ADJUTANT'S COLUMN

Post 41 has long been identified with the U.S. Army 29th Division, which saw major action in both world wars. Now that the WW I centennial is underway, I'm offering a little background information.

The division was organized in July 1917, soon after war was declared. Initially it was recruited from Maryland, Virginia and New Jersey; since these states fought on both sides in the Civil War, it came to be known as the Blue and Gray division, a designation that has remained.

The 29th arrived in France in June 1918 and saw major action in the Meuse-Argonne offensive in the closing weeks of the war, beginning September 29. The casualties were heavy: 170 officers and 5681 enlisted men were killed or wounded. The division returned to the United States in May 1919 and was demobilized on May 30 at Camp Dix, New Jersey.

Immediately prior to World War II, on 3 February 1941, the division was reactivated. It saw much action in the European theater following D-Day, again with many casualties: 3887 killed and 15541 wounded. It remained on occupation duty in Germany until the end of 1945 and was demobilized again on 17 January 1946 at Camp Kilmer, New Jersey.

During the long cold war period the 29th went through several reorganizations and reassignments and took part in a large training exercise in July 2003 in preparation for service in the escalating events in the Middle East. Many soldiers have since been deployed to Afghanistan. We are proud of our association with the 29th, and our thoughts and prayers are with those now on active duty.

On a personal note, I recall that at our Installation in June Commander Bullis spoke eloquently of the importance of the Post's volunteer efforts in many areas and of the need to recognize those responsible -- and that it is almost impossible to do so without leaving someone out. I now find myself in the same position. During my enforced absence from the Post so many of you helped me in so many ways that a collective thank-you is going to have to suffice. This was a perfect example of "devotion to mutual helpfulness," which the preamble to our Legion constitution proclaims is what we are all about. I shall be forever grateful to all of you for your help and encouragement, and simply for being who you are.

I would like to call the attention of our members to a documentary film presentation and special Mass to mark the 50th anniversary of the death of

The film, which is entitled "Called and Chosen--Father Vincent R. Capodanno," will be shown at 10 p.m. on August 30 on EWTN; the showing will be preceded by a panel discussion on Father Capodanno's life hosted by Father Mitch Pacwa, S.J.

Father Capodanno died on September 4, '1967, at the age of 38, while rushing to administer the sacraments to Marines under enemy ambush in Vietnam's Que So'n Valley. He was awarded the Medal of Honor posthumously on January 7, 1969. A lengthy process is presently underway to determine if Father Capdanno is to be listed among the saints.

Father Capodanno's life is yet another example of how tragic circumstances can bring out the best in people.

Agent Orange Registry

Are you a Vietnam veteran who has still not gone in to get your name placed on the Agent Orange Registry? If so, and you are experiencing symptoms or illness you feel may be related to Agent Orange exposure, check with your local VA or call 1-800-749-8387. If eligible, you will be scheduled for an appointment for a free exam with a clinician experienced in recognizing the 14 health conditions related to dioxin exposure. Veterans diagnosed with a condition related to Agent Orange exposure can file a claim for that condition. Once you are on the registry, your VA medical records will reflect that status, and you become eligible for health care and disability compensation benefits for these conditions.

3 new diseases have recently been added to the list of conditions related to exposure to Agent Orange-B-cell lymphomas, Parkinsons, and Ischemic heart disease, for a total of 14 diseases. If you are currently on the registry, and have been diagnosed with these, follow-up with the VA to update your records for both care and compensation.

AL Amyloidosis, Chronic B-cell Leukemias, Chloracne (or similar acneform disease), Diabetes Mellitus Type 2, Hodgkin's Disease, Ischemic Heart Disease, Multiple Myeloma, Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma, Parkinson's Disease, Peripheral Neuropathy, Early-Onset.; Porphyria Cutanea Tarda, Prostate Cancer, Respiratory Cancers (includes lung cancer), Soft Tissue Sarcomas (other than osteosarcoma, chondrosarcoma, Kaposi's sarcoma, or mesothelioma)


Being proactive now allows you to be prepared if these conditions become debilitating in the future. The VA is one of the only organizations that will assist with home modifications and durable medical equipment needed to help keep you in your home.
