



It has been suggested by the board that the guild members will be better served to offer books from our library for purchase. We have a good selection of books from "how to" beginner books to those specializing in more advanced quilting techniques to new quilt ideas. Having a guide at your fingertips at home, may lead you to use different methods or pursue areas of guilting you had been wanting to try.

A selection of books will be offered each month at our meeting in a "Silent Auction".

A bidding sheet will be placed with each book with a starting bid. The bidding increments will be listed on each sheet. The bidding will end when the meeting starts.

The person with the highest bid will be announced at the close of each meeting.

Payment in full will be due at the end of the meeting. Any item not paid for/picked up at the end of meeting will be offered to the next highest bidder.

We ask that you pay by check or cash. (No credit or debit card, please)

If you are the highest bidder, please see me before leaving at the close of each meeting to pay for your bid and take home your "new to you" quilting book.

Please note that no book which was donated to the guild library as a gift in honor or memory will be sold.

I will list the books each month in the newsletter that will be in the auction.

Always check the auction at each meeting; there may be additional books added after the newsletter was sent, there may be a "bundled" book selection, or a bundle of pre-owned quilting magazines auctioned.

Please be generous in your bidding, in that all proceeds will benefit you as a member of the guild in our future activities. So remember: Come early and bring your extra dollars or checkbook and have fun bidding with your Guild buddies for that book "you can't live without".

The following are the books being offered at our silent auction at the June Guild meeting:

1. 101 Log Cabin Blocks by Linda Causee

This book includes traditional log cabin blocks (4 sizes) along with new designs Using foundation piecing.

2. Quilting Makes the Quilt by Lee Cleland.

This book guides you in choosing and drawing guilting designs.

3. Foundation Quilts by Jane Hall and Dixie Haywood.

This book overviews the big four foundation quilts: string-pieced, crazy- pieced, Log cabin and pineapple.

4. Two Quilt Blocks by Claudia Olson.

This book breaks down the process of constructing a quilt top from two Traditional blocks with spectacular results.

The following 3 books about Japanese quilting will be offered as a bundle. You will be bidding on the three together.

5. Fabled Flowers by Kumiko Sudo

Quilt patterns inspired by Japanese Sashiko and Origami Traditions

6. Quilting with Japanese Fabrics by Kitty Pippen

Features eight quilt patterns from simple mosaics, octagonal designs and Crazy patchwork. Using adaptations of traditional machine piecing, paper Piecing and appliqué.

7. Japanese Inspirations by Janet Haigh

18 easy-to-make quilted projects with chapters arranged by seasons with Over 50 traditional Japanese motifs to trace, reduce, or enlarge.

8. Quilt Favorites by Leisure Arts

A revival of patchwork quilts using the "Grace of Appliqué"

9. Hidden Block quilts by Lerlene Nevaril

Discover new blocks inside traditional favorites with 13 quilt settings and Instructions for 55 blocks


Be sure to come to the guild meeting early to preview these books and put a bid on those you would like to have in your own home library.

#### **BYLAWS**

#### MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of The Bella Vista Calico Cut-Ups Quilt Guild is to stimulate an interest in quilts and quilt making, educate its members, provide for the interchange of information, and encourage community giving.

#### ARTICLE I: NAME

The name of this organization shall be THE BELLA VISTA CALICO CUT-UPS QUILT GUILD.

#### ARTICLE II: PURPOSE

Section 1. It shall be the purpose of this Guild to bring together a membership of people who are interested in quilting for education, fellowship, and service.

Section 2. This Guild shall be nonprofit with the purpose of stimulating an interest in quilts and quilt making, educating its members, funding charitable projects, and providing for the interchange of information.

#### ARTICLE III: FISCAL YEAR

The fiscal year shall begin on the first day of January and end of the last day of December each year.

#### ARTICLE IV: MEMBERSHIP

Membership shall be open to all who have an interest in quilting, without discrimination. Membership dues shall be due annually on January 1. A person may be a guest two times before paying yearly dues. Membership dues are set by the Executive Committee and voted upon by the membership.

