block exchange in September. They provided a pattern for a 6" pumpkin block (using your own fabrics), asking everyone to make nine blocks. You sent them eight, they returned eight blocks from quilters around the world, and you then sewed the nine blocks together in whatever pattern or style you wanted. How fun! I thoroughly enjoyed participating in this project and suggested it to Rebecca as a future guild project. Also, rather than purchasing the annual "president's gift" (especially as funds are tight), I voiced to Rebecca that it would mean more to me if I received a heart block or a block of fabric from board members if they wished to contribute. I would then make myself a wall hanging as a fond remembrance of this year. Well, our amazing VP Rebecca ran with it! She, Deb M, Myrlene, and others generously gave of their time, fabric, and creativity. I am deeply honored and humbled to have received this magnificent quilt. It not only has unique, beautiful, heart-themed blocks from many, but Rebecca and Deb found a way to recreate and embroider my year's theme on a block. Plus the

quilting and backing are incredible! **WOW!** This **FAR** surpassed my idea to make a small wall hanging with a few blocks! This quilt will be used, loved, and cherished forever. My heartfelt thanks.





Quilting is a Work of Heart, which has been proven time after time by our guild. My deepest gratitude for allowing me to be Calico Cut-Ups' 2020 president and for your continuous generosity with our guild's donation projects. I am in awe of you.

Quilts of Karen Moore

The quilt is Autumn Braid. I made it for a friend and she will get it for Christmas. This was an easy quilt to make, the hardest part was getting the colors right in each braid.



The name of the pattern is Sail. I made this quilt for our youngest sons best friend and his wife. They love the ocean and at one time had sailboat they used at Beaver Lake. I thought this would be a nice reminder of the friend-ship they had with our son.



Quilt and Table Runner by Carmen Tesch

The pineapple quilt was made using Lynn Graves pineapple foundation papers. They can be found on line. It measures 60" x 60". The embroideries in the middle of the blocks and corners are from Sew Swell Embroidery, on line at https://sewswell.com/

The table runner (pattern Anthem) is from the book, 'Simple Whatnots' by Kim Diehl. I wanted it to be larger than the pattern so made it 3 blocks wide rather than 2, as shown in the pattern. It measures 21" x 28". I pieced it with a cast on my left hand after having hand surgery. I was at retreat and could not pin so a friend suggested Wonder Clips, and they did work

I had several thousand colorful hexies left over that I'm using to make items for the Country Store at next year's Quilt Congress








Quilts by Laurie Davis
