# October Speaker— Barbara Eikmeier

Barbara learned to sew in 4-H and made her first quilt while in high school but didn't start quilting seriously until after her marriage in 1984. She has been teaching quilting since 1990 and her favorite technique is applique'.



Married to a military man, quilting became her portable career as she moved around the country and to South Korea for military assignments.

Barb is the mother of two, grandmother of one, and author of four quilting books. She is a fabric designer for Paintbrush Studio Fabrics, a pattern designer, a Craftsy / Bluprint instructor, and she presents programs and workshops to guilds around the country.

Barbara lives in Lansing, Kansas with her husband and two dogs where in addition to quilting she enjoys flower gardening, baking pies, writing, and sailing on her vintage sailboat at nearby Perry Lake.

We will start the day with a workshop from 9:00-12:00, see article in this newsletter for more information about registration and materials that are needed. Cost for the workshop is \$25 for members and \$35 for non-members.

From 12:00-1:00, Barb will have a vendor table, with a variety of her patterns, rulers and books available for purchase.

From 1:00-2:00, Barb will provide our program "Random Block Sampler" with a lecture and trunk show of sampler quilts made with blocks of many sizes. Popular in the late 1800s, the random size block quilt has its own set of challenges. Join us to see examples and learn how you can convert your own block collection into a stunning quilt.

From 2:00-3:00, we will have our business meeting and show-and-tell.

October Workshop: Barbara Eikmeier
It's Magic!

Monday, October 28, 9:00-12:00

Cost: \$25 members; \$35 non-members (plus \$13 for ruler, at workshop)

Learn 6 things you can do with the Magic Triangle Ruler in this 3-hour class. Designed as a companion class to go with my Random Block Sampler lecture, the students will learn the skills needed to make units or blocks for those odd spaces that occur when combining blocks of different sizes into a single quilt. Participants will make Shaded Four Patch, Birds in the Air, Quarter Square Triangles, Half Square Triangles, Double Hour Glass and learn other sneaky ways to use the ruler for trimming and marking.

Although this is not a project class the students will leave with 2-4 blocks partially completed. NOTE: The three-hour workshop does not include instruction in making a Random Block Sampler although we will look at a few examples during the class. #### 2020 CCU Retreat

In 2020 Calico Cut-Ups will hold it's 3<sup>rd</sup> annual retreat at Ozark Camp and Retreat Center south of Joplin. Following are further details:

- •February 27th March 1<sup>st</sup>, beginning at 9:00AM on the 27<sup>th</sup> and ending at 3:00PM on March 1<sup>st</sup>.
- •Cost is \$170 for members. As space permits, we will open to non-members for \$195.
  - Seats are not guaranteed until you have paid.
- •Checks should be made out to Bittersweet Quilts and given to Wendy Stephens.
- •If you cancel within 30 days prior to the retreat date a full refund will be given. 14-30 days prior to retreat a 50% refund is given. Less than 14 days, no refund will be given.
- •Space is limited to 35 retreat participants. So, sign up early.
- •Meals are included beginning with supper on 2/27. Breakfast, lunch and supper will be provided on the 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>, with breakfast and lunch provided on the last day, 3/1.

### It's Magic! Supply List

Learn 6 things you can do with the Magic Triangle Ruler in this 3-hour class. Designed as a companion class to go with my Random Block Sampler lecture, the students will learn the skills needed to make units or blocks for those odd spaces that occur when combining blocks of different sizes into a single quilt. Participants will make Shaded Four Patch, Birds in the Air, Quarter Square Triangles, Half Square Triangles, Double Hour Glass and learn other sneaky ways to use the ruler for trimming and marking.

Although this is not a project class the students will leave with 2-4 blocks partially completed. NOTE: The three-hour workshop does not include instruction in making a Random Block Sampler although we will look at a few examples during the class.

#### Supply list:

Sewing machine in good working order

Basic sewing supplies (thread, extra needle, seam ripper, straight pins, small scissors or thread clips)

Pencil or marking tool that shows on your fabrics

Rotary cutter, mat and your favorite ruler (6" x 12" is a good size)

Magic Triangle Ruler (required for each student, available from the instructor for \$13)

Fabric: A word about the fabric – if you plan to use your class samples in a Random Block Sampler of your own bring fabrics that coordinate with your blocks.

Choose two fabrics that contrast with each other. To test place your fabrics side by side and squint at them. Can you tell the difference between the two? If yes, they'll work! If not, try a different fabric.

3/8 yard print or tone on tone medium or dark fabric (Fabric #1)

3/8 yard background or lighter fabric (Fabric #2)

#### **Precutting:**

This class will move quickly so please arrive with the precutting completed. Optional precut fabric kits will be available for \$15. Please order in advance. Bring leftover fabric to class with you.

#### Fabric #1 (med or dark)

- (4) 4 ½" x 5 ½"
- (2) 5 ½" x 5 ½"
- (2) 4 ½" x 4 ½"
- (4) 2 ½" x 2 ½"
- (2) 2 ½" x 3 ½"
- (1) strip 2 ½" x width of the fabric

#### Fabric #2 (light)

- (2) 5 ½" x 5 ½"
- (2) 4 ½" x 4 ½"
- (10) 2 ½" x 3 ½"
- (1) strip 2 ½" x width of the fabric
