- rope to be used for drawstrings



## May Program

Join us for a trip back in time, to the War of 1812, as Diane Giannini describes the design and making of the “Star Spangled Banner Quilt.” Diane, a certified genealogist and expert quilter, lives in Bentonville, AR. She and a group of like-minded individuals recognized a need to digitize historical records documenting the lives of soldiers who fought in the War of 1812. To raise funds for this effort they combined their genealogical and quilting skills to create a group “opportunity” quilt depicting the lives and times of these soldiers, and when they drew the winning number, Diane won the quilt! She will bring it to our meeting, along with a Power Point presentation describing both the history of the War of 1812 and the making of the quilt.



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## Tips and Tricks

1. Utilize your fabric grain. You can improve your piecing immensely by simply understanding the grain of the fabric you are using. The crosswise threads in a piece of fabric are the ones that run perpendicular to the selvage. The lengthwise threads are the ones that run along the selvage and are actually much stronger than the weft threads. You'll find that there is little to no give along these stronger warp threads, but if you give your fabric a tug you'll see there is much more stretch along the weft threads. So what does that mean for quilting? Any time you're cutting strips, make sure to cut along the lengthwise grain (same direction as the selvage) to ensure stronger and more stable strips.
2. Understand your machine's stitch length. Stitch length is gauged in two different ways. On older machines you'll typically see stitches per inch. On newer machines you'll likely have metric measurements (you'll see number like 1.8, 2.0, or 2.2 on your machine). Not many quilters know what this means! If you take a look at a ruler you'll see that there are about 25 millimeters in one inch. So, if you set your metric stitch length to 1.0 for example, that means you will be getting about 25 stitches per inch. Keep this in mind when sitting down to a new quilt as a lot of machines have their default stitch length set too long for piecing. On a metric machine, you'll want to change your setting to 1.8 or 2.0, which is about 12 to 15 stitches per inch. This will keep your piecing nice and secure!
3. Know the ins and outs of your thread. Understanding how your thread is wound on the spool will help you determine how it should be used with your machine. Stacked thread spools, where the thread is spun onto the spool in straight, stacked lines, is meant to be used on vertical spool pins so that the thread winds off the back of the spool while the spool spins in place. Cross-wound thread spools on the other hand, are spun so that the thread runs diagonally across the spool, forming a series of Xs with the thread. This type of spool is intended to be used on horizontal spools pins so that the thread winds off the top of the spool while the spool remains motionless. If you ever run into a situation where you need to use a stacked thread spool on a horizontal spool pin, simply add a spool cap that's a little bit wider than the spool itself. This will keep your thread from getting tangled as it's winding off the spool.
4. Remember your dead ends. Do you always forget which way to sew diagonal seams when joining two long pieces of fabric end to end? Here's an easy trick to remember so you never have to second-guess yourself again. Take your two strips and place them perpendicular to each other, forming an L shape. Let them overlap a bit so you have two short ends poking out. Kind of looks like a street intersection, doesn't it? Imagine the short ends are two dead-ends and your longer ends are the through streets. No one wants to drive down a dead-end, so you can block those off. Sew your seams diagonally from the outside corner of one dead-end to the outside corner of the other dead-end, open your strips, and you have a perfectly joined strip!