#### ARTICLE V: MEETINGS

Regular meetings of the entire membership will be held once each month, eleven months of the year. The time and place are to be determined by the Executive Committee. A simple majority vote of attending members is all that is needed to enact business of the organization.

### ARTICLE VI: OFFICERS

Section 1. Officers of The Bella Vista Calico Cut-Ups Quilt Guild shall be known as the Executive Committee and shall consist of the following:

- President
- Vice President
- New Member Chair
- Treasurer
- Assistant Treasurer
- Secretary
- Programs/Publicity Chair

- Scrap Bag Editor
- Special Projects Chair

Ads/Vendors Chair

for a total of ten (10) on the Executive Committee. If a Committee has a co-chair, that committee will have only one vote.

Section 2. Meetings of the Executive Committee to discuss plans, projects, or concerns of the Guild shall be held monthly, with additional meetings called by the President as necessary. Actions of the Executive Committee shall be reported at the following regular membership meeting. Items substantially affecting the organization shall require a vote of approval by the members. A quorum of six (6) Executive Committee members shall be present to conduct a legal meeting. In the even that a member of the Executive Committee is unable to attend a meeting in person, they may attend by phone, Zoom, or assign a proxy to represent them at the meeting.

Section 3. Candidates for officers of the Executive Committee shall be nominated by a Nominating Committee in September and elected by a majority vote of the attending members at the regular October meeting. Installation of the new officers shall be held at the last regular meeting of the year.

Section 4. Terms of office shall be for one year. The Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer may be elected for no more than two consecutive terms.

Section 5. Duties and powers of the officers shall be as follows:

PRESIDENT - Preside at all meetings. Appoint committee chairpersons as necessary and perform such other duties as are necessary to the office of President.

VICE PRESIDENT – In the absence of the President, perform the duties of the President. Welcome guests and members at each regular meeting of the membership. Keep the membership records, and oversee and assist the New Member Chair in keeping the membership database up-to-date and available in the "Members Only" section of the guild website. The Vice President shall automatically be nominated for President for the following year.

NEW MEMBER CHAIR – In the absence of the Vice President, the New Member Chair performs the duties of the Vice President. The New Member Chair is responsible for enrolling new members and ensuring that the membership database is up-to-date and available in the "Members Only" section of the guild website

SECRETARY – Attend all meetings of the membership and Executive Committee, and keep up-to-date records of all proceedings at each, along with pertinent business records and correspondence, in the appropriate folders on the guild's Google Drive.

TREASURER – Keeps account of all moneys received and disbursed. Deposit all funds received and make a report at all regular meetings, and file appropriate State and Federal reports as required. Keep up-to-date records of monthly guild accounts, along with pertinent business records and correspondence, in the appropriate folders on the guild's Google Drive.

ASSISTANT TREASURER – In the absence of the Treasurer, performs duties of the Treasurer. The Assistant Treasurer shall automatically be nominated for Treasurer for the following year.

PROGRAMS/PUBLICITY CHAIR – Plans and schedules programs and workshops; sends contracts to speakers and, if needed, makes overnight accommodations, plus arranges for publicity.

SCRAP BAG EDITOR – Is responsible for compiling the monthly newsletter, except for December, and establishes deadlines for receipt of materials from members and advertisers.

SPECIAL PROJECTS CHAIR – Coordinates all quilts and other items donated to local charities in Northwest Arkansas including quilts for children, hospitals, nursing homes, veterans, shelters, and other projects related to the Guild.

ADS/VENDORS CHAIR – Arranges for vendors to provide items for sale and donation of door prizes at Guild meetings. In addition, they sell ads for vendors on the guild website and in the Scrap Bag..

Section 6. VACANCIES - Whenever an office of the Executive Committee becomes vacant, it shall be filled by the Executive Committee.

Section 7. CONFLICT OF INTEREST - Members may not profit at the Guild's expense and will refrain for conflicts of interest.

Section 8. COMPENSATION – Members of the Executive Committee or other Committees shall serve without compensation except for the reimbursement of reasonable expenses incurred on behalf of the Guild or for presenting a program or class.

