



It has been suggested by the board that the guild members will be better served to offer books from our library for purchase. We have a good selection of books from "how to" beginner books to those specializing in more advanced quilting techniques to new quilt ideas. Having a guide at your fingertips at home, may lead you to use different methods or pursue areas of guilting you had been wanting to try.

A selection of books will be offered each month at our meeting in a "Silent Auction".

A bidding sheet will be placed with each book with a starting bid. The bidding increments will be listed on each sheet. The bidding will end when the meeting starts.

The person with the highest bid will be announced at the close of each meeting.

Payment in full will be due at the end of the meeting. Any item not paid for/picked up at the end of meeting will be offered to the next highest bidder.

We ask that you pay by check or cash. (No credit or debit card, please)

If you are the highest bidder, please see me before leaving at the close of each meeting to pay for your bid and take home your "new to you" quilting book.

Please note that no book which was donated to the guild library as a gift in honor or memory will be sold.

I will list the books each month in the newsletter that will be in the auction.

Always check the auction at each meeting; there may be additional books added after the newsletter was sent, there may be a "bundled" book selection, or a bundle of pre-owned quilting magazines auctioned.

Please be generous in your bidding, in that all proceeds will benefit you as a member of the guild in our future activities. So remember: Come early and bring your extra dollars or checkbook and have fun bidding with your Guild buddies for that book "you can't live without".

The following are the books for the July Silent Book Auction. Please come early on guild day to look through the auction books and make a bid. The auction ends when the meeting starts. We will announce the highest bidder during the business meeting. Please see me after the meeting to purchase your book. We can accept check or cash.

We are now using some of the guild library books as door prizes. It's always fun to get a door prize but even more exciting to get a quilting book to take home to keep and use. This is one way to explore new patterns and perhaps learn a different technique.

- 1. Victory Quilts by Eleanor Burns Quilt in a Day series. This shows step by step how to cut and sew a 1940's sampler quilt.
- 2. Sew Quick Scrap Quilts by Leisure Arts. This is teaching you how to use your Scraps to piece 14 patterns like Flying Geese, Prairie Stars, and Churn Dash.
- 3. Quilts with a Spin by Becky Goldsmith and Linda Jenkins. This includes seven New projects from Piece O' Cake Designs.
- Log Cabins New Techniques for Traditional Quilts by Janet Kime.
 This book explains quilt design and fabric selection beginning with the Basic Log Cabin Block to 7 new log cabin designs.
- 5. Scrappy Duos by Donna Lynn Thomas. This book explains creating Scrap quilts with 20 versatile block patterns that are assembled two at a time with a different set of Scrap fabrics for each pair.

Kids Kamp was a Great Success


