#### Materials to bring...

- Two contrasting fabric with light weight fuse attached (any size no bigger than 24 x 24)
- Small rotary cutter (28 mm if you have one)
- Cutting board to fit fabric
- Batting and backing 2 inches larger than the top on all sides. ( I sometimes use fusible fleece.)

#### Optional

- A roll of painters tape and pen

- Mini iron with small ironing board

Sewing Machine Provided

Supplies:

- 1 Tie
- 1/3yd lining (a fat quarter will make 2 linings)
- 1/3yd of muslin
- 1-1/4yd cording for handle
- 12" of 3/8" wide elastic

Regular sewing supplies such as scissors, pins, seam ripper, ruler, thread etc.

**Session5:** Big Stitches, Raw Edges, Unconventional Materials

In this hands-on class you will make a small, quilted object (such as a mug rug or small wall hanging) using techniques you may not have tried before. Come with an open mind, ready to experiment! I will have a basket of supplies and materials to choose from, but if you want to bring some from home, here are a few suggestions:

- scissors
- a glue stick (any kind is okay)
- small fabric, leather, or paper scraps
- embroidery thread or ribbon
- unique buttons
- old jewelry
- small metal or plastic decorative items
- old keys
- labels from clothing or other items
- anything else small and meaningful to you that you might like to work into a quilt display

Fabric required: 100% cotton fabric, batting, and thread

2 10 X 10 cotton pieces

2 10 X 10 cotton batting

You can also use 9 X 9 or bigger, any size you need to fit your bowl.