Section 9. CONTRACTS - All Contracts will require a signature of a voting officer of The Bella Vista Calico Cut-Ups Quilt Guild.

#### **ARTICLE VII: COMMITTEES**

Section 1. NOMINATING COMMITTEE. A three-member Nominating Committee shall consist of the Vice President and two (2) members nominated by the Vice President and elected by the general membership no later than the regular July meeting. They shall recommend a slate of officers to the membership at the regular September meeting. The membership shall vote to accept the slate of officers at the October meeting.

Section 2. OTHER COMMITTEES. By the first meeting of the Executive Committee each year or as soon after as possible, the President shall appoint and present to the general membership, committee chairpersons as set forth in the Calico Cut-Ups Guild Policies. Committee chairpersons are encouraged to attend Executive Committee meetings as non-voting members; however, attendance is not mandatory. Any of these positions may be co-chaired.

#### **ARTICLE VIII: FINANCES**

The Executive Committee shall present a budget to the membership at the first yearly meeting for their approval. The Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, and President may sign checks on behalf of the Guild. The Executive Committee will appoint someone to audit the financial records at the end of each fiscal year; this person may be a member of the Guild

#### ARTICLE IX: DISSOLUTION

Upon dissolution of the Guild, and after paying or making provisions for payment of all of the liabilities of the Guild, all remaining assets shall be disposed of by donation to other not-for-profit 501(c)3 organizations as voted on by the membership of the Guild.

#### ARTICLE X: AMENDMENTS

These Bylaws may be changed by the majority vote of the members at a regular meeting following the regular meeting where proposed amendments have been presented.

## **POLICIES**

### 1. Meeting Day

Regular meetings of the entire membership will be held on the fourth Monday of the month (except December) unless a change is deemed necessary by the Board. In addition, there will be no meeting in November. 5/14/18

#### 2. Weather-Related Cancellation

In the event of inclement weather, Guild activities will be canceled if the Bentonville School system closes.

#### 3. Dues

Annual member dues are set at \$25.00 \$35.00 per year. 6/10/13 5/23/22

After July 1, pro-rated new member dues for the current year will be reduced to \$12.50 \$17.50. 5/14/18 5/23/22

#### 4. Visitor Fee

A first-time guest to Calico Cut-Ups will not be charged a visitor fee. After their first visit, visitors to Guild Meetings, where there is a paid speaker, will be charged \$5.00 to attend the meeting. If a paid visitor decides to join the Guild on the same day as their visit, the visitor fee will be applied to the membership fee. 5/14/18

## 5. No Nametag Fee

\$0.25 will be paid to Calico Cut-Ups treasury by members who forget their nametags at the Guild meetings.10/10/11

## 6. Individual Payment for Classes

Enrollees will pay for all classes when registering to reserve their place. 5/14/18

## 7. Events Requiring a Contracted Agreement

There will be no refunds for these events. In lieu of a refund, the enrollee may get someone to take his/her place and arrange payment privately. 5/14/18

## 8. Presenter Expenses

- 2 Presenters who drive will receive round-trip mileage at the current government rate. 10/13/14
- ② No lodging will be provided for speakers coming from less than 120 miles, unless they are also giving a workshop, in which case the guild will provide one night's lodging.
- Members hosting a presenter in their homes will receive a stipend of \$40.00 per night to cover meals and any other expenses incurred.
- ☑ If a speaker prefers to stay at a hotel, Calico Cut-Ups will pay up to \$125.00 for overnight accommodations.8/26/19
- ② When a presenter is also providing a workshop on the day of the Guild meeting or an all-day workshop on a different day, they will be provided lunch by the Guild. 5/14/18

## 9. Member Program Honorarium

There will be a \$150.00 honorarium given to members who present a program for one of our regular meetings. 10/10/11

## 10. Vendors at Regular Meeting

Presenters will have priority when signing up to vend. If there is no presenter-vendor, members of the guild receive second priority. 10/10/11


