<u>June</u> Guild Speaker & Workshop Instructor, Mindy Smith



Mindy is a textile/mixed media artist in Columbia, Missouri. She started quilting 30 years ago and has made many commissioned quilts, as well as several that were donated to charitable organizations. Her fiber art has been displayed at the University of Missouri, Denver National Quilt Festival and Paducah Quilt Show. She is a professional member of the Heartland Quilt

Network. And she is the curator of the Daniel Boone Regional Library Annual Quilt Exhibits in Columbia, Missouri. Mindy has served as the CEO of the Booneslick Trail Quilters' Guild in Columbia, Missouri, and chaired several quilt show events. Mindy regularly teaches free motion quilting and thread painting classes and lectures on the topic of creatively documenting your quilts.

At our June 24 guild meeting, Mindy Smith will be giving the presentation entitled, "Give your Quilts A Voice." It will be a power point trunk show of quilts and the process of creating their life stories, including the "OH, NO!" life things that happen.

On Tuesday, June 25, she will conduct a **full day fun introduction to landscape quilting**. The project will be a small quilt finished at approximately 9×11 inches. The class will also include instructions for free motion quilting. The cost of the workshop is \$35. We **only have 2 spots left**! July Guild Speaker and Workshop

Don't forget that our July meeting will be **a week early**, **on** <u>July 15th</u>, due to Vacation Bible School at the church. Our speaker and workshop teacher, Theresa Ward, is an awardwinning quilter, pattern designer, author and longarm quilter. She made her first quilt in 1988 and has never looked back. After years of making quilts and hand



quilting them, in 1999 she joined a guild and began her longarm quilting business. Theresa loves the creativity that quilting allows her, from designing quilt patterns to machine quilting designs on her customers' quilts.

July 15 will be a *full day of learning and fun*. Theresa will start us out at 9:00 am sharp with a workshop on making string quilt blocks using a paper foundation, and then adding a shadow to each block to give our quilts an interesting three-dimensional look. This workshop is **free** to members of the guild (\$25 for non-members), and we will collaborate on making blocks to create beautiful red, white, and blue quilt blocks, which we will combine, finish, and donate to *Quilts of Valor*. All materials will be provided, so just bring yourself, your sewing machine, thread, scissors, and any-thing else you need for a morning of learning and sewing. Although the blocks we make in the workshop will be donated, you will gain all the skills and instructions you need to go home and create your own shadow box string quilt.
