Calico Cut-Ups **First Annual**Online Quilt Auction Results

First, to those who worked the Online Quilt Auction, I would like to give a HUGE "Thank You", especially to all of the members who donated items to be sold. You made our first ever Online Auction a great success.

We sold 130 items (yes, every item sold), and our net profit after all expenses came to \$4733.52. This is comparable to the monies made from a Quilt Show when split between two years.

I am more than pleased with the results for a first-time effort! We are already planning to do this again next fall.

Our best sellers were Lap-sized and Bed-sized quilts, followed by Wall Hangings. Table toppers and Baby quilts were a bit slower. So, with this in mind, start thinking/working on projects to be sold next time. Some of us will be pulling kits together to be pieced and quilted by those who might not have anything to donate. Check with Carol Bourque or Brenda Askland if you need something to work on.
